Hopelink Non-Emergency Medicaid Transportation (NEMT)

Hopelink brokers Non-Emergency Medicaid Transportation (NEMT) in King and Snohomish counties **for medical trips** covered by Medicaid.

Volunteer Services

Community Van

Community Van is a volunteer-driven transportation service driven for the community by the community.

How to schedule a ride

Make a reservation to schedule a ride in a Community Van by contacting your local coordinator. *Rides are dependent on volunteer availability.*

Type of service: Volunteer Transportation Service

- Vans can travel as far as two hours from their starting location.

Volunteer Services – CCS Western Washington

Volunteer Services is a free transportation service for individuals at least 60 years old and living on a fixed income or between 18 and 59 years old with temporary or permanent functional limitations. Volunteer drivers provide door-to-door service for older adults and adults with disabilities who live in King County. **Trips can be made on weekdays, weekends, weeknights, and across county lines if a volunteer is willing and available.** Medical appointments requiring sedation and/or anesthesia cannot be fulfilled. *Rides are dependent on volunteer availability.*

Eligibility:

- 60 years or older and living on a fixed income or between 18 and 59 years old with temporary or permanent functional limitations.

American Cancer Society: Road To Recovery

The American Cancer Society Road To Recovery program eases your burden by giving free rides to cancer-related medical appointments. Their trained volunteer drivers are happy to pick you up, take you to your appointment, and drop you off at home. All for free and all to make your days a little easier. *Rides are dependent on volunteer availability.* Coordinating your ride can take several business days, so please call at 1-800-227-2345 well in advance (3–14 days) of your appointment date. **No transfer is needed** if traveling from King to Snohomish or Snohomish to King.

Request rides at least 25 hours in advance, not including the date transportation is needed. Unable to accommodate day-of-ride requests.

Type of service: Medical Volunteer Transportation Service

Travel Across County and/or City Boundaries: YES

- Transfer is required if the volunteer driver is not registered in both counties.

Service Area: King and Snohomish Counties

Eligibility:

- Must be traveling to a cancer-related medical appointment.

- At least 18 years of age
- Not emitting radiation and not under anesthesia/sedation.

Sound Generations Volunteer Services

Sound Generations Volunteer Transportation program provides free, personalized, and safe transportation to essential healthcare appointments and needs. Rides must be called on the Tuesday prior to any appointments. Caregivers or family may ride with prior notice. *All rides are dependent on driver availability.*

Important Scheduling Information:

- Rides must be called in the Tuesday prior to any appointments the following week.
- Caregivers or family may ride with prior notice.
- Have all trip details ready (date, time, duration, location, etc.)
- All rides are dependent upon driver availability.

South Sound 211 – Referral Transportation Services

South Sound 211 is a free helpline that connects people in need with trained specialists to match them with the right services. It provides access to hundreds of services and programs **from Pierce, Thurston, and Lewis Counties.**

Following a screening by South Sound 211, clients may be referred to one of the three transportation service providers indicated below (the transportation services offered by South Sound 211 are not limited to the following services).

1. Puget Sound Educational Service District – Road to Independence
2. Volunteer Services – CCS Southwest Washington
3. Beyond the Borders- Demand Response Transportation

Clients must call South Sound 211 before contacting the following service providers to be screened. All clients who call the service provider will be referred to South Sound 211 for screening.

Puget Sound Educational Service District - Road to Independence

Road to Independence provides free door-to-door transportation to adults who are low income, have special needs, veterans, and seniors traveling in North and East Pierce County and South King County. Rides must be scheduled seven to 24 days before the trip. Trips must be canceled a minimum of 12 hours before the scheduled ride. *Rides are dependent on volunteer availability.*

Type of service: Volunteer Transportation Service

Travel Across County and/or City Boundaries: YES

Service area: Northeast Pierce County and South King County

Cost: FREE

Eligibility:

- All riders must be approved for Volunteer services by South Sound 211 before accessing transportation.
- Low-income or special needs individuals, seniors, and veterans
- Require transportation to and from various locations, including work, medical appointments, and other critical services.

Accessibility accommodations:

- Foldable wheelchair and walker accessible.
- Personal care attendant may ride with a rider as requested.

Volunteer Services – CCS Southwest Washington

Volunteer services provide low-income seniors and adults with disabilities with door-to-door transportation to medical, dental, grocery shopping, and essential errands. *Rides are dependent on volunteer availability.*

Type of service: Volunteer transportation

Travel Across County and/or City Boundaries: YES

Service area: Clallam, Jefferson & Kitsap Counties, Grays Harbor & Pacific Counties, Mason, Thurston & Lewis Counties, **Pierce County**, Wahkiakum, Cowlitz, Clark & Skamania Counties

Cost: FREE

Eligibility:

- All riders must be approved for Volunteer services by South Sound 211 before accessing transportation.
- Low-income older adults and adults with disabilities

Accessibility accommodations:

- Foldable wheelchair and walker accessible.

