Alaska Salmon Bake & Palace Theatre Revue

Approximately 2½ hours



Looking for a relaxed dinner after a busy day of adventures? Head to the Alaska Salmon Bake at Pioneer Park where you'll enjoy dinner while surrounded by Alaska history. Enjoy an all-inclusive dinner featuring Slow-Roasted Beef, Fire-Grilled Wild Alaskan Salmon, and Craft

Beer-Battered Bering Sea Cod. Salad bar, dessert, and non-alcoholic beverages are included with your meal. Sit inside our dining hall or outside where you can soak up the evening sun with a pint of locally brewed beer or a glass of wine (at your own expense). Get great tips from our grill masters who cook our wild Alaska salmon perfectly over a bed of black spruce coals. After your meal, catch the musical comedy at the Palace Theatre, which is just a short walk from the Salmon Bake. If you only see one show in Alaska make sure it's the "Golden Heart Revue." Performed by a polished, professional cast, the show is performed nightly at the Palace Theatre.

Chena Hot Springs & Ice Museum

Approximately 4¾ hours



Experience the "hottest" and "coolest" attractions in Alaska! Start with a 60-mile ride to Chena Hot Springs Resort. Along the way, learn about the recreational area and history of the 100+ year old resort. Be on the lookout for wildlife, as this is moose country. After arriving at the Resort, enjoy an Aurora Ice Museum Tour with the

"cool" tour of the largest year-round ice environment in the world made from over 1,000 tons of ice and snow. Relax on caribou covered ice stools at the Aurora Ice Bar. Purchase an "appletini" (extra \$20 fee and I.D. required) in a martini glass carved from ice. Your souvenir to take with you! See the beautiful ice chandeliers overhead and themed bedrooms as you take in your amazing surroundings. To end the evening, the choice is yours with either a "hot" dip in the natural hot springs lake (ages 18+) including a towel or take an educational Geothermal Energy Tour. Learn about the resort's ongoing energy projects on this 40-minute tour.

Special note(s): Minimum age is 12. Minimum age is 18 for entry into the Hot Springs. Minimum height is 5'0". Minimum weight is 100 lbs. Bring a warm coat, gloves, hat and swimsuit. Towels and a parka will be provided. Time at Hot Springs and Ice Museum is approximately 2 hours. Wildlife sightings are likely but not guaranteed.

Riverboat Discovery Cruise

Approximately 5 hours



Enjoy a cruise on the Chena and Tanana rivers aboard an authentic sternwheeler and watch a bush pilot take off and land from a riverbank landing strip. From late June through early August, these waters teem with salmon. As the paddle wheel continues to churn the waters, witness

the “wedding of the rivers.” When the clear waters of the Chena meet the glacier-fed Tanana, the result is clouds of silt that rise and fall over the river. Make a stop at the home of a late four-time Iditarod champion, meet some winning sled dogs and see a sled-dog demonstration. Next, you’ll disembark the sternwheeler for a guided tour through a replica of an Athabascan Indian Village, where you will learn about local life in depth.

Special note(s): Lunch is included in the Pavilion.

Riverboat Discovery Cruise & Gold Dredge 8 Combo

Approximately 7½ hours



Board the only remaining authentic Alaska sternwheeler for a cruise along the Chena and Tanana rivers in Chena River State Recreation Area. During this narrated cruise, you will witness the unique line where the clear waters of the Chena meet the Tanana, the world’s greatest glacier river carrying tons of glacial silt from the Alaska Range.

Your next adventure carries you to the home of Dave Monson and the late Susan

Butcher, four-time Iditarod champion. Here, you will meet their winning sled dogs and witness a sled-dog demonstration. From there, continue on to the Old Chena Indian Village and disembark for a glimpse into local life and history. Native guides will take you on a tour of an Athabascan Indian village, a spruce bark hut and trapper’s cabin made of spruce logs.

Next, board a train to visit the Gold Dredge 8, a National Historic Monument! Local miners will give a brief course in mining, then you can try panning for yourself. You will find gold—we guarantee it! Finally, explore the dredge camp and visit the gift shop, where you can have your gold weighed and find out the dollar value based on the current market price. Turn your gold into a memorable keepsake before boarding the train for the return back to the station.

