Contributions to research projects

University College London:

In 2019 Stichting Bo Hjelt Foundation and University College London have come to an agreement for a contribution for a PHd Project 'Why do NTDs affect the brain more commonly in females than in males?' The total contribution is € 135.000,-.

At the end of the year 2020, there remains an amount of € 45.000,-.

University College London:

In 2019 Stichting Bo Hjelt Foundation and University College London have come to an agreement for a contribution for a pilot study project 'Inositol in China'. The total contribution is € 100.000,-.

At the end of the year 2020, there remains an amount of € 0,-.

International Federation for Spina Bifida and Hydrocephalus (IF):

In 2019 Stichting Bo Hjelt Foundation and the International Federation for Spina Bifida and Hydrocephalus (IF) have come to an agreement for a contribution for a scholarship for research. The total contribution is € 100.000,-.

At the end of the year 2020, there remains an amount of € 100.000,-.

Contributions to extra projects

Dr. Verpoorten:

In 2016 Stichting Bo Hjelt Foundation and Dr. Verpoorten have come to an agreement for a contribution for a double-blind study for the elimination of urinal incontinence in the beginning of the life of Spina Bifida patients. The total contribution is € 130.000,-.

2.2 Notes to the financial statements

Entity information

Registered address and registration number trade register

General notes

The most important activities of the entity

The activities of Stichting Bo Hjelt Foundation consist mainly of the support and promotion of medical research for the prevention and cure of the disease Spina Bifida and the support and promotion of assistance to patients suffering from mentioned disease.

Disclosure of going concern

In 2020, Coronavirus (COVID-19) has spread worldwide and radical measures have been taken to control the Coronavirus. This resulted in a loss for Stichting Bo Hjelt Foundation in 2020, which is mainly caused by declining prices of securities at the start of the Coronavirus crisis. However, to the best of our judgement and taking into account all facts and circumstances, we see no reason to doubt the positive continuity assumption at this time. In addition, the board did not need to take any measures to compensate any negative financial consequences of the Coronavirus. The accounting principles applied to the valuation of assets and liabilities and the determination of results in these financial statements are based on the assumption of continuity of the foundation.

General accounting principles**Disclosure of changes in accounting policies**

The financial statements are drawn up in accordance with fiscal valuation principles. The valuation principles and method of determining the result are the same as those used in the previous year.

Accounting principles**Accounting principles for determining the result**

The result is the difference between the realisable value of the goods/services provided and the costs and other charges during the year. The results on transactions are recognised in the year in which they are realised.

Other operating expenses

Expenses are determined on a historical basis and are attributed to the reporting year to which they relate.

Income of securities and receivables, that are part of non-current assets

Interest and dividends to be received from participations and securities are recognised as soon as Stichting Bo Hjelt Foundation has acquired the right to them.

Interest expenses and related expenses

Interest expenses are recognised on a pro rata basis, taking account of the effective interest rate of the liabilities to which they relate. In accounting for interest expenses, the recognised transaction expenses for loans received are taken into consideration.
