"Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths: all flesh shall see the salvation of God." (Luke 3:4,6)

Dear Parish Family and Friends,

As we enter our Second Week of Advent, we can see some profound prophecies of all the Scriptures coming to fulfillment in the prophet Isaiah! If we take some time in silent reflection, we can see themes of Eden, Exodus, and Confirmation in the power of the Holy Spirit. The person, Jesus Christ, the foretold Messiah, is the source of the Sacraments of the Catholic Church. Moreover, the themes of repentance and baptism are crucial for reestablishing meaningful relations with our loving God and with one another.

In reality, we cannot approach God with sin, arrogance, or pride. We see this in John the Baptist's rebuke of the religious authorities who were curious and making sure John was the real deal. They came to judge and observe, but refused to lower themselves to repentance and disrobe and get plunged into the water, let alone admit they were sinners. This disposition is in stark contrast to what our Lord desires. Moreover, we see the King of Kings, the Lord giver of life, innocent, no need of forgiveness, get baptized in the waters of the river Jordan!

Indeed, Jesus is our hope, but we should not take it for granted or presume that we will be with Him at the end of our lives. Despite our modern sensibilities of judgment and justice, Jesus has the final word. Jesus' baptism is not something we should take lightly or for granted. We see this in our modern world today, that many are merely cultural catholics and have no idea or belief in what they are doing when it comes to handing on our faith to the next generations. For my own faith journey, that was the gist of things. My faith came from my grandparents, who took it more seriously and faithfully. No games, no excuses, and we should never play with God, because He is fire. Jesus is the fire that comes to burn out all that separates us from His love. Please take the reception of the sacraments seriously so as not to receive them in vain!

Lastly, as we work to become an amazing parish that prays unceasingly, thank you for your patience and understanding as we shift a few things in our announcements and miniadult catechesis. We want to continue to make our worship space reverent, prayerful, and receptive to the Holy Spirit. Your prayers and willingness to collaborate with us are greatly appreciated. When you arrive, try to move closer together. We have our winter visitors returning, so try to be helpful to each other and offer your fellow parishioner a place in your pew.

"Preparen el camino del Señor, hagan rectos sus senderos, y todos los hombres verán al Salvador." (Lucas 3, 4-6)

Querida familia parroquial y amigos,

Al entrar en nuestra Segunda Semana de Adviento, podemos ver cómo algunas de las profecías más profundas de todas las Escrituras comienzan a cumplirse en el profeta Isaías. Si dedicamos tiempo a la reflexión silenciosa, podemos reconocer temas del Edén, del Éxodo y de la Confirmación en el poder del Espíritu Santo. La persona de Jesucristo, el Mesías anunciado, es la fuente de los Sacramentos de la Iglesia Católica. Además, los temas del arrepentimiento y del bautismo son esenciales para restablecer relaciones significativas con nuestro amoroso Dios y entre nosotros mismos.

En realidad, no podemos acercarnos a Dios con pecado, arrogancia o soberbia. Esto lo vemos en la reprensión que Juan el Bautista dirige a las autoridades religiosas, que, llenas de curiosidad, acudieron para asegurarse de que Juan era auténtico. Vinieron a juzgar y observar, pero se negaron a humillarse en arrepentimiento, a despojarse y dejarse sumergir en el agua, y mucho menos a admitir que eran pecadores. Esta disposición contrasta con lo que desea nuestro Señor. Además, vemos al Rey de Reyes, al Señor dador de vida, inocente y sin necesidad de perdón, ser bautizado en las aguas del río Jordán.

Ciertamente, Jesús es nuestra esperanza, pero no debemos darlo por sentado ni presumir que estaremos con Él al final de nuestras vidas. A pesar de nuestras sensibilidades modernas sobre el juicio y la justicia, Jesús tiene la última palabra. El bautismo de Jesús no es algo que debamos tomar a la ligera ni dar por hecho. Hoy, en nuestro mundo moderno, vemos a muchos que son meros católicos culturales y que no tienen ni idea ni creencias sobre qué deben hacer cuando se trata de transmitir nuestra fe a las próximas generaciones. En mi propio camino de fe, ese fue el caso: mi fe provino de mis abuelos, quienes la tomaban en serio y con fidelidad. Sin juegos, sin excusas y nunca debemos jugar con Dios, porque Él es fuego. Jesús es el fuego que viene a quemar todo aquello que nos separa de su amor. ¡Por favor, tomen en serio la recepción de los sacramentos para no recibirlos en vano!

Por último, seguimos trabajando para convertirnos en una parroquia maravillosa que ora sin cesar. Gracias por su paciencia y comprensión mientras ajustamos algunos aspectos de nuestros anuncios y de la minicatequesis para adultos. Queremos continuar haciendo de nuestro espacio de oración un lugar reverente, recogido y abierto al Espíritu Santo. Sus oraciones y su disposición para colaborar con nosotros son profundamente apreciadas. Al llegar, intenten sentarse más juntos. Nuestros visitantes de invierno están regresando, así que intentemos ser serviciales unos con otros y ofrecer a su compañero feligrés un lugar en su banca.

Reflection Question:

DECEMBER 7TH IS...

The Second Sunday of Advent emphasizes the message of preparation and repentance through the appearance of John the Baptist. Historically, the figure of John the Baptist holds significant importance not only in Christianity but also within the broader historical context. He is considered the last of the Old Testament prophets and the one who bridges the Old and New Testaments.

John's role in preparing the way for Jesus is echoed in various works of art and music throughout history. For instance, his depiction in Leonardo da Vinci's painting "St. John the Baptist" and his representation in Handel's oratorio "Messiah" highlight his enduring influence. John's call for repentance and baptism echoes the historical rituals of cleansing and renewal practiced by various religious groups at the time, making his message both radical and enduringly relevant.

This day reminds Catholics of their call to prepare their hearts and lives for the coming of the Lord, just as John prepared the way for Jesus' public ministry.
