

# ADMINISTRATIVE COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES- OCTOBER 13, 2025

**PRESENT**: Pastor Melody & Denny Olin, Roy Pentilla, Jan Lyon, Tom & Jean Petersen, Sandy Mallory, Meredith Goodrick, Roger & Beth Noonan

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Sandy Mallory; Pastor Melody opened with a prayer. The minutes of the July 13, 2025 meeting were approved unanimously.

**PASTOR'S REPORT:** Pastor Melody attended the EUMC Annual Church Charge Conference on October 5 at Central United Methodist Church, Traverse City. Eleven names were listed for removal from EUMC membership for administrative reasons only; these individuals can still consider EUMC their home church. All other matters remained unchanged from last year.

- The Adult Fall Faith (VBS) program "Gone Fishing" is happening now; Oct. 13-16, 10 AM to Noon.
- Pastor Melody created a pamphlet outlining our church's identity and activities for EUMC visitors and sought consensus to print it. Agreed.

**Lay Leader:** Jan Lyon attended the Western Waters District Conference on hospitality, noting that our church already practices many of the recommended ideas.

• She reported that four Michigan districts are being proposed instead of the current seven and that there will only be four district superintendents with a 5th being added to handle special concerns.

**Staff Pastor Parish Relations Committee** – Tom Peterson reported that the Staff Pastor-Parish Relations Committee (SPRC) met with the district superintendent to conduct an annual evaluation of Pastor Melody. The Bishop decides 2026 appointments during the first quarter of 2026.

Finance – Meredith Goodrick presented the treasurer's report. Roy Pentilla made a motion to close our accounts at Huntington Bank and transfer the funds to State Savings Bank; the motion was approved unanimously. The Huntington accounts are no longer required as payroll services are no longer provided by the bank. Meredith also noted that an accidental duplicate endowment payment was received this month, and consequently, no payment will be disbursed next month.

Trustees - Jean Petersen reported that the trustees met in July and saved money on insurance after meeting with Church Mutual.

- She is looking into costs for installing handicapped bathroom door buttons.
- Deering's Tree Service cleaned up a fallen tree at the parsonage.

Worship & Nurture - Pastor Melody has worship services planned through December.

**United Women of Faith** – Jean Petersen reported that the Lions Club dinner will be held on November 3 and will need volunteers to help with it. The Christmas Luncheon is scheduled for Tuesday, December 9. **Missions** - The next paper pantry will be held on Tuesday, October 28. All items on the shopping list are needed. Volunteers are also needed. The Paper Pantry served 12 people in September.

OTHER BUSINESS – Denny Olin mentioned that while collaborating with DS Anita Hahn, she discussed the process of removing inactive members from the membership roll for administrative reasons. These individuals would retain a home church but would no longer be listed as members.

Additionally, Denny proposed that a review of costs associated with the phone and cable services at the parsonage might be in

with the phone and cable services at the parsonage might be in order. Currently EUMC pays a significant amount for these bundled services; he will investigate whether residential rates would offer potential savings when separated from business rates.
