After dinner, enjoy complimentary coffee or tea or, if the mood suits, soda, beer, wine and cocktails are available for purchase. Relax while experiencing a show that hilariously depicts the legendary adventures of the first men to scale North America’s highest peak, which stands at 20,310 feet tall. While taking in this slice of Alaska history, relish the pioneering spirit of these early explorers, including Alaska native Walter Harper, who braved the wilderness to reach new heights.

Denali Glass Class

A local glass artist will teach you how to make an etched dichroic glass pendant or keychain. This is a beginner class that requires no experience. You’ll create two pieces — make one for yourself and one for a friend! You will choose your cut glass from an array of colors, etch a design in it, layer additional glass over the design, and place your pieces in the kiln. Your masterpiece will be fired for eight hours and left to cool overnight. The following morning, your glass artist will attach a bail to finish a beautiful, unique piece of jewelry

handmade by you! Pieces will then be ready for pickup or will ship to you free of charge (international shipping rates may apply).

Special note(s): Minimum age is 6. Children under 12 years old must be accompanied by a participating/paying adult. Please check-in at the Denali Arts & Glass Studio located at the Denali Princess Wilderness Lodge. Note that there is no transportation for the tour, but it is a short walk to the tour site. There will be an additional \$10 fee charged at time of class for shipping overseas.

Soak up the beauty of Denali during this extraordinary fly-fishing expedition to Fish Creek. Gear up with lightweight fly-fishing gear provided by your guide — a dedicated fly-fisherman whose passion for the sport is contagious. Learn the basics of fly casting, roll casting, matching the hatch, landing fish and catch-and-release techniques. When you're ready, cast your nearly weightless artificial lure for the Arctic grayling —

a species of freshwater fish in the trout family. These ravenous surface feeders are thrilling to catch on the fly whether it's your first time or you're a seasoned angler. Wading and moving along the uneven riverbed may be necessary. While fishing, relax and breathe in the clean mountain air and take in the unbridled beauty of the Alaska wilderness. Enjoy this unique opportunity to feel at peace with nature!

Special note(s): Minimum age is 12. Fishing licenses are required for anyone 16 years of age or older. Licenses are available for purchase online on mobile devices or the computer in the lodge. **This is a catch-and-release excursion.** Guests should be in good physical condition and be able to walk or stand for approximately 3 hours. Travel over slippery rocks, mud and over uneven terrain is to be expected. Bring a rain jacket, extra pair of socks, extra layer of clothing, sunglasses, warm hat, bottled water and camera.

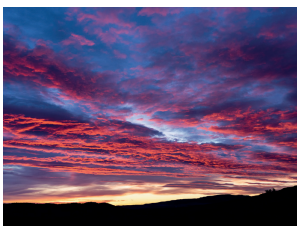

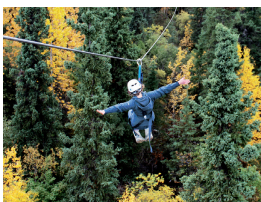

After gearing up, your certified guides will lead you along six suspension bridges and eight thrilling ziplines, including the dual racer finale!

The built-in hands-free braking system allows you to relax and take in the breathtaking mountain views. Challenge yourself by traversing to the top of the boreal forest on the uniquely designed Ascending Bridge Tower. Soar through the trees and over the tundra on more than a half mile of ziplines. Complete this once-in-a-lifetime experience by racing to the finish, zipping alongside your friends and family!

Special note(s): Minimum age is 8. Minimum weight is 70 lbs. Maximum weight is 280 lbs. All safety gear provided — full body harness, helmet, and gloves. Travel back in time during this splendid journey across Alaska tundra on a horse-drawn covered wagon reminiscent of those used by pioneers while you explore the grand wilderness. The tour begins at a tranquil lake offering awe-inspiring views of Alaska's mountainous skyline. Climb aboard the roomy covered

wagon and settle in as two beautiful draft horses lead the way through the tree-laden countryside. While soaking up breathtaking views of snow-capped mountains reflecting the sun, listen as your guide unveils this mining area's rich history. As you continue on the trail, discover a primitive cabin abandoned by an Alaskan old-timer and arrive near the Dry Creek riverbed home to Athabascan Indian artifacts. Breathe in the crisp air while watching for wildlife. Arrive at a rustic pavilion with unbelievable views to savor a freshly prepared family-style barbeque. After dining, greet and meet your horse team for a great photo or just a chance to pet your horse. This excursion is a relaxing opportunity to see and smell the great land of Alaska and is great for the entire family!

