

Boulders Drop Rubber Game in Ottawa **Suffer First Series Loss of 2026**

UNDATED — The Boulders lost their rubber match with the Ottawa Titans, 3-2, on Thursday afternoon at Ottawa Stadium, and dropped a series for the first time this season.

New York (8-4) opened the scoring in the top of the second inning, getting an RBI single from C **Jack Scanlon** before CF **Henry Garcia** added a sacrifice fly.

Garcia then saved a run in the bottom half of the frame on a long throw to home plate, cutting down Ottawa catcher Justin Fogel to complete an 8-2 double play.

The Titans (8-4) tied the score in the fourth, getting back-to-back RBI doubles from 1B Kaiden Cardoso and SS Aaron Casillas before Casillas drove in the eventual winning run with a ribby single in the bottom of the sixth off losing pitcher **Scott Harper** (0-1).

The Boulders' best chance to pull even came in the top of the eighth after DH **Aaron Simmons** drew a leadoff walk, but he wound up stranded on third base.

LHP **Garrett Peters** (0-0) took a no-decision in his second start for New York, giving up 2 runs on 7 hits and a walk with 3 strikeouts over 5 innings.

The Boulders return home for the start of a three-game series against Les Aigles de Trois-Rivières, with first pitch tomorrow (Friday) night scheduled for 7:00pm EDT.
