

# For All Young Families Parent Tips Week Two Mass Parts II

Tip of the week: **Read Scripture with your child!** 

Last week we spoke of how it can be helpful to engage your child in Mass if they have an increased concept of what is happening during the Mass. The first two parts of the Mass are the Introductory Rites (greeting and preparation) and the Liturgy of the Word (First Reading, Responsorial Psalm, Second Reading, Gospel, Homily and Creed). It may be helpful for children to think of this time as the "Story Time" of Mass. As all these "stories" are from Scripture, they become more relevant to our children as they become more familiar with them. Just like a favorite bedtime story, when children hear a story with characters they know, they may attend a little more. As we listen to the readings quietly ask your children if they hear particular peoples' names. Ask them engaging questions, "Who was in today's story?" "Did you hear Jesus' name?" You can preview the readings yourself either at home or quickly prior to Mass to give your child a heads-up. "Today we are going to hear a story about Isaiah!" Asking these types of questions may entice your child to listen more actively in the scriptures as they are read to us each week.
