Knights Participate in Helping Fund & Dedicate Springfield Twp. Fire Station Safe Haven Baby Box

Members of Fr. Maruskin Council #10936, including our Chaplain, **Fr. Michael McCandless**, joined Springfield Township officials, local charitable foundations and **Monica Kelsey**, founder of Safe Haven Baby Boxes, in the Aug. 10 dedication of the newest box, located at Springfield Township Fire Department, 2454 E. Waterloo Rd. Akron, OH 44312.

"We were told by the representative of SHBB that our box is the 463rd box placed in the United States. and the 27th box in Ohio," Trustee **Bob Eikenburg** says. "To date 84 babies have been saved by these boxes nationwide."

"Our Council, under the leadership of Past Grand Knight **Pat Rynd**, began the journey to purchase and place a box in August 2024, culminating with this box's dedication at the Springfield Fire Station in Summit County," Bob says. "It is truly a proud moment for our Council as we continue our efforts to save the lives of babies, both in the womb and after birth."

Other key contributors include the Lababidi Group, Betty V. & John M. Jacobson Foundation, Joseph and Sally Miller Foundation, and Kenneth L. Calhoun Charitable Trust, along with Springfield Township Fire Department and the Springfield Township Trustees, "who poured their hard work, heart, and dedication into bringing this Baby Box to our community," SHBB representative **Mariah Betz** notes, "Your commitment to protecting the most vulnerable and ensuring families have safe options has made a lasting impact. We are deeply grateful for your efforts in making this life-saving resource a reality. SHBB is the only organization providing complete anonymity and we want these mothers to know we are there for them and their infant before and following a surrender."

As you can see from the sample, when you purchase a ticket, you will find four randomly selected NFL football teams listed for each of the ten weeks. Cash prizes are given out based on the four teams that score the **most** or the **fewest** points in a given week. There are also secondary prizes for the second through 19th highest point totals and there are three more secondary prizes for the second through the fourth **lowest** point totals. The weekly cash prizes range from \$30 to \$400 for the 23 winners. **Again, you have a chance to win every week for the ten weeks.** You do not have to keep track of point totals each week. This is automatically done for you and, if you are a winner, you will be notified based on the contact information you provided on your ticket stub. If you enjoy NFL football, this is a painless way to add a little excitement during the final 10 weeks of the football season.
