share ideas, learn and chat.

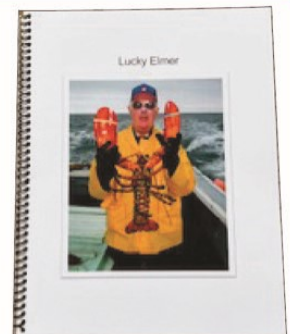
