Annual Sponsorship Recognition Program March 19

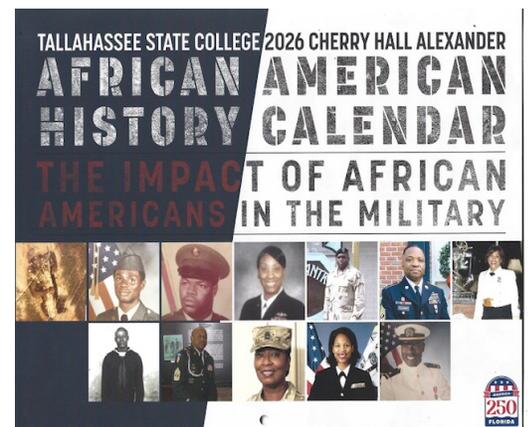

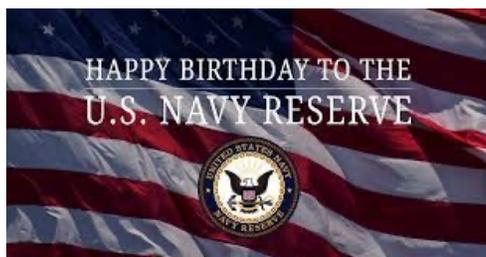
Pope Museum 5K – Vendor Table

Notable Events – US Naval Reserve’s Birthday-March 3rd by Marianne Scholer

According to their website, the US Navy Reserve – like the Reserve components of all the other US military branches - provides essential manpower, specialized skills and operational capabilities to the nation’s maritime service branch by integrating civilian professionals with military service, allowing them to serve parttime while maintaining civilian careers, offering benefits, training and strategic depth for national defense. Reserve sailors fill various roles from logistics and intelligence to tactical support, ensuring readiness for crises and ongoing global naval operations.

The mission of the Navy Reserve is to provide strategic depth and operational forces to supplement active duty Navy and Marine Corps personnel. This allows each service to acquire surge capacity and specialized skills during peace and war. Sailors typically serve parttime, allowing them to balance civilian jobs, education or family life with military duties. Comprised of both officers and enlisted personnel, reserves bring diverse backgrounds that allow them to work in roles from direct support to advanced technical fields. Reserve sailors drill once a month at a local Reserve Center and typically undergo two weeks of training each year. They can be called to active duty for major exercises, crises or deployments.
