Why Mass Intentions Matter

Here's why the Church encourages specific intentions during Mass:

- **Personal Intercession**: A Mass intention allows the priest to offer the Eucharistic sacrifice for a particular person or cause—whether for the repose of a soul, healing, thanksgiving, birthday, safe travel, board exam or a special need. It's a way of asking God to apply the graces of the Mass in a focused way.
- **Spiritual Benefits**: The Mass is the most powerful prayer in Catholic belief because it re-presents Christ's sacrifice. Offering it for someone brings immense spiritual benefits—far beyond what personal prayer alone can achieve.
- **Communion of Saints**: The Church teaches that we are spiritually united with all believers—living and dead. Mass intentions reflect this unity, allowing us to pray for others and receive grace through that shared bond.
- **Ancient Tradition**: This practice dates back to the early Church. Inscriptions in Roman catacombs and writings from Church Fathers like Tertullian and St. Augustine show that Christians have long offered Masses for the dead and for special intentions.
- **Support for the Church**: When someone requests a Mass intention, they often make a small offering. This isn't payment for grace, but a way to support the Missionaries of La Salette and the Parish's mission. Canon Law affirms this as a legitimate and charitable practice.

S In Summary

Even though the Mass is universal, a specific intention personalizes that universality. It's like writing a name on a gift that's already meant for everyone—it doesn't exclude others, but it ensures someone receives a special share of its blessings.



Twenty-Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

In Jesus' parable of the Unjust Steward, we encounter a financial manager who has wasted his master's wealth and faces dismissal from his position. To overcome the crisis confronting him, the steward reduces some very considerable debts owed by poor neighbors to his master in order to help them out. Though the steward has sinned against God and his master by squandering what belongs to someone else, both the prudent way in which he goes about resolving the crisis coupled with relieving people who are in need can be seen as a way to better steward the gifts entrusted to us by God. Although good stewards today acknowledge that they may never use their God given gifts in a way that completely conforms to the demands of the Gospel, a commitment to using their gifts with prudence and for the purpose of helping their neighbors wins God's favor.

TODAY'S READINGS

First Reading

Amos 8:4-7

Unfair business practices and injustice to the poor will be judged by God.

Responsorial Psalm

Psalm 113: 1-2,4-6,7-8

Praise be to God, who raises up the poor.

Paul tells Timothy that prayer for those in authority is pleasing to God because God wills the salvation of all.

Gospel Reading

325.10

51.50

Luke 16:1-13 (shorter form, Luke 16:10-13)

Jesus tells a parable about a dishonest steward who is commended for his prudence; one cannot serve both God and money.

Background on the Gospel Reading

Today's Gospel sounds puzzling to contemporary readers, but it can be made less so by considering the economic system which stands behind the parable. A steward is dismissed because he is squandering his master's property. He is called dishonest because he is not serving the interests of the rich man, his employer. In response the steward, in an attempt to ensure favor for himself among the rich man's debtors, brokers repayment of the rich man's loans by foregoing the interest and fees that had been levied to line the steward's pockets. It is this action, in which the steward puts aside his greed and takes the longer perspective in order to enhance his security, which is commended by the rich man.

The passage concludes with three morals for the listeners. The first exhorts the listener to be prudent about the use of wealth. Like the steward in the parable, those who would follow Jesus must put transitory affairs in proper perspective. Christians should handle the affairs of temporal life with an eye toward eternal life.

The second concerns trustworthiness. Those who can be trusted in small things can also be trusted in great things. If Christians handle money and other passing things responsibly, then they can also be trusted with the affairs of the Kingdom of God.

Finally, Jesus tells his listeners that no one can serve two masters simultaneously. God must be put ahead of money.
