

GOSPEL MEDITATION

The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ Luke 9:11-17

A Catholic friend of mine occasionally says, "The Eucharist is not a noun. It's a verb." In so saying, he is making the point that the Eucharist isn't simply Jesus' bodily presence given to us in holy Communion. It also manifests the dynamic pattern by which Christ actively loves and saves us. He teaches us to cooperate with that pattern. This Eucharist actually embodies four verbs: Jesus takes, blesses, breaks, and gives. Let's consider each one.

He takes: Do we acknowledge that we are totally in God's hands? Do we receive everything in our lives as a gift, and act responsibly with it?

He **blesses**: Do we actively reflect that Jesus makes us holy in our baptism? Do we embrace our bodies and souls as temples of God, worthy of love, peace, and joy?

He breaks: Do we run from failure and disappointment, from getting old or being ignored? Are we too worried about getting hurt or sick? Do we embrace our sufferings with confidence?

He gives: Are we willing to make our lives a gift for others? Are we confident that we will always have enough love to give to others, that God will always provide enough for us? Do we rejoice in giving away what we have to others, expecting nothing in return? This is the dynamic life the Eucharist empowers us to live.





Sign Before the Gospel

Question:


I have been going to Mass for years and have always wondered: why do we make the three signs of the cross before the Gospel?

Answer:

Certainly, many people go to Mass or other devotions, doing and saying things out of habit or reverence and not really understanding the reasons behind some of these things. But everything we do has a meaning or purpose that helps us to worship better, proclaim our beliefs, or focus the attention of the people on something that has a greater importance or significance. A review of the meaning of various gestures and practices can help us have a deeper appreciation for what we do.

There is a little prayer that goes with the three crosses before the Gospel: "May the words of the Holy Gospel be on my mind, on my lips and in my heart." In standing to hear the Gospel, we acknowledge that Jesus is present, and the words of the Gospel are addressed to us. All of the gestures and special postures we adopt before the Gospel are intended to help us prepare for hearing the Word as well as act on it. The incense, the Alleluia, the deacon or priest, and the special dialogue and announcement that introduces the Gospel help us focus our attention on the Good News we are about to hear. The three signs of the cross show our desire and good intention to hear and live the Gospel. **©LPi**






"You are a priest forever, in the line of Melchizedek." (Psalm 110:1)

Dear Parish Family and Friends,

Today, our Holy Mother Church celebrates the source and summit of all graces: the Eucharist! The Eucharist is more than merely a metaphor, symbolic, or reenactment of something from yesterday; it is the body, blood, soul, and divinity of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ! The Eucharist is the heart of the Church and the heart of the Christian life.

Our scriptures for this weekend are rich in amazing historical, prophetic, and covenantal language; it is hard to know where to begin and end with such a fantastic gift of the Eucharist. Of course, when we look at Genesis 14:18-20, we encounter this priest named Melchizedek, who brought bread and wine to offer a sacrifice. Providing bread and wine by Melchizedek over time was understood to be a priestly act. Thus, we see the deep connection to the priesthood and the sacrifice of bread and wine.

In the Gospel of Luke, Jesus sets the tone for continuing His priestly ministry by feeding the five thousand and incorporating His disciples into carrying on the same mission. The mission is to nourish a lost and vulnerable world that yearns for meaning with supernatural food. As we partake of the Eucharist in our Sunday liturgies, may we entrust our hearts, minds, and souls to the Lord to heal us from our fears, distress, and sadness.

As your pastor and spiritual father, I would like to encourage all of us to deepen our prayer for our nation and world. While on vacation, I purposely disconnected from the internet, emails, and other news media. It was great to disconnect and relax, but upon my return to the United States, I was horrified to see the events unfolding in Los Angeles. I was overwhelmed, saddened, and embarrassed that such a thing was happening.

Additionally, what has taken place with Israel and Iran is one more sadness we face as the human race. This Sunday, **June 22**, **2025**, I would like to have a parish-wide exposition of the Blessed Sacrament in the Shrine from **9:00 am to 5:00 pm**. In honor of Jesus being present in the Eucharist, we should collectively pray for peace in our hearts, neighborhoods, nation, and world. There will be simple prayer pamphlets in English and Spanish, which we can use to pray silently to our Eucharistic Lord to help curb hostilities in our world today! May God be praised now and always!

"Tú eres sacerdote eterno, según el rito de Melquisedec." (salmo 109:1)

Estimada familia parroquial:

Hoy, nuestra Santa Madre Iglesia celebra la fuente y la cumbre de todas las gracias: ¡la Eucaristía! La Eucaristía es mucho más que una simple metáfora, símbolo o recreación de algo del pasado; ¡es el cuerpo, la sangre, el alma y la divinidad de nuestro Señor y Salvador Jesucristo! La Eucaristía es el corazón de la Iglesia y el corazón de la vida cristiana.

Las lecturas de este fin de semana están llenas de un lenguaje histórico, profético y de alianza verdaderamente maravilloso; es dificil saber por dónde comenzar y terminar ante un don tan extraordinario como lo es la Eucaristía. Por supuesto, al mirar Génesis 14,18-20, encontramos a este sacerdote llamado Melquisedec, quien ofreció pan y vino en sacrificio. Con el tiempo, este acto de ofrecer pan y vino por parte de Melquisedec fue entendido como un acto sacerdotal. Así vemos una profunda conexión con el sacerdocio y el sacrificio del pan y el vino.

Como su pastor y padre espiritual, quiero animarnos a todos a profundizar nuestra oración por nuestra nación y el mundo. Durante mis vacaciones, me desconecté intencionalmente del internet, los correos electrónicos y otros medios de comunicación. Fue maravilloso desconectarme y descansar, pero al regresar a los Estados Unidos, me horrorizó ver los acontecimientos que estaban ocurriendo en Los Ángeles. Me sentí abrumado, triste y avergonzado de que algo así estuviera sucediendo.

Además, lo que ha ocurrido entre Israel e Irán es otra tristeza más que enfrentamos como humanidad. Este domingo, 22 de junio de 2025, me gustaría tener una exposición del Santísimo Sacramento en todo el Santuario parroquial desde las 9:00 a.m. hasta las 5:00 p.m. En honor a la presencia de Jesús en la Eucaristía, deberíamos orar colectivamente por la paz en nuestros corazones, vecindarios, nación y mundo. Habrá folletos de oración sencillos en inglés y español que podemos usar para orar en silencio ante nuestro Señor Eucarístico, pidiendo que nos ayude a frenar las hostilidades que vivimos en el mundo actual. ¡Que Dios sea alabado ahora y siempre!
