2021 PRIORITIES

- Priority 1** Maintain and expand active participation of South King County Mobility Coalition members with particular emphasis on cross sector collaboration, diversity of experience, and regional representation.
- Priority 2** Create opportunities for South King County cities, organizations, and residents to share resources, best practices, and problem solve together in the face of funding and organizing challenges.
- Priority 3** Partner with South King County cities and organizations to offer information and education opportunities for residents to learn of and access safe, accessible, convenient transportation.

2021 WORK PLAN PROJECTS

Organize Roundtable Networking Events. Following the challenges of the previous year, SKCMC will offer opportunities for community members to network, share lessons learned, and best practices regarding SKCMC member-identified priority topics. These events will be focused on collaborative problem-solving, replacing the tool-kit model with adaptive real time discussions.

Initiate Preliminary Data Analysis of Transportation Assets in South King Measure the transportation resources available in South King County that serve the needs of community members with low income. Resources could include (but are not limited to) public transit, shuttles, commute sharing programs, or volunteer services. Coordinate with stakeholders to develop an action plan responding from the report to fill the gaps and needs found.