Tundra Mountain Golfing

Hit the greens during this spectacular expedition to Black Diamond Golf Course — a one-of-a-kind Alaska course surrounded by stunning scenery. The adventure begins with a picturesque drive to the rugged, nine-hole course bordered by gorgeous mountains and tranquil Otto Lake. Constructed in 1995 on Alaska tundra with little to no topsoil, this unique course offers challenging grass that evokes Scottish courses of yesteryear.

Hazards include moose prints, tundra marsh, permafrost (the ground can be totally frozen in some areas) and a crafty fox that enjoys stealing balls. Since unlimited greens fees, golf balls, club rentals and a power golf cart are included, you can relax and take in the magnificent panoramic views, clean air and robust colors spanning this 3,000-yard, par-35 course. Relish the vibrant wildflowers surrounding each hole and watch for wildlife while teeing off under the Midnight Sun. Receive a souvenir logo golf ball so you can take a piece of this inimitable place home.

Special note(s): The Black Diamond Golf Course was built on frozen ground; therefore, there will be uneven surfaces. Pricing includes power golf cart, clubs and golf balls. Both left- and right-handed clubs available. No specific attire required to golf. Wildlife sightings are likely but not guaranteed. Round of golf is approximately 3 hours.

Fly to the summit of Denali for a one-of-a-kind Alaska experience. Sit back and relax as your fixed wing multi-engine aircraft climbs high above Denali National Park, covering miles of untamed wilderness and showcasing eye-popping scenery all along the way.

Glide over U-shaped valleys and climb into a thrilling realm of snow-covered pinnacles. When towering Denali comes into view, you'll learn firsthand why the mountain is called Denali — "The Great One." This gigantic mountain dwarfs all other massifs around it, keeping you glued to the edge of your window seat for one dramatic photo opportunity after another. Feel the excitement only a few mountaineers have experienced — the view from the top of North America's highest peak.

Special note(s): Minimum age is 10. Maximum weight is 340 lbs. An oxygen mask is used on this tour. Anyone with difficulty breathing should not take this flight. All flights are conducted in a nine-passenger, twin-engine Piper Navajo Chieftain aircraft. Each guest will have a window seat. Flight time is approximately 1½ hours.

so unique. You will soar along the jagged spine of the Alaska Range over tumbling glaciers on a stunning 200-mile flight in twin-engine safety. While you circle Denali, you are able to see every spectacular corner of this massive mountain (weather permitting). This flight's high success rate at seeing Denali is due to the pilots' decades of experience and the unique airstrip location just outside the road entrance into the Park. Approximately 99% of the flight is within Denali National Park, giving you a comprehensive tour of this unique and stunning landscape, from green tundra valleys to wildly colorful ridgelines. With the expert commentary of your pilot, you'll gain insight into Alaska's grand mountaineering and aviation tradition!

Special note(s): Minimum age is 2. This tour is headset equipped, fully narrated and all seats are window seats. Precise flight routes are dictated by current weather conditions. Anticipated flight routes will be discussed with passengers during a pre-briefing. Flight time is approximately 1 hour.

Denali Glacier Landing by Helicopter

Your experienced pilot guide will make sure that every moment of this life-changing adventure is filled with thrilling sights as you glide over wild, untamed rivers and climb through huge U-shaped valleys to trace the spine of the Alaska Range — the

home of Denali. Revel in the sweeping bird's-eye views and land on the Yanert Glacier to see astounding natural wonders up close. You'll join your pilot guide to explore dramatic icefalls, moraines, mystifying ice bridges and icy-blue glacial pools. Bring your camera to capture each new experience to share with family and friends! As you step back on board the helicopter, you'll return through pristine habitat watching for treasured sightings of bears, moose and Dall sheep. On very clear days, you may catch a glimpse of Denali, making this tour an adventure beyond compare!

Special note(s): Minimum age is 2. Bags, purses, loose items or tablets will not be allowed on board the helicopter. Due to changing weather patterns, it may be necessary to alter the flight path. Bring a jacket, hat, sunglasses and a camera. Glacier walking boots will be provided. Flight time is approximately 50 minutes with 15 – 20 minutes on the glacier.

