

POMONA, N.Y. - The New Jersey Jackals (20-36) fell to the New York Boulders (29-27) 9-3.

The Boulders opened the scoring on two straight first inning doubles. With Kyle Hess on second base, Jason Agresti doubled him in. Leading 1-0, New York tacked on another run in the fourth when Santino Rosso singled to score Alfredo Marte, doubling the lead to 2-0.

Agresti added on in the sixth with a solo home run, increasing the advantage to 3-0. In the seventh, Jack Scanlon singled to plate Isaac Bellony.

Trailing 4-0, New Jersey cut the gap in half in the eighth. With the bases loaded, Bryson Parks got hit by a pitch, scoring Ryan Ford. Two batters later, Sam Angelo reached on a fielder's choice, which allowed Kenneth Jimenez to score, cutting the gap to 4-2. However, New York answered with five runs in the bottom of the eighth inning.

In the ninth, the Jackals added on one when Arbert Cipion scored on a wild pitch.

Francis Ferguson (L, 2-5) took the loss, tossing six innings, allowing three runs on five hits with four strikeouts. Isaac Rohde (W, 3-1) earned the win after throwing seven innings, allowing no runs with 12 strikeouts.

The Jackals continue their series on Saturday night in New York. First pitch is scheduled for 6:30 p.m. ET.
