2026 Fish Fry Season Sets New Records

During the 2026 Lenten Fish Fry season, Fr. Maruskin Council #10936 set a new sales record of 3,254 dinners, surpassing last year's previous record of \$3,154 by 100, or 3.2 percent. The council generated \$46,102.54 in net sales (after credit card fees), an 11.7 percent increase over last year's \$41,256 total.

This year's net profit of \$20,819.71, exceeded last year's \$17,141 mark by \$3,672.71, or 21.4 percent.. This year's weekly dinner sales totals topped the 500-meal mark in five of the six weeks, including an all-time record 640 in the third week in the final week.

Here is a week-by-week breakdown of dinners served: Feb. 20, 517; Feb. 26, 595; March 6, 640; March 13, 483; March 20, 504; and March 27, 515.

Thanks to the dozens of Knights, family members, friends and student volunteers, who teamed up to accomplish the many tasks involved in delivering high-quality, high-value meals to hundreds of families who returned week after week. Look for a final, individual recognition of all our Fish Fry volunteers, along with additional photos, in our May Council Newsletter.

Charity Raffle Final Turn-In Set for May 6; First Turn-In Tallies 2,449 Tickets Already Sold

Dear Brother Knights, the first turn-in of Charity Raffle tickets took place about two weeks ago. Thanks to a surge of returns from many of you, we turned in 2,449 tickets. Historically, this is our Council's fifth-best ever first turn-in results. We will earn approximately \$10,776 in profits from this first turn in, once we receive our rebate from the State in August. This is how I arrived at these figures:

- At the first turn-in we made an immediate profit of \$5,877, which is already in our Council's charitable account. This was derived from the \$2.40 our Council retained from each \$5 ticket we sold in the first turn-in. The other portion of the \$5 ticket, \$2.60, went to the Knights of Columbus Ohio State Council.
- In August we will receive a rebate check from the State which will pay us approximately another \$2 per ticket sold during the first turn-in. We will receive this rebate because of the volume of tickets we sell. This will bring in another \$4,898 for a grand total of \$10,776 for just the tickets sold during the 1st turn-in.

Our final turn-in date for tickets sold is Wednesday, May 6, barely a month from now. What we sell during this month will determine how successful this year's campaign will be. Last year we earned \$17,400 in profit from 4,019 total tickets sold. The profits from the final turn-in of tickets are calculated in the similar way as the first turn-in profits. We stand a good chance to sell enough tickets this month to reach this total again. But, this depends on your efforts to help in this endeavor. I greatly appreciate the efforts of you who have sold and turned in tickets already. A number of you have already sold 50 or more tickets.

- PLEASE, IF YOU HAVE NOT PURCHASED OR SOLD ANY TICKETS, CAN YOU DO SO?
- IF YOU HAVE SOLD TICKETS, ARE YOU ABLE TO SELL MORE? I have never -- and never will -- personally question a Knight about how many tickets he might sell or buy. Only you are in a position to know what you can do. All I'm asking is for you to consider these two questions, taking into account your own personal situation.
- If you need more tickets, just let me know and I will get them out to you quickly.

As you've probably heard me say before, these profits go 100 percent in support of charitable giving. It is so nice to be able to know that we have a healthy balance in our charitable account when we discuss giving a donation to a group, individual or cause. YOU make this happen with your sales. *I sincerely thank you for your efforts!* Vivat Jesus!

Officer Elections Set for May 18 General Meeting

The Trustees of our Council are now taking nominations for Officer positions for the 2026-2027 Fraternal Year, which begins July 1, 2026. We are open to accepting nominations for all positions except Financial Secretary and Lecturer, which are assigned by Supreme and the Grand Knight, respectively.

If you wish to nominate someone, including yourself, please contact one of the Trustees (**Bob Eikenburg, Neil Durbin** or **Don White**). However, make sure that whomever you nominate is willing to accept the nomination. A Brother Knight must be a Third-Degree member in good standing to be an officer.

Trustees have proposed the following slate of Officer candidates:

Grand Knight: Jerry Chiurazzi; **Deputy Grand Knight:** Dave Tortorete; **Chancellor:** Chris Schickel; **Recorder:** Dr. Rob Kubick; **Treasurer:** Bill Shonk; **Advocate:** Bill Roscoe; **Warden:** Vaughn Kushner; **Inside Guard:** Art Barbetta; **Outside Guard:** Richard Sestokas; **Trustees:** Bob Eikenburg, Neil Durbin and Don White. In addition to the slate of nominees noted above, Trustees will be accepting additional nominations between now and up to and including the May meeting, Monday, May 18, 2026, when the vote will take place.