Tundra Landing via Helicopter

Don't just fly over the mountains: get out on them. Enjoy this short helicopter ride through the peaks and valleys that make up the Alaska Range. Just moments after taking off from our riverside heliport, you will find yourself immersed deep in

the Alaska backcountry. As you explore the hills just outside of Denali National Park, look down below for local wildlife, or keep your eyes on the horizon for a chance at viewing Denali, North America's tallest peak, or Mt. Deborah, her impressive sister to the east. Your pilot will set down on the soft alpine tundra giving you the opportunity to step out into this scenic landscape. With the pilot as your guide, take the time to explore the local ecosystem, try your hand at tracking wildlife, snap a flurry of keepsake photos or just sink your feet into the tundra and breathe in the crisp mountain air. Your trip concludes with an incredible flight back to our Denali heliport.

Special note(s): Minimum age is 2. Bags, purses, loose items or tablets will not be allowed on board the helicopter. Bring a jacket, hat, sunglasses and a camera. Time on tundra is approximately 15 – 20 minutes.

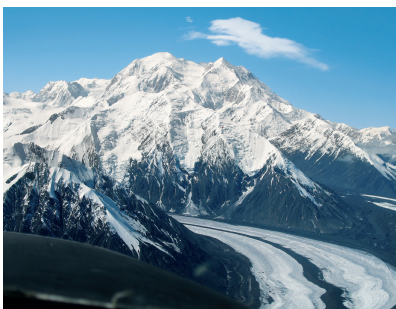

Anticipated flight routes will be discussed with passengers during a preflight briefing. Flight time is approximately 45 minutes.

Arctic Circle Air Adventure

Cross the Arctic Circle!

A circular land mass encompassing the earth's farthest north polar regions, the Arctic Circle formally marks the "Land of the Midnight Sun."

The Arctic Circle Air Adventure takes you north from Denali, across the expansive Yukon River

Valley and into the Brooks Mountain Range (the Alaska Rockies) before landing just east of the Gates of the Arctic National Park at Coldfoot, Alaska. The 2½ hours spent on the ground north of the Arctic Circle focuses on visits to two very different wilderness communities — Wiseman and Coldfoot. Both offer the unique opportunity to learn firsthand how the very few residents living in this remote arctic region have adopted creative strategies for surviving extreme winter temperatures that can drop to -80°F. Earn an Arctic Circle Certificate upon return.

Special note(s): Maximum weight is 340 lbs. Tour operator will confirm daily if weather conditions are suitable for flight. In the event this tour has to be cancelled due to weather, tour hosts will make their best attempt to reschedule your excursion. If rescheduling is not possible, a full refund will be made. Meals can be purchased during the tour and are at your own expense. Guests are required to check in with our tour desk to confirm weight. All flights are conducted in a nine-passenger, twin-engine Piper Navajo Chieftain Aircraft. Flight time is approximately 2 hours. Time spent on the ground in the Arctic Circle is approximately 2½ hours.

Wilderness Wave Raft

Enjoy a gorgeous tour along the natural boundary of Denali National Park. On the Wilderness Wave Raft Tour, you'll glide through 11 miles of glacially carved valleys and amazing vistas with panoramic views of Mount Fellows and the Nenana Canyon. Although

you'll encounter the occasional rapid, this option is mellow enough for the whole family.

Special note(s): Minimum Age is 5. Maximum height 6'8" feet tall. Maximum weight 300. Restrictions apply for pregnant guests and guests with back issues or allergies to cold water. Drysuit, helmet, paddle, river shoes and life jacket are included. Wear warm layers and warm socks as you are rafting on a glacier river.



Canyon Wave Whitewater

On the Canyon Wave Tour, get ready to get splashed! For 11 miles you will crush through fun glacial rapids like Razorback, New Wave, Train Wreck and Coffee Grinder just to name a few. This trip begins with beautiful views as

you ride the waves through the glacially carved valley before you enter into the canyon. You will then raft through the Nenana Canyon, with a possibility to see wildlife, the sparkle of the mica schist along the river's edge and the train as it weaves its way through the canyon. We recommend you come prepared for adventure and don't mind getting wet; your clothes will stay dry as we provide dry suits but we do suggest layering up with warm clothes and extra warm socks so you can thoroughly enjoy your rafting experience. Join the team as a Paddle Rafter or play it cool and be an Oar Boat Rider — whatever floats your boat.

OAR BOAT RIDER

This option allows you to play it cool and ride along. With an Oar Boat Rider, you can hold on and enjoy the adventure as your guide navigates you downriver. This option allows rafting in Alaska to be feasible for almost anyone. In an oar boat, guests are less likely to fall out because they are holding on.

