Gold Panning at Prospector John's

Approximately 1½ hours



Learn and experience the ABCs of gold panning and gold mining, starting your adventure with locally sourced raw gold ore. Miners of old and still today begin with raw gold ore—so will you! Our tour is one of a kind, guiding you through the entire mining and panning process. Gold panning is actually the final step of many steps along the way. Enjoy an authentic experience and go home with new knowledge. Shovel, bucket, scoop, sluice box, gold pan, snuffer and vial—all tools

of the miner. You will use each of these tools as you mine your very own bucket of ore from start to finish. The gold you take home is the reward for your efforts, that along with great memories, stories, and laughs!

Our store and mining operation are surrounded by gorgeous mountain scenery including an unrivaled view of Langille Mountain, elevation 4,422 feet. It is not uncommon to spot Bighorn Sheep at the higher elevations of the mountain! This is an easy and fun experience for friends, families, grandparents, teens, children, and solo sojourners, and anyone wishing to answer the call of gold fever.

Kenai Fjords National Park Cruise

Approximately 10½ hours



Spend a day cruising the unspoiled wonders of Kenai Fjords National Park. Your narrated tour begins when your vessel ventures out from Seward to Resurrection Bay. Then, you'll head out to the open waters of the Gulf of Alaska around Cape Aialik to the face of a tidewater glacier. Listen for the thunder of "calving"—a process by

which glaciers shed giant blocks and slabs of ancient ice and send them crashing into the still waters of this protected bay. Watch for a variety of marine life, such as humpback whales, orcas, seabirds, sea lions, and otters. A complimentary lunch is served.

Special note(s): Bring your camera and binoculars. Dress in warm layers so you can spend time on the deck. This cruise will spend some time in open waters. If you think you may be susceptible to motion sickness, we recommend taking motion sickness medication the night prior, to alleviate discomfort so that you can enjoy your sailing. Travel time is approximately 1 hour each way. Tour may be available for guests with an overnight stay in Seward.

Escape into the wild and experience the thrill of fishing for Dolly Varden and Rainbow Trout on the legendary Upper Kenai River—one of Alaska's premier trophy fishing destinations. This unforgettable journey takes you through 17 stunning miles of turquoise glacier-fed water winding through the Chugach National Forest and the Kenai National Wildlife Refuge. Whether you're a first-time angler or a seasoned pro, these waters offer excitement for every skill level. Rainbow Trout & Dolly Varden fishing is strictly catch and release.

Special note(s): A valid Alaska fishing license is required for anyone 16 years of age or older and can be purchased upon arrival at the outfitter (credit card preferred). Space is limited, and trips fill quickly—early booking is strongly recommended. Dress for adventure in warm layers, and be sure to bring a jacket, hat, gloves, warm socks, and sunglasses. All fishing gear is provided, along with a snack and beverages. Rainbow Trout and Dolly Varden are catch, photograph and release and not eligible for the Cook My Catch program.

Kenai River Salmon Fishing Half Day / Full Day

Step into Alaska's untamed wilderness and spend some time battling powerful, seasonal Pacific Salmon on the legendary Upper Kenai River. Flowing through 17 breathtaking miles of the Chugach

National Forest and the Kenai National Wildlife Refuge, these vibrant turquoise waters serve as a massive spawning ground for millions of salmon each year. Whether you're new to fishing or a seasoned angler, this thrilling experience offers river sections for every skill level.

Special note(s): A valid Alaska fishing license is required for anyone 16 years of age or older and can be purchased upon arrival at the outfitter (credit card preferred). Space is limited and trips fill quickly—early booking is strongly recommended. If the salmon run or state regulations prevent salmon fishing during the time you have the tour booked the trip may be changed to target Rainbow Trout and Dolly Varden. Dress for adventure in warm layers, and don't forget a jacket, hat, gloves, warm socks, and sunglasses. All fishing gear is provided, along with a snack and beverages.



Exit Glacier Nature Hike & Explore Historic Seward Combo

Approximately 9 hours



Journey along Alaska's only National Scenic Byway and take a trip into the historic town of Seward. Enjoy a morning in Seward where you will be able to explore the historical seaside town on your own. In the afternoon, explore Exit Glacier, located within Kenai Fjords National Park, on an a guided hike, approximately 2.2 miles long, ideal for active and mobile

hikers. It typically takes 1 to 1.5 hours to complete the Overlook Loop Trail, depending on the group's pace. The guides will provide trekking poles and offer interpretive information as you explore the glacial area and hike along the overlook trail. They will share historical details and insights into glaciology, highlighting photos displayed along the trail that show the glacier's face from different years. Please be aware that this trail is unimproved in certain areas, with gravel and rock, and it ascends 900 feet in elevation to the overlook. This hike travels the lower glacier overlook trail and visits the Nature Center where guests can get their park cards stamped, purchase souvenirs, and explore the various displays provided by the park service.

Special note(s): Minimum age is 10. Please bring rain jacket, water bottle, hiking shoes, hat, and camera. Must be able to walk on undeveloped gravel and rocky trails. Not recommended for guests with heart conditions, pregnant guests, guests with neck or back problems, or limited mobility. Time at Exit Glacier approximately 2 hours. Travel time is approximately 1 hour each way. Exit Glacier Nature Hike may be available for guests with an overnight stay in Seward.



Explore Historic Seward

Approximately 8¼ hours



Journey along Alaska's only National Scenic Byway and take a trip into the historic town of Seward. Once in Seward you will be able to explore the historical seaside town on your own. Choose to visit the Alaska SeaLife Center—Alaska's only public aquarium and world-class cold-water marine research facility. Visitors to this “window on the sea” have close encounters with puffins, octopus, sea lions and other marine life while peeking over the shoulders of ocean

scientists studying Alaska's rich seas and diverse sea life. Your lodge team will provide information on these and other optional activities such as the Exit Glacier Nature Hike.

Special note(s): Admissions to the venues in Seward are optional. Admission to the SeaLife Center is not included. Travel time is approximately 1 hour each way.



Kenai River Scenic Float

Approximately 3¾ hours



Enjoy a tranquil float on the turquoise waters of the Kenai River and into the heart of the Kenai National Wildlife Refuge. Find moments of solitude and serenity on this relaxing tour far from the crowds. Your experienced guide will lead you on an

11-mile float trip along the Upper Kenai River surrounded by the Kenai Mountains. Keep your cameras in hand here, as the refuge is home to Alaska brown bears, moose, bald eagles, salmon and other wildlife.

Special note(s): Dress in warm layers. Bring gloves and a camera. Time on raft is approximately 2½ hours.



Kenai Canyon River Rafting

Approximately 7¼ hours



Spend a day exploring the Kenai National Wildlife Refuge on the Kenai River. Nearly two million acres in size, the Kenai National Wildlife Refuge offers majestic wilderness scenery and multiple species of wildlife and birds. Your guide will

steer your raft into the Kenai River Canyon and maneuver through the Class 2 rapids then pull ashore so you can enjoy a hearty picnic lunch. The Upper Kenai River terminates at Skilak Lake—a pristine, glacier-carved lake in the heart of the Wildlife Refuge. From Skilak Lake, you will take a moderate 1½-mile hike up the beautiful Hidden Creek trail where you get breathtaking views of the lake and surrounding mountains.

Special note(s): Dress in warm layers. Guests with back, neck, heart or mobility problems are not allowed to participate. Raft can accommodate up to 8 guests. Time on the raft is approximately 5 hours.