We would like to encourage all our Brother Knights to consider serving as an Officer. For your consideration, here are the responsibilities for the various officers:

- **Grand Knight:** The Grand Knight is the highest-ranking officer of his Council and is responsible for the welfare of the Council. He presides over Council meetings, acts as the ex-officio member of all committees, appoints membership and program directors, convenes officers for monthly meetings, and ensures all necessary reports are submitted to the state and Supreme Council. He should also be aware of the Council's financial status and ensure that his signature appears on all checks drawn.
- **Deputy Grand Knight:** The Deputy Grand Knight is second in command. He assists the Grand Knight with Council affairs and fulfills all the duties assigned to him by the Grand Knight. Should the Grand Knight be absent from a Council meeting the Deputy Grand Knight will preside. He is chairman of the Council's Retention Committee.
- **Chancellor:** The Chancellor has a variety of responsibilities. Primarily, he assists the Grand Knight and the Deputy Grand Knight in the execution of their duties and oversees the Council in both their absences. He is charged with strengthening the member's interest in Council activities.
- **Recorder:** The Recorder is like a court reporter or a secretary. He is responsible for maintaining a true record of all actions of the council and its correspondence, including meeting minutes.
- **Treasurer:** The Treasurer is responsible for the safekeeping and maintaining records of all council funds and accounts. He is responsible for depositing money into the council's accounts and provides a certificate of such monies to the Grand Knight. He is also responsible for payment of all expenses.
- **Advocate:** The Advocate is the legal representative of the council and serves as the council's attorney at trials and investigations of any interest to the council. While he does not need to be a member of the legal profession, he should be familiar with the council's bylaws, the Order's Charter, Constitution and Laws (#30), Methods of Conducting a Council Meeting (#137), and Robert's Rules of Order.
- **Warden:** The Warden is the "watchdog" for the Council property and degree paraphernalia, except the property of the Financial Secretary, Treasurer and Recorder. He is also responsible for setting up the Council chambers for meetings and ceremonial work.
- **Inside & Outside Guards:** The Guards have similar responsibilities, but distinct differences. The Outside Guard tends to the outer door admitting visitors and members to the inner door. Once at the door, the Inside Guard checks to make sure that their membership cards are current.
- **Board of Trustees:** The Board of Trustees consists of three members elected by the council and the Grand Knight, who serves as the chairman of the board. They oversee the work of the Financial Secretary and the Treasurer, and with the Deputy Grand Knight, serve on the Council's Retention Committee. During the elections, only a new three-year Trustee is voted on, with the others moving on, the current three-year Trustee becomes the two-year trustee, and the two-year Trustee then becomes one-year Trustee, respectively.



Knights Change Fundraiser for Akron Pregnancy Services

The members of Fr. Maruskin Council # 10936 thank Holy Family parishioners for supporting the Baby Bottle Boomerang project we've used to raise money to support the Akron Pregnancy Services (APS) Pregnancy Center over the past few years. It's been effective due to parishioner generosity, but not very efficient, because of the large numbers of bottles and amount of loose change involved.

This year the Knights will be taking on the APS Walk for Life which is typically held near the organization's downtown offices at the Robinson House on Buchtel Avenue on the Saturday following Mothers' Day, which is May 16 this year. Teams form and then solicit pledges from organizations, families and friends that are willing to support their participation in the walk. It's all done digitally with APS collecting and reporting all donations back to the individual Team.

In our case we have asked active members who have served as Grand Knights of the Council to form three Teams, named for the guiding Principles of the Council:

Team Charity consists of **Bob Eikenburg*** and **Neil Durbin**; **Team Unity**, **Don White*** and **Pat Rynd**; and **Team Fraternity**, **Ron Crock*** and **Jerry Chiurazzi**.

***Team Captain.**

Each Team will receive an initial \$500 in Council Funds which will be eligible for Aid and Support After Pregnancy refunds through our K of C Supreme Council. We will solicit additional contributions from constituent parishes Holy Family and Mother of Sorrows in Peninsula, via parish bulletins and direct email solicitations to Family and Friends using specific links for each Team. These specific links will be published by each specific Team in a weekly Bulletin between now and the May 16 Walk for Life. Campaign progress will be published as appropriate, with the totals raised by each reported by the Monday following the March, May 18. St. Mary of Hudson is supporting the APS Walk for Life through its Walking with Moms in Need ministry. **Thanks for supporting the Team of your choice!!!!**