PADDLE RAFTER

This option allows you to heat it up and actively paddle through the waves with your guide. We ask that guests are 15 years of age or older to paddle. In a paddle raft, you'll ride with a professional guide steering you from the back, while you and your team paddle together. There are plenty of breaks from paddling for you to relax and enjoy the views of Denali National Park. The Paddle Rafter demands a higher activity level than riding along in an oar boat. This option is the best for the more adventurous crowd!

Special note(s): Minimum Age is 12. Maximum height 6'8" feet tall. Maximum weight 300. Restrictions apply for pregnant guests and guests with back issues or allergies to cold water. Drysuit, helmet, paddle, river shoes and life jacket are included. Wear warm layers and warm socks as you are rafting on a glacier river.

Get out and ride in the Alaska Boreal Forest! Traveling at speeds up to 30 mph, maneuver through the taiga to picturesque panoramas of the Alaska Range. Observe glacial moraines and historic archaeological dig sites while navigating tree rutted trails, mountain-fed creek beds, and boggy tundra. You may learn how to make fireweed tea,

leave with a blueberry smile, or even chat about survival. Periodic stops are made for photography and wildlife sightings. Trails are challenging for all experience levels. A safety demonstration and ATV orientation are provided to ensure you're comfortable before we hit the trails.

Special note(s): Maximum weight is 450 lbs. Tours operate rain or shine. Closed-toe shoes are mandatory. Bring a jacket and a camera. If solo traveling, you will be paired up on your adventure. The minimum age to drive is 16. All minors under 18 cannot participate without a parent/guardian. All drivers must have and show a valid Driver's License or government issued photo ID with date of birth. A waiver must be signed and wearing helmets is mandatory. Wildlife is never a guarantee. ATV tours are not recommended for anyone with neck or back issues or pregnant guests.

Driving your own four-wheel ATV is as close as you can get to being in Alaska's wild. Your adventure begins with a safety briefing, and then you will be fitted with all the proper gear just before you join your guide on a very personal tour of the Alaska wilderness, stopping whenever you want. This

experience takes you on old coal-mining trails and spills you out onto the Dry Creek riverbed, where Athabascan Indian artifacts have been found in archaeological digs. Across the river, you'll pass by an authentic abandoned Alaska cabin and travel past local vegetation while soaking in the scenery. Your trek takes you to a high elevation where you can view the entire Healy Valley. Photo opportunities are abound, and you have a great chance of viewing wildlife in their natural habitat!

Special note(s): Minimum age to drive is 16 years. A waiver must be signed. Bring your driver's license. No additional riders on ATV. Guests who purchase ATV Adventure without meal will have approximately 30 minutes of additional time on ATV. Guests with back, neck, heart or mobility problems are not allowed to participate. Wildlife sightings are likely but not guaranteed. Time on ATV is approximately 2½ – 3 hours depending on which option is booked. Tour takes place at the Black Diamond Resort. Riding along trails surrounded by Denali National Park, at speeds up to 30 mph, your adventure includes breathtaking 360° overlook stops with views of the Alaska Range, Otto Lake and the Healy Valley. Navigate through rocky creek beds and spend time splashing through the water (weather dependent). Knowledgeable guides lead you through the rugged terrain and provide opportunities for photography. Wildlife is abundant — watch out for moose on the trail! Even if this is your first time riding, don't worry — we provide a safety demonstration and ATV orientation to ensure you're comfortable before we hit the trails.

Special note(s): Tours operate rain or shine. Closed-toe shoes are mandatory. Bring a jacket and a camera. If solo traveling, you will be paired up on your adventure. The minimum age to drive is 16. All minors under 18 cannot participate without a parent/guardian. All drivers must have and show a valid driver's license or government issued photo ID with date of birth. A waiver must be signed and wearing helmets is mandatory. Wildlife is never a guarantee. ATV tours are not recommended for anyone with neck or back issues or pregnant guests.



Denali Highway Jeep® Excursion

Don't miss the Denali Highway — featured as the #2 “Drive of a Lifetime” by *National Geographic Traveler magazine*! Once the gateway to Denali National Park, this 135-mile gravel road is surrounded by pristine nature and is a photographer's paradise.

