# Vaccine Transportation: Public Health

- King County
  - [Dashboard](#): vaccinated 85% of 65+ group, but remaining racial equity disparities
  - Partnerships with CBOs to distribute vaccine
  - Sites at: Auburn, Kent, Redmond, Renton, Lumen Field, West Seattle, Rainier Beach, new North Seattle College
  - New eligibility – priority for people with disabilities and public transit operators currently, everyone 16+ years old on April 15<sup>th</sup>
  - Homebound efforts

# Vaccine Transportation: Vaccine Task Force

- King County COVID-19 Vaccine Mobility Task Force
  - **Coordinated Vaccine Transportation Helpline:** connects riders or help staff to secure transportation to and from vaccine appointments in King County.
    - Resources translated into 8 languages
    - Leverages existing network, but has Lyft credits available
    - Working with King County Public Health, City of Seattle, other CBOs to spread awareness about Helpline resource