Hours of operation: Monday through Sunday, with the flexibility of volunteer drivers, rides can be filled in the morning, midday, evenings, and on weekends.

Beyond the Borders – Demand response transportation

Beyond the Borders demand response transportation is available for riders not living near a connector route. This service is available Monday through Saturday for dialysis appointments, work, and other essential trips. *Rides are dependent on volunteer availability.*

Service area: east and south Pierce County

Eligibility:

- All riders must be approved for Beyond the Borders by South Sound 211 before accessing transportation.
- People with disabilities, seniors 65+, veterans, youth aged 12-17, and those who identify as low income.

ADA Paratransit

Pierce Shuttle

Pierce Transit's ADA Paratransit SHUTTLE is a shared-ride service for people who, because of their disability, are unable to ride a regular Pierce Transit bus.

SHUTTLE provides door- to-door service, or in some instances, transportation to transit centers or bus stops to connect with regular bus service. The SHUTTLE vehicle may make several stops along the way before it arrives at your destination.

SHUTTLE will take you where you want to go, within their regular service area and hours of operation, based on fixed route service.

Travel Across County and/or City Boundaries: NO, but you can transfer from Pierce Shuttle to King County Metro Access at the border of Pierce and King counties.

Cost: \$2 each way or \$1 with Reduced Regional Fare Permit (RRFP). Fares are paid using cash or a monthly SHUTTLE pass

Eligibility:

Pierce Transit follows the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) of 1990 eligibility standards for paratransit services.

The ADA guidelines for establishing eligibility are as follows:

- Inability to board, ride or disembark (including system navigation) from any regularly accessible vehicle, even with the assistance of the lift and other commonly available help, or
- Inability to travel on a route at the time of needed travel because the system lacks required accommodations, or
- The individual has a condition (physical or cognitive disability) which prevents her/him from getting to or from bus boarding locations when traveling within an area served by bus.

Please be sure to answer all questions and tell us how your disability prevents you from using the regular bus system.

Applications are considered complete when all questions, signatures and contact information of professional sources are provided. Incomplete applications will be returned.

Pierce Transit does not offer SHUTTLE service outside our regular fixed route bus service area.

If you live outside the service area, you will need to make arrangements to make your way to a location inside the service area to receive SHUTTLE trips. SHUTTLE staff will work with you to determine the best pickup and drop-off points. They can also help you make travel arrangements with adjoining transit agencies.

King County Metro Access

King County Metro's Access Transportation program operates a network of accessible vans for anyone whose disability prevents them from riding traditional buses and trains. Riders must be pre-approved through an eligibility process that assesses their specific needs and abilities.

Access helps customers ride from their starting location to many local destinations within the King County Metro service area.

Service area: King County

To qualify:

- You are certified ADA eligible by another transit provider (Pierce, Community, Everett, Kitsap, Intercity, or Jefferson Transit).
- You can provide necessary documentation of a disability or mobility issue.
- You must complete a [self-assessment](#) form to determine whether to apply for Access.
- You must complete King County Metro's certification process and be found eligible.

How to apply:

- Anyone interested in riding Access should complete a [self-assessment](#) form to receive an application.
- Applications must be co-signed by a healthcare professional to be considered complete.
- An in-person evaluation at Harborview Medical Center in Seattle is part of the decision-making process. The evaluation appointment and transportation there and back are free.
- Access transportation will decide about your application within 21 calendar days of receiving all information necessary to determine your eligibility.

You may then use Metro's Access Transportation for a total of 21 days within a 365-day period. If you use Access Transportation services for more than 21 days within the 365-day period, you must apply for regular ADA paratransit eligibility with King County Metro.

Live outside King County?

If you live outside of our Washington state Puget Sound region and have a disability that prevents you from riding our traditional bus service, you may qualify as a visitor under the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA).

To ride as a visitor

To establish visitor status, contact Access’s Transportation Certification Office at (206) 263-3113 before you travel to King County. Visitor Service requests are completed by staff within one business day of receiving them.

Metro Flex

Metro Flex is an on-demand transit service that provides rides within multiple King County neighborhoods. For just one low fare, you can get where you need to go in its modern, comfortable minivans. Go shopping, meet friends for lunch, or head to appointments. No matter your destination within the service area, Metro Flex will take you there.

Metro Flex app

- Download the Metro Flex app and set up your profile, Select your “payment type” and then “fare/service type” to indicate any mobility needs or special fares.
- Open the app to request a ride for you and up to four other passengers.
- You’ll receive an arrival time and nearby pickup location—a short walk may be needed at pickup and drop-off.

If you have mobility needs that require a wheelchair-accessible vehicle, include this information within your Metro Flex profile. An accessible vehicle then will be automatically assigned to you for all of your rides, and no walk will be required.