Snow-capped mountains, icy glaciers and panoramic vistas flank the Denali Highway. During your guided and narrated 100+ mile round trip excursion, there are opportunities to see Denali and wildlife (both weather permitting). New, four-door, 4x4 Jeeps hug the dirt road, while comfortably seating four adults who can trade off driving. Each Jeep has a CB radio for communicating with the guide so stops can be made whenever desired. As driving the Denali Highway is prohibited by most rental vehicle companies, this exclusive excursion provides access to more of Alaska's spectacular scenery and wildlife.

Special note(s): Price is per person, not per vehicle. Wear comfortable walking shoes. Dress in warm layers. Bring a jacket, camera and binoculars. Minimum age to drive is 25 years. A waiver must be signed. Bring your driver's license. Car seats and booster seats are available upon request. Wildlife sightings are likely but not guaranteed. A Jeep Wrangler® carries up to four passengers per vehicle. Each Jeep is shared, there will be ample time to switch drivers so everyone has a chance to drive. Time in Jeep is approximately 4 hours.



Denali Fat Truck Tour

Approximately 3½ hours



Prepare for an exhilarating off-road adventure as you join us for a journey through the rugged Alaska wilderness aboard our fully enclosed, climate-controlled Search & Rescue Fat Truck/Sherp.

The ride begins exploring the Otto Lake and Dry Creek drainages below Mount Healy followed by a thrilling ascent up a steep mining trail, where

the panoramic vista views await at a lookout point. You'll then travel down "Carpet Road" to Dry Creek and navigate the permafrost frozen palisade cliffs. But the adventure doesn't stop there. Return to Otto Lake where you will experience the amphibious capability of these remarkable vehicles (guests with a fear of water may disembark and watch from shore).

Located just outside the border of Denali National Park, this tour immerses you in this iconic wilderness area, as knowledgeable local guides regale you with tales of life in Alaska and share fascinating insights into the region's geology, geography, and history. Keep your eyes peeled for occasional wildlife sightings.

Special note(s): Limited to 6 guests per Fat Truck; guests should be physically capable of climbing 4 stair steps to get into and out of the Fat Truck. This tour uses headsets with microphones so everyone can hear and talk with the tour guide. Not recommended for guests with heart conditions, back, neck, or leg problems.

for a summer training run. Then you'll view a 90 minute multimedia presentation that features video footage from the race, photos and equipment used. Hear stories of successes and challenges encountered along the way, participate in a question and answer session and see the dogs one last time before heading back to your hotel.

Special note(s): Not recommended for children under 4 years old due to lengthy narration. Dress in warm layers. Wear comfortable walking shoes. Bring a jacket, gloves and a hat. Children under the age of 16 must be accompanied by parent or guardian. Transportation to and from the venue is not wheelchair accessible.

Departure times are staggered and will be assigned in Denali. **Every effort will be made to reserve your tour at the time requested, but please note that due to National Park Service bus limitations, you may be moved to a different time slot. Please check your welcome packet upon arrival to confirm the exact tour departure time.**

This tour offers incredible scenery, a narrated history of the park road, and some of the best opportunities to view the park's wildlife inhabitants await you on this tour. The Tundra Wilderness Tour will guide you along the spectacular road corridor,

promising different experiences every day, as Denali's wildlife moves at its own pace and according to the seasons. Travel to the Murie Cabin near the East Fork River to experience where Adolf Murie lived while conducting his famous research inside what was then known as Mount McKinley National Park!

Special note(s): Dress in warm layers. Bring a camera and binoculars. Wildlife sightings are likely but are not guaranteed. Due to Park Service regulations, school buses are used. The buses do not have restrooms; however, rest stops are made approximately every 90 minutes. Departure times are staggered and will be assigned in Denali. **Every effort will be made to reserve your tour at the time requested, but please note that due to National Park Service bus limitations, you may be moved to a different time slot. Please check your welcome packet upon arrival to confirm the exact tour departure time.**



Kantishna Fly-In Day Trip

This trip offers visitors the exclusive opportunity to spend a day in the historic gold mining district of Kantishna, deep in Denali National Park. The tour includes a flight in a Cessna 206 single-engine aircraft 90 miles into the park to Kantishna. Upon landing,

your guide will greet and take you to the Kantishna Roadhouse, where you will spend the next several hours participating in activities of your choice, including hiking, gold panning, exploring the property, or simply relaxing on the gorgeous deck to soak in the views. A delicious lunch is included! Weather permitting, you will visit Wonder Lake before return flight to the eastern edge of Denali National Park. This backcountry tour offers you an incredibly unique way to experience the Denali wilderness.

