Haines Eagle Preserve Float and Wildlife Quest

Price from \$279.95 Adult / \$224.95 Child

Approximately 6½ hours



Your tour begins on a high-speed catamaran for a scenic cruise through North America's deepest fjord to the picturesque village of Haines. In Haines, you'll board a motor coach for a beautiful 40-minute drive up the National Scenic Byway to the Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve. You'll see Haines and

historic Fort Seward on this narrated drive. At the preserve, experienced guides await to begin your rafting adventure (not whitewater). You'll float down the river aboard an 18-foot inflatable raft—the best way to observe the eagles drawn to feed on the plentiful salmon. Continue past the native village of Klukwan, where the Tlingit people have lived for centuries on the bounty of this beautiful preserve. After your float, you'll enjoy a riverside picnic. Your tour concludes with a return cruise aboard the catamaran back to Skagway.

Special note(s): Maximum weight is 350. Minimum age is 7. Pregnant guests past 20 weeks' gestation are not allowed to participate. Guests must be in good health and must be able to walk over loose gravel and dry river delta to board the rafts. Waiver must be signed and medical conditions disclosed. Life jackets, rubber boots and ponchos are supplied for the rafting portion of the tour. Wildlife sightings are likely but are not guaranteed.

Musher's Camp & Sled Dog Experience

Approximately 3¼ hours



Experience Alaska's state sport—dog mushing. On this dry land (no snow) adventure you will take an exhilarating sled ride pulled by a team of powerful Alaska huskies and learn about the adventurous sport of dog mushing from genuine mushers. Your journey begins with an

entertaining historic tour through downtown Skagway, and along nine miles of stunning coastline to the musher's camp in Dyea. Next, hop into a specialized Unimog for an exciting ride up a rugged mountain road, surrounded by glacially fed streams and waterfalls. At the top, a musher will greet you with a custom-designed wheeled summertime sled and a team of very excited Alaska huskies. Feel the power of these strong dogs as they whisk you down a mile-long, zigzagging trail deep in the Tongass National Forest. After the ride, spend a bit of time with the dog team, then enjoy the adventurous ride to a breathtaking viewpoint overlooking the Dyea tidal flats. The Unimog will then bring you to the Kennel talk where mushers share their passion for dog sledding and answer questions about the sport; you'll also have plenty of time to play with the puppies.

Special note(s): Guests should be able to lift the leg 12 inches to accommodate steps into and out of the vehicles. Dress in layers to be prepared for the weather and wear comfortable walking shoes.

C****Ghosts & Goodtime Girls
Historical Walking Tour**

Approximately 2 hours



Step back in time with one of the funny and informative madams of the Red Onion Saloon. Lavishly costumed and highly entertaining, she will greet you with a souvenir garter and guide you on a walking tour

through the back alleys and former red light districts of Skagway, where women of the evening brushed shoulders with notorious characters such as Soapy Smith and Frank Reid. Stories of Klondike Kate, Cad Wilson & Diamond Lil depict the lusty, adventurous and sometimes tragic stories of the women who stampeded north. You will pass historic and haunted Gold Rush buildings as you learn of Skagway's rich history. Your experience culminates with a stop at the world famous Red Onion Saloon's restored Brothel Museum. Here, join in a champagne toast and explore the hallways and bedrooms of this celebrated brothel, observing original relics and images of the ladies who worked there. You may even catch a glimpse of the resident ghost—Lydia.

Special note(s): Minimum age is 16. Guests should meet the Red Onion Madam 5 minutes in advance of tour departure time in front of the McCabe Building. She will arrive via SMART bus.

D****Glacier Point Wilderness Safari**

Approximately 6¼ hours



Your adventure begins with a 70-minute journey through North America's deepest fjord aboard a high-speed 26-passenger expedition boat. Watch for whales, seals, sea lions, and cascading waterfalls along the way to a remote beach at Glacier Point—one of

the most beautiful places in Alaska. After a short, adventurous drive along the forested glacial moraines, and a quarter-mile walk, the forest suddenly opens to a breathtaking view of the glacier. The crystal blue ice tumbles from the jagged peaks into a pristine lake where a 31-foot voyager canoe waits to take you to the very face of the glacier. Throughout your tour, expert guides share their extensive knowledge of this amazing area. A picnic lunch at the beach, amid fields of wild strawberries and iris, tops off your Glacier Point adventure.

Special note(s): Guests should take their physical fitness level and medical history into account when deciding to take this tour. Not suitable for pregnant guests past 20 weeks. Guests need to be able to walk 1/4 mile over natural terrain. It is recommended to bring an extra pair of socks. Minimum age is 7. Minimum weight is 50 lbs; maximum weight is 350 lbs.

Haines Wilderness Odyssey by Jet Boat

Price from \$254.95 Adult / \$194.95 Child

Approximately 6½ hours



Board the catamaran fast ferry for your 45-minute cruise to Haines. This is a great opportunity to visit two ports in one day. On your ferry to Haines, keep a watchful eye for marine life and Bald Eagles dotting the shoreline, and mountain peaks that come

straight up from the ocean and reach heights of 6,000 ft with cascading waterfalls. Soon after your arrival into Haines, board a bus for your 30-minute, narrated ride on the Haines Scenic Byway to the river dock for your journey into the heart of the Bald Eagle Preserve.

At the river dock, begin the river portion of the excursion, where you will traverse many different channels of the silt laden Chilkat River. Travel at least 20 miles into the wilderness to view bald eagles and their massive nests in their natural habitat. Have your camera's ready in case the wildlife should grace your presence. The Hess family started their "Mom & Pop" business 27 years ago and they still keep that small business feel. They have thought of everything, from preparing your hot dogs on the BBQ grill to adding extra outerwear to keep you warm and comfortable while enjoying the wilderness in their specially designed, flat bottom, open river boats. The friendly staff share stories about their lifestyle in Alaska.

Special note(s): Inclement weather gear provided. Meal may be served either before or after the river tour, mealtime appropriate. Not suitable for wheelchairs. Wildlife sightings are likely but are not guaranteed. Waiver must be signed and medical conditions disclosed.

Chilkoot Trail Hike & Float

Approximately 4¼ hours



Hike the historic Chilkoot Trail, the centerpiece of Klondike Gold Rush National Historical Park. This world-famous trail was the main route to the riches of the Klondike during the gold rush era. Enjoy a bit of exercise, fresh air, beautiful scenery, pristine forests and history as the trail takes you up and over the 350-foot elevation of

Saintly Hill. Where the trail reaches the banks of the Taiya River, you will board an 18-foot inflatable raft for a scenic float (no white water) back down the tidal estuary. Forest gives way to fields of beach greens and wild iris, and the granite walls of the fjord rise steeply to the snow-capped peaks and hanging glaciers. Enjoy a riverside snack and countless picture-perfect moments before making the return journey back to your hotel.

Special note(s): Maximum weight is 350lbs. Minimum age is 7. Pregnant guests past 20 weeks' gestation are not allowed to participate. Elevation gain is 350 feet. Waiver must be signed and medical conditions disclosed.



Days of '98 Show

Beginning in 1923, The Days of '98 Show has been a Skagway tradition for more than 100 years! This 1-hour live performance transports audiences to the gold rush era where swindlers

reigned supreme and stampeders whooped it up with can-can girls in rowdy dancehalls. Show-goers witness the rise and demise of the king of all con-men, Jefferson "Soapy" Smith. Guests who would like to participate as part of the show may even get a chance to join the actors on stage! When the show ends, guests will have the opportunity to meet and take pictures with the performers as they exit the theater and make their way back to the hotel.
