Officer Elections Set for May 18 General Meeting

The Trustees of our Council are now taking nominations for Officer positions for the 2026-2027 Fraternal Year, which begins July 1, 2026. We are open to accepting nominations for all positions except Financial Secretary and Lecturer, which are assigned by Supreme and the Grand Knight, respectively.

If you wish to nominate someone, including yourself, please contact one of the Trustees (**Bob Eikenburg, Neil Durbin or Don White**). However, make sure that whomever you nominate is willing to accept the nomination. A Brother Knight must be a Third-Degree member in good standing to be an officer.

Trustees have proposed the following slate of Officer candidates:

Grand Knight: Jerry Chiurazzi; **Deputy Grand Knight:** Dave Tortorete; **Chancellor:** Chris Schrickel; **Recorder:** Dr. Rob Kubick; **Treasurer:** Bill Shonk; **Advocate:** Bill Roscoe; **Warden:** Vaughn Kushner; **Inside Guard:** Art Barbetta; **Outside Guard:** Richard Sestokas; **Trustees:** Bob Eikenburg, Neil Durbin and Don White. In addition to the slate of nominees noted above, Trustees will be accepting additional nominations between now and up to and including the May meeting, Monday, May 18, 2026, when the vote will take place.

We would like to encourage all our Brother Knights to consider serving as an Officer. For your consideration, here are the responsibilities for the various officers:

- **Grand Knight:** The Grand Knight is the highest-ranking officer of his Council and is responsible for the welfare of the Council. He presides over Council meetings, acts as the ex-officio member of all committees, appoints membership and program directors, convenes officers for monthly meetings, and ensures all necessary reports are submitted to the state and Supreme Council. He should also be aware of the Council's financial status and ensure that his signature appears on all checks drawn.
- **Deputy Grand Knight:** The Deputy Grand Knight is second in command. He assists the Grand Knight with Council affairs and fulfills all the duties assigned to him by the Grand Knight. Should the Grand Knight be absent from a Council meeting the Deputy Grand Knight will preside. He is chairman of the Council's Retention Committee.
- **Chancellor:** The Chancellor has a variety of responsibilities. Primarily, he assists the Grand Knight and the Deputy Grand Knight in the execution of their duties and oversees the Council in both their absences. He is charged with strengthening the member's interest in Council activities.
- **Recorder:** The Recorder is like a court reporter or a secretary. He is responsible for maintaining a true record of all actions of the council and its correspondence, including meeting minutes.
- **Treasurer:** The Treasurer is responsible for the safekeeping and maintaining records of all council funds and accounts. He is responsible for depositing money into the council's accounts and provides a certificate of such monies to the Grand Knight. He is also responsible for payment of all expenses.
- **Advocate:** The Advocate is the legal representative of the council and serves as the council's attorney at trials and investigations of any interest to the council. While he does not need to be a member of the legal profession, he should be familiar with the council's bylaws, the Order's Charter, Constitution and Laws (#30), Methods of Conducting a Council Meeting (#137), and *Robert's Rules of Order*.
- **Warden:** The Warden is the "watchdog" for the Council property and degree paraphernalia, except the property of the Financial Secretary, Treasurer and Recorder. He is also responsible for setting up the Council chambers for meetings and ceremonial work.
- **Inside & Outside Guards:** The Guards have similar responsibilities, but distinct differences. The Outside Guard tends to the outer door admitting visitors and members to the inner door. Once at the door, the Inside Guard checks to make sure that their membership cards are current.
- **Board of Trustees:** The Board of Trustees consists of three members elected by the council and the Grand Knight, who serves as the chairman of the board. They oversee the work of the Financial Secretary and the Treasurer, and with the Deputy Grand Knight, serve on the Council's Retention Committee. During the elections, only a new three-year Trustee is voted on, with the others moving on, the current three-year Trustee becomes the two-year trustee, and the two-year Trustee then becomes one-year Trustee, respectively.

Council Sells 4,305 Charity Raffle Tickets, Breaking Last Year's Previous Record by 7%

Dear Brother Knights, the Final Turn-in of tickets and money are on their way to our State Treasurer. Next up is the drawing taking place on May 23. This year's campaign, which spanned almost three months, was very successful. We set a new Council record again with **4,305** tickets sold, surpassing last year's record sales of 4,029 by a margin of 276 tickets, or 7 percent. My sincere thanks to each of you who bought/sold tickets. You do an amazing job every year, somehow finding a way to sell more than the previous year.

Our Council has already retained **\$10,333** from the \$2.40 we keep from each ticket we sold. Sometime in August we will receive our rebate from the state, which will add to this figure and result in our final profit **FOR CHARITY** topping off at about **\$18,444**. This is the payoff for the work our Council puts into selling tickets.

On the following page is a list of our 46 top sellers (those who sold a minimum of 20 tickets.) There is also a break-out list of members who sold 100 or more tickets. We will honor our top ticket sellers at our June 2 Installation and Awards Dinner. Please attend if you can.

The final details for this year's campaign won't be known until the drawing takes place. At that point, we hope that one or more of our tickets will be pulled from the hopper. Keep in mind that Ohio councils sell 200,000 or slightly more tickets sold each year. We'll also learn then where we rank in ticket sales vs. the other councils in Ohio.

Here is some additional information:

- This is the first year that we have had more than one Knight sell 400 or more tickets. As you will see from the top sellers list, we had two Knights who were in close competition for the top ticket seller spot. **Allen Klingelhoets** (a brother Knight in Wisconsin) sold 452 and **Mark Kaucic** sold 430. What amazing sales from each of them and we owe them our gratitude as their combined sales totalled over 20 percent all Council sales. But, they are not “one-year wonders.” Mark was the top ticket seller for the past two years with Allen not far behind.
- The 46 top ticket sellers accounted for 80 percent of all tickets sold!
- A total of 80 Knights turned in tickets.
- There are two additional sources of ticket sales beyond the individual members:
 - We sold 200 tickets during our six Fish Fries.
 - We sold 261 “Council” tickets . This is the label I use to describe tickets that our Council sells by our advertising through the church bulletins and Holy Family parish website. People asking for raffle tickets contact Kay and me and we send them out tickets to buy and return to us. We maintain a list of people who purchased tickets in the past and reach out to them every year to, hopefully, get repeat business from them. Through word of mouth, we even have regular buyers of tickets from Florida, Michigan and Missouri.

In conclusion, let's always remember that we are doing this for CHARITY and the need for charitable giving never decreases. **Vivat Jesus! Trustee Bob Eikenburg, Charity Raffle Sale Chair**

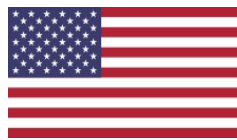