Special note(s): Minimum age is 2. This tour is headset equipped, fully narrated and all seats are window seats. Flight time is approximately 35 minutes each way. Passengers are allowed one small backpack weighing 10 lbs. or less. Passenger weight will be collected and flight could be cancelled if weight and balance requirements of the aircraft cannot be met. Bear spray and other hazardous material are not allowed on the aircraft. Bear spray is available in Kantishna.



Denali Walking Tour

north landscape. Trip is narrated by experienced guides who share their knowledge and love of Alaska. Walking with a guide informs and expands awareness of Denali's ecosystems. Feel and smell the wilderness underfoot. Tour involves approximately two and a half hours of walking in a wilderness setting over uneven and unlevel trails. No food is provided on this tour, and guests should bring water. Bring appropriate clothing for changeable weather, including cool temperatures and rain.

Special note(s): Maximum age is 80 years. Maximum weight is 300 lbs. Must be physically able to walk and stand on moderate terrain. Guests with back, neck, heart or mobility problems are not allowed to participate. Wear outdoor clothing and comfortable walking shoes. Trekking poles and extra rain gear provided. Tour operates rain or shine. Walking portion of tour is approximately 2½ hours.



Denali Evening Nature Walk

Special note(s): Minimum age is 12. The hike is on a maintained trail and guest must be able to walk and stand for the duration of the tour. Please bring jacket and comfortable shoes to hike in.



Denali Adventure Hike

Approximately 5 hours



This tour is for the more fit travelers and a good alternative to motorized tours of similar length. It involves four and a half hours of walking over greatly variable terrain. While still a narrated tour, the interpretive hike covers more ground than a walk and explores the glacier topography in depth,

sometimes off trail. It is the best way to feel and smell the wilderness travelers come to see. This tour gives our small groups (6 guest maximum) a chance to see the forested area near the Nenana River, and a variety of wildlife habitat and vegetation. No food is provided on this tour. Guests should bring food, if needed. Bring water and appropriate clothing for changeable weather, including cool temperatures and rain.

Special note(s): Minimum age is 12. Maximum age is 80 years. Maximum weight is 300 lbs. Must be in good physical condition. Wear outdoor clothing and hiking shoes. Bring water and snacks. Trekking poles provided. Extra rain gear available, if needed. Tour is not suitable for pregnant guests. Guests with back, neck, heart or mobility problems are not allowed to participate. Hiking is approximately 4½ hours. Tour operates rain or shine, but may be cancelled by the operator in the event of extremely bad weather or unsuitable conditions. Wildlife sightings are likely but not guaranteed.

Safety: Your safety and security are of the utmost importance to us, and they are the primary consideration in the development and operation of our tour programs.

Value: We endeavor to select local tour operators who provide excursions of the highest quality, and we carefully monitor prices to ensure that you are receiving good value. Remember to book early to receive the best possible price.

Variety: Our tours offer a wide range of activities with something for everyone. They are designed both to feature the most popular and interesting attractions in each city and to satisfy the diverse needs and interests of our guests.

Can I cancel a land excursion I've requested?

Pre-reserved land excursions are non-refundable three days prior to travel. Excursions cancelled within three days of travel are subject to a 100% penalty, unless the operator, at their sole discretion, is unable to operate the program due to unforeseen circumstances. All sales of tours booked while on your land tour are considered final at the time of purchase and are 100% non-refundable except in the case of an operator-approved cancellation.

Can I request to be refunded for my land excursion?

In the event of any excursion being cancelled for reasons beyond our control, a full refund will be made. Land Excursions that were pre-reserved, charged and then cancelled due to weather or other operator-approved cancellation will be refunded using the same credit used to book your excursion. These refunds will typically be reflected on your credit card statement between 7 – 10 business days after cancellation. Should any excursion have to be abandoned through force majeure or difficulties en route, the best possible refund will be arranged according to the circumstances.

Are there children's prices available?

Some tours offer children's pricing for ages 12 and under. Parents are responsible for bringing a safety seat for the child. On most helicopter and flightseeing tours, children 24 months of age and older are required to have their own seat. Children under 24 months are considered lap infants and may ride free of charge if the tour operator can accommodate them. Check with our tour desks for more information.

Are there age or other restrictions on tours?

