

Feast of the Guardian Angels October 2nd

Perhaps no aspect of Catholic piety is as comforting to parents as the belief that an angel protects their little ones from dangers real and imagined. Yet angels are not only for children. Their role is to

represent individuals before God, to watch over them always, to aid their prayer, and to present their souls to God at death.

The concept of an angel assigned to guide and nurture each human being is a development of Catholic doctrine and piety based on Scripture but not directly drawn from it. Jesus' words in Matthew 18:10 best support the belief: "See that you do not despise one of these little ones, for I say to you that their angels in heaven always look upon the face of my heavenly Father."

Devotion to the angels is, at base, an expression of faith in God's enduring love and providential care extended to each person day in and day out.

Make it positive!

Our children are very astute! Don't underestimate

how much they pick up on just by our own attitudes. Simply phrasing our Sunday Mass obligation in a positive light can make a big difference for a young child. For example, rather than saying, "Oh, we have to go to Mass tomorrow" we can change the whole perception just by shifting to, "Remember, we get to go to Mass tomorrow! Let's get our clothes ready tonight!" It is a very special gift to be able to go to Mass and it's helpful for children, as well as a good reminder for us, if we frame it as something to look forward to! We can also highlight the significance of Mass by pairing it with something that is special-family breakfast, donuts after Mass or a family walk or bike ride, anything that sets the day apart from every other day and demonstrates to your child that today is special, it's the Lord's Day!


SEPTEMBER IS SUICIDE PREVENTION AWARENESS MONTH
