Those of us who cannot drive, or cannot afford to drive, experience major barriers in accessing doctors, jobs, schools, grocery stores, religious services, and community events. All of these activities are important for health and wellbeing. Because many communities lack accessible transportation options, thousands of King County residents, both in urban and rural areas, cannot get to essential services and participate fully in their communities.

The lived experience and knowledge of non-drivers, and those experiencing the highest barriers to transportation, should always be considered in transportation planning.

This project aims to humanize data that informs decision makers about the gaps, barriers, and needs that exist in transit planning. These stories are critical in creating effective and inclusive transit networks that support all of King County.

Stories collected for this project will be included in a digital “Story Map” that will be used as a tool when talking to service providers and decision makers.