For most tours, there is no minimum age for children as long as they are accompanied by a parent or guardian. Guests under the age of 18 years cannot participate without a parent or guardian. Please review the tour description notes for the most current restrictions and any exceptions. Any other restrictions imposed by the tour operator are listed in the “Special Notes” section of each tour description.

Are the excursions guided?

Yes. All excursions include local English-speaking guides.

Should I tip the tour guide?

Tipping is a discretionary matter; however, it is customary, if one is pleased with their tour, to tip the tour guide.

What type of clothing should I wear while on tour?

Since weather conditions may vary, we suggest you pack a sweater, a light jacket, and an all-weather coat. Sunglasses are recommended for all tours.

Do the excursions include much walking and stair climbing?

All excursions involve some walking, and some excursions include more walking and stair climbing than others. Walking may be over uneven surfaces and on many excursions, it is necessary to negotiate stairs. Please refer to our tour symbols with each excursion description for more information and guidance.

Am I required to wear safety equipment on tour?

Yes, on certain tours it is mandatory that you wear the appropriate safety equipment to participate. Such equipment includes, but is not limited to life vests, helmets, etc.

Who should I contact if I have special dietary needs?

Some special dietary needs, such as vegetarian, diabetic, or gluten-free meals, may be accommodated with advance requests. Please contact the tour desk 24 hour prior to your tour departure.

On sportfishing excursions, do I get to keep the fish I catch?

Please remember you have purchased an opportunity to catch fish, not a guarantee of doing so. If your tour is not designated as catch and release, your catch can be processed and shipped home for an additional charge as arranged by the tour operator. Because of its perishable nature and U.S. Customs regulations, your catch may not be sent outside of the United States in most cases. In Alaska, fishing licenses are required and can be purchased online through a smartphone/tablet or at a computer located at your hotel/lodge (rates subject to change). Fishing for King salmon requires an additional \$15 retention tag (rates subject to change). Children under 16 do not need a license. Fish runs are dependent on spawning seasons, so during May and late September fish stock may be more limited. Go to www.adfg.state.ak.us for more details on licensing requirements and fishing regulations in Alaska.

What should I know before taking a flightseeing or helicopter tour?

Children 24 months of age and older are required to have their own seat. Children under 24 months are considered lap infants and may ride free of charge if the tour operator can accommodate them — with prior arrangement through our Tour Office. Parents must show proof of age to the tour operator for any lap infant. Carry-on bags are not allowed and limited secure storage is provided at the heliport. Helicopters may carry up to six guests depending on combined group weight. The flight length is approximate, and flight route may vary due to weather conditions. Flightseeing tours may be cancelled on short notice due to weather or safety issues. Warm clothing and sunglasses are recommended on flightseeing tours. Dressing in layers is practical and lets you adjust your attire to meet changing conditions. For helicopter tours a surcharge may be charged for guests over 250 lbs. The flightseeing company will assign aircraft and seats based on weight and balance. While every consideration is made to keep traveling companions and/or families together, this is not always possible for safety reasons.

What do you recommend for physically challenged guests?








This depends on the type and degree of the disability. Our goal is to provide a safe, comfortable experience for all guests. If you will be using a mobility device during your tour, we strongly recommend you travel with a person physically able to assist with your needs. If guests are able to walk on their own, we recommend tours designated as requiring an easy/moderate level of activity. The transportation on some tours may be able to accommodate a collapsible wheelchair stored below the bus; scooters or motorized wheelchairs are often too large. If confined to a wheelchair, we would recommend selecting an excursion identified as wheelchair accessible. We also recommend that non-ambulatory guests be accompanied by someone who can assist them throughout the duration of their tour. Our staff can provide more information on touring options for non-ambulatory guests. Physically challenged guests participating in an excursion must contact the tour desk at least 24 hours prior to your excursion to ensure arrangements can be made to meet your particular needs. Every effort will be made to accommodate all guests on the tour of their choice, but tours are operated by independent local companies. The final determination to let a guest participate is made by the tour operator and, therefore, if in the judgment of the tour operator, the safety or comfort of a guest is in question, the guest may be denied participation. This evaluation may not be able to be determined until meeting directly with the local tour operator.