Enjoy a close-up view of the Trans-Alaska Pipeline and a presentation about its history and operation. Then, take a seat aboard the narrow-gauge Tanana Valley Railroad and hear the conductor tell tales of prospectors who arrived by the thousands during the gold rush. The train ride takes you to Gold

Dredge 8, where you will see firsthand how the dredge worked the gold fields. Once the train arrives at the camp, local miners will give a brief but informative course in mining, and then you will try panning for yourself! You will find gold—we guarantee it! Explore the dredge camp and enjoy complimentary coffee and fresh-baked cookies in the gift shop as your gold is weighed, then hop aboard the train and return to the station.

You will be picked up at your hotel by an executive shuttle bus and whisked out to the trail head while getting to know your local guide and learn about the surrounding area. At the trail head, your guides will have a safety briefing on the operation of the SxS's and safety on the trail. You will be

required to do a practice drive before proceeding to the trail. Next, travel on a winding trail through a boreal forest to a scenic lookout. You will have many opportunities to stop for pictures—so just ask your friendly guides! All the SxS's are designed to safely transport two (2) riders so this is a great activity for couples or friends. You will be driving off-road in Alaska for 32-miles but don't worry, all the SxS's are equipped with power steering and automatic transmissions to make the miles easily go by. Return to the bus for a relaxing trip back to the hotel and enjoy complimentary snacks and water from the comfort of your seat!

Special note(s): Minimum age is 10. Maximum weight is 300 lbs. Minimum age to drive is 16 years. Bring your driver's license. Journey Above the Arctic Circle, Fort Yukon & the Yukon River

This is an adventure you'll be talking about for years—a once-in-a-lifetime chance to fly over the Yukon Flats National Wildlife Refuge, the Yukon River, and the Arctic Circle! At Fort Yukon, accessible only by air, an Athabascan native guide shares their way of life in the Alaska bush. They will share details on their contemporary

way of life living in this unique and rustic Northern region of the world. Put your hand in the Yukon River and travel through the wetlands keeping your eye out for wildlife. Join a select group commemorated by the presentation of your official Arctic Circle Club Certificate upon your return to Fairbanks.

Special note(s): Minimum age is 5. Maximum weight is 340 lbs. Tour operator will confirm daily if weather conditions are suitable for flight. In the event this tour has to be cancelled due to weather, tour hosts will make their best attempt to reschedule your excursion. If rescheduling is not possible, a full refund will be made. Wildlife sightings are likely but not guaranteed. Flight time is approximately 2 hours.

Arctic Circle Air Adventure

Cross the Arctic Circle by air! A circular land-mass encompassing the earth's farthest north polar regions, the Arctic Circle formally marks the "Land of the Midnight Sun." Your adventure takes you north from Fairbanks across the expansive Yukon River Valley and into the Brooks Mountain Range (the Alaska

Rockies) before landing just east of the Gates of the Arctic National Park at Coldfoot, Alaska. On the ground, you'll visit two very different wilderness communities, Wiseman and Coldfoot. Both offer the unique opportunity to learn firsthand how the very few residents living in this remote Arctic region have adopted creative strategies for surviving extreme winter temperatures that can drop to -80°F. Earn an Arctic Circle Certificate upon return.

Special note(s): Price varies with departure time. Maximum weight is 340 lbs. Visit our tour desk for more information. Tour operator will confirm daily if weather conditions are suitable for flight. In the event this tour has to be cancelled due to weather, tour hosts will make their best attempt to reschedule your excursion. If rescheduling is not possible, a full refund will be made. Meals can be purchased during the tour and are at your own expense. Guests are required to check in with our tour desk to confirm weight. Flight time is approximately 2 hours. Time spent on the ground within the Arctic Circle is approximately 2½ hours. All flights are conducted in a nine-passenger, twin engine Piper Navajo Chieftain Aircraft.

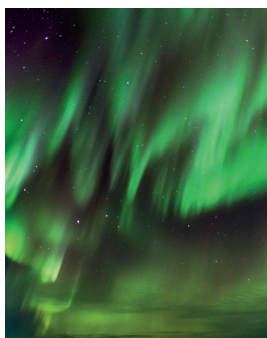

Our winters bring 6 months of multiple feet of snow and ice, in addition to temperatures down to -50 degrees Fahrenheit! Altogether, these conditions create a beautiful, yet difficult course that is truly for the golfing adventurer!

Special note(s): Wear comfortable shoes and dress in layers. Tour operates regardless of weather. Golf course is scenic and can be challenging due to climate. Guest must be able to walk and golf on bumpy/uneven terrain and able to step into vehicles. Guests can upgrade to premium golf clubs at an additional cost. Food and beverages are available to purchase at club house. Time spent on golf course is approximately 5 hours.
