Thursday Bible Study to Resume in September

The Thursday Bible
Study at 2:00 pm will
resume on September
4. The following Books
of the Bible will be
covered this Fall:
Philippians,
Colossians, 1st and 2nd
Thessalonians, 1st and
2nd Timothy, Titus, and



Philemon, beginning with Christ's obedience and ending with Christian refreshment. Some of the major ideas explored are obedience, faith and action, coming of the Lord, Christian endurance, and the life of grace in the church.

This revision of the Abingdon classic <u>Genesis to Revelation</u> series is a comprehensive, verse-by-verse, book-by-book study of the Bible based on the NIV. These studies are 13 weeks each and help readers strengthen their understanding and appreciation of the Bible by enabling them to engage the Scripture on three levels:

- 1 What does the Bible say? 2 What does the passage mean?
- 3 How does the Scripture relate to my life?

The meaning of the selected passages is made clear by considering such aspects as ancient customs, locations of places, and the meaning of words. The simple format makes the study easy to use. To sign up and purchase a study book, please see Tom Petersen.



APPROVAL OF PREVIOUS MEETING MINUTES: June 13, 2025 minutes APPROVED

PASTOR'S REPORT:

- Pastor will be on vacation July 14 July 21 and 2 weeks in September.
- Annual Church Charge Conference reporting will begin in August; EUMC's Annual Charge Conference is scheduled for 4:30 PM, October 5, at Traverse City Central UMC.
- "Fall Fun" [Adult VBS] in being prepared for October.

ANCHOR DAY – July 19: Parade Float

Volunteers are requested to assist with both the decoration and assembly of the parade float. The group will convene in the EUMC parking lot at 10:00 AM for float preparation.

At 11:30 AM, parade participants will gather for line-up at Lions Club Park, with the parade commencing promptly at 12:00 noon. Icy Pops will be distributed along the parade route. Additional support is needed for float disassembly following the conclusion of the parade. We appreciate the commitment of Gerrie Sorbie, Meredith Goodrick, Claudia and Jim Bomersback, and Candy and Mike Hasselbeck for towing the float and assisting with float decoration, as well as Lydia Olin for volunteering to ride on the float.

STAFF/PASTOR – PARISH RELATIONS: Tom Petersen reported that SPRC will hold its quarterly meeting on Aug. 12 at 10 AM. Annual Church Charge Conference forms will be distributed at that time. SPRC is scheduled to meet [via Zoom] with the District Superintendent on September 18 at 5:45 PM to discuss parish work.

FINANCE: Treasurer Meredith Goodrick reported that sponsorships and donations covered all expenses for the First Responder pig roast, resulting in a \$130 surplus to be allocated for next year's event. An additional \$500 was paid for catering in error and will be used as a food deposit for next year's event. Fifty percent of Ministry shares are paid through June. As of June 30, 2025: Income \$63,041; Expenses \$83,008 [General Fund monthly income required \$13,542].

WORSHIP & NURTURE: Pastor Melody is well-advanced in preparing worship services for the autumn season. The choir and accompanists have received favorable feedback and are commended for their outstanding contributions.

TRUSTEES: Jean Petersen announced that the trustees will convene for their quarterly meeting next Sunday following the church service. She also reported on the acquisition of a new chair for

the church office. Additionally, Jean recognized Tom and Donna Haiderer and Jim and Claudia Bomersback for beautifully maintaining the church grounds. Thank you!

MISSIONS: Jim Sorbie reported that Paper Pantry operations are proceeding as planned. Eleven individuals were served in June. The next Pantry event is scheduled for August 26, from 5:00 to 6:30 PM.