To assist in your tour selection, please note the symbol(s) accompanying each tour description. They represent the following:

	<p>EASY: These excursions include walking for short distances over relatively level terrain, possibly with gravel and/or unpaved walkways or a few steps. Participants should have ambulatory capability in order to move into and out of ground transportation, such as motor coaches or railcars, and into and out of confined spaces, such as small aircrafts and small boats.</p>
	<p>MODERATE: These slightly more active excursions involve an increased amount of physical activity, such as substantial walking over uneven terrain, climbing stairs or extended periods of standing. Comfortable, sturdy shoes are recommended.</p>
	<p>STRENUOUS: These very active excursions involve physical exertion over an extended period of time. Terrain may be uneven or steep. Activities such as canoeing, biking, hiking or kayaking are examples. Participants should be in good physical condition.</p>

Fishing Guidelines



The experience

For many visitors, their Alaska experience would not be complete without a fishing excursion. The information below is provided to help answer questions regarding fishing conditions, regulations and licensing for the State of Alaska.

Conditions and seasonality

Fish runs are dependent on spawning seasons, weather, river levels, commercial fishing pressure and numerous other variables. Your fishing location and/or destination could change depending on these conditions and state regulations at the time of your visit. Please remember that you have purchased an opportunity to catch fish, not a guarantee of doing so.

Regulations

If the Alaska Department of Fish and Game determines that there are not enough salmon entering the river to sustain an adequate regeneration population, the fishing season may be cut back, catch limits decreased or other similar regulatory rules implemented.

In order to conserve salmon and other species, current regulations require you to stop fishing once you have retained the maximum limit by law.

Information on Alaska's current regulations can also be found online at www.adfg.state.ak.us.

If your tour is not designated as catch and release, your catch can be processed and shipped home for an additional charge. This service can be arranged through the fishing guide or the tour company. Due to Alaska law, the lodges/hotels are not allowed to process or store any sport-caught salmon. Because of its perishable nature and U.S. Customs regulations, your catch may not be sent outside of the United States.

Licensing

Fishing licenses are not included in the excursion pricing listed within this brochure.

It is highly recommended that you purchase the fishing license online at www.adfg.state.ak.us. Prices for a license will vary depending on the number of days you choose to fish. A one-day nonresident sport-fishing license is \$15. King salmon requires an additional \$15 stamp. Fishing licenses are required for anyone 16 years of age or older.

Special Information

Ecology & Environment

It is our policy to maintain a positive and proactive position in relation to the environment. We realize that there is much work to be done to achieve our company goals. To this end, we are continually striving to increase awareness of any environmental issues that are likely to affect any of the excursions we offer. We work closely with our local agents to convey any environmental messages in our land excursion programs and, therefore, ask you to support us in our efforts by respecting the cultures, customs and environmental issues of the various destinations we visit.

Excursions with Limited Participation

Excursions may be purchased in advance of your departure on a first-come, first-served basis. Many of our excursions have limited participation, and reservations will be processed in the order received.

Excursion Timing

Tour departure times have been established according to the information from our tour operators, but they are subject to change should the guest's arrival time at any destination be delayed, or the itinerary for any excursion may be amended. Please note that the time shown on your ticket or Welcome Envelope will be the time the tour departs. Guests are requested to report to the specified departure location at the designated time, as delay on your part can interfere with the pleasure of your fellow guests.

Personal Possessions

Personal articles should always remain under the guest's custody and control. Be careful that you don't leave your possessions unattended at any time in the vehicle or coach in which you are traveling, unless instructed otherwise. For most flightseeing tours, you will be asked to leave behind all carry-ons, and our operators have been instructed to secure these for you while you are on tour.

Prices

The prices for these Land Excursions are in U.S. dollars; are subject to change without notice; are per adult, per child or in some cases per vehicle. All quotations made include conveyance according to the itinerary and, where applicable, meals, refreshments, guides, and entrance fees, unless otherwise stated. Children, other than infants in arms, will be charged full fare unless noted otherwise. All fishing tours require the additional purchase of a fishing license, as well as a King salmon tag if you plan to fish for King salmon.

Transportation

Guests should appreciate that standards of transport vary considerably throughout the state. Air-conditioned coaches are not available in some cases. Guests wishing to travel with friends should all leave together, as this will help the tour staff to allocate them space in the same vehicle. For the comfort of all guests, smoking is prohibited aboard the sightseeing vehicles.

Tour Minimums/Withdrawal of Tours

Tours will operate subject to meeting the minimum number of participants. The tour operator reserves the right to withdraw any excursion through lack of demand and to make any alterations that they may deem advisable for the comfort of the guests, bearing in mind the convenience and best interest of each group.
