

Boulders' Winning Streak Ends at Seven

No Match for Miners in Middle Game of Series

UNDATED – The Boulders' longest winning streak of the season was stopped at seven games Wednesday night as they lost to the Sussex County Miners 16-5 at Skylands Stadium in Augusta, NJ.

New York (28-19) was beaten by the Miners (20-25) for the first time in almost exactly a year (July 2, 2025), having taken 12 in a row from their division rivals.

Sussex County built a 14-0 lead on the strength of a five-run third inning, four in the fourth, and five more in the bottom of the fifth inning.

LHP **Jordan Saviñon** (L, 0-1 / 2.2 IP, 5 R, 2 H, 4 BB, 3 K) took the loss in his first professional decision.

The Boulders didn't have anyone reach base until 3B **Norris McClure** (2-for-4) led off the top of the sixth inning with an infield single that extended his hitting streak to nine games (14-of-37 / .378)

DH **Jason Agresti** (2-for-4) accounted for the visiting side's only other two hits, with two doubles that drove in three runs.

The rubber game of the series is set for tomorrow (Thursday) night, with first pitch scheduled for 7:05pm EDT.

Also of note:

* C/OF **John Schroeder** made his pro debut on the mound, tossing the final two innings

* The Boulders ended an 8-game winning streak on the road and fell to 7-1 on their current 9-game trip after sweeping Tri-City and Québec
