





### **GOSPEL MEDITATION**

21<sup>st</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time Luke 13:22-30

I've been hiking Camelback Mountain in Phoenix, Arizona most of my life. It is a vigorous forty-five minutes to the top. Near the peak, the end suddenly appears much further away, and steeper. At that moment, a descending hiker often offers encouragement: "Keep going! The peak is right there. It's not as far as it looks. You can do it!" It usually works. After another five -minute push, you summit and enjoy a glorious panorama of the Sonoran Desert in the Valley of the Sun.

When Jesus is asked about how many people are saved, he says: "Strive to enter through the narrow gate" (Luke 13:24). How many? Strive! Focus on your journey. What does heavenly census taking have to do with you or me? How would it help a hiker on a mountain to ask the others coming down, "How many people are going to make it to the top?" A normal response would be something like: "How is that a relevant question? Carry on!"

Jesus links one virtue directly to salvation: perseverance (cf. Matt 24:13; hypomone in Greek). Strive! Endure! Keep going! The one absolutely necessary virtue is perseverance, to not give up on our journey. The mountain we struggle to climb is often our own weakness, failures, and sins. Persevere in prayer. Keep celebrating the sacraments. Embrace daily duties. With God's grace, you are strong enough to keep going. Perhaps the peak is not as far away as you might fear. Keep going!

# **Basilica Versus Cathedral**


### Question:

"I am the way, the truth and the life, says the Lord; no one comes to the Father, except through me." (John 14:6)

Dear Parish Family and Friends,

Imagine if Jesus came into the small town of Vail and he was merely passing by! If you had thirty seconds to ask Jesus a question, what would it be? You may ask about humanity's suffering or inquire about angels and demons. Either way, it would be a fantastic opportunity to have an encounter with Jesus and hear Him speak to us.

However, in our Gospel today, there is a chance that a bystander had a few moments to ask Jesus a fundamental question. Of course, hold onto your hats, the response by Jesus was not what they were expecting. Jesus chides His listeners about cheap grace and the false sense of salvation that some come to expect without any work on their part. Here in the United States, many American Christians and American Catholics alike have also encountered false doctrines of faith alone and cheap salvation because, despite sins and the rejection of God's commands, everyone goes to heaven. WHAT?

Despite all the untrue doctrines and theologies we encounter, there is one unavoidable reality. The cross of Jesus Christ is the only thing that saves us, and our humility in taking up our crosses daily and following the Lord. Throughout the themes of the scriptures, it is a matter of returning to the Lord, seeking forgiveness and becoming reconciled with Him and with one another. A failure to become reconciled with God may place our immortal souls in danger. While this is a harsh truth, we should hear it now so that we can choose to make a change today, rather than seeing and hearing for ourselves in the next life. We will be unpleasantly shocked!

At the end of the day, when we eat and drink with Jesus at the table of the Lord in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, are we truly coming to the table worthily? Does our pride prevent us from seeking reconciliation so that we think, 'Ah, God loves me and He forgives me?' Really? YOU ARE DEAD WRONG! No, He does not forgive you because you have not reconciled and sought forgiveness from the heart. Moreover, the sins we carry with us cause disruption and sickness within the Body of Christ, which prevents us from realizing our true potential through our sufferings in Jesus Christ. Jesus gave us the way to get into heaven, and while it can be tough, it is not impossible because Jesus prepared the way for us by taking up His cross. It is only through reconciliation, humility, and love that we truly enter the kingdom today!

Lastly, as we strive to ensure that all the wonderful things taking place at St. Rita in the Desert Roman Catholic Church is well-executed, I have provided our parish family with new Mission Statements for our Religious Education program and our Youth Formation group. It is essential that as we deepen our faith and learn, we have some guiding principles that lead us through the confusion. I especially encourage our parish families with children in faith formation to prayerfully consider how to incorporate faith, the scriptures, and family devotions into your weekly or daily routines. When we lack discipline and consistency, it's then that laziness creeps in, and we end up losing our children to the world. Parents, you are the first line of defense against Satan in the world. Our world today is the way it is because parents desire to be their children's friends, and that comes with a whole host of issues as we see playing out on the national scale. That is why we chose Word of Life and FORMED to assist you in growing in faith and understanding, to develop a deeper love for Jesus Christ and the Church. Kindly take the time to spiritually and faithfully form yourselves and your children in the faith that has stood the test of time! God bless and keep you always!

"Yo soy el camino, la verdad y la vida; nadie va al Padre, si no es por mí, dice el Señor." (Juan 14,6)

Estimada familia parroquial:

Imagínese que Jesús pasara por Vail. ¡Si tuviera treinta segundos para hacerle una pregunta, ¿qué le preguntaría? Quizás acerca del sufrimiento de la humanidad o sobre los ángeles y demonios. De cualquier manera, sería una oportunidad fantástica tener un encuentro con Jesús y escucharlo hablar con nosotros.

En el Evangelio de hoy, alguien tuvo esa oportunidad, pero la respuesta de Jesús sorprendió: no basta con una fe superficial ni con pensar que todos vamos al cielo sin conversión. La "gracia barata" no salva. Aquí en los Estados Unidos, muchos cristianos, incluyendo a católicos, también se han encontrado con falsas doctrinas de "solo la fe" y de "salvación barata", como si, a pesar de los pecados y del rechazo a los mandamientos de Dios, todos fueran al cielo. ¡¡QUÉ!?

A pesar de todas las falsas doctrinas y teologías que podamos encontrar, hay una realidad ineludible: la cruz de Jesucristo es lo único que nos salva, y nuestra humildad al tomar nuestra cruz cada día y seguir al Señor. A lo largo de las Escrituras, el tema central es volver al Señor, buscar el perdón y reconciliarnos con Él y con los demás. No reconciliarnos con Dios puede poner en peligro nuestras almas inmortales. Aunque sea una verdad dura, debemos escucharla ahora, para elegir cambiar hoy, en lugar de ver y escuchar por nosotros mismos en la otra vida. ¡Nos llevaríamos una desagradable sorpresa!

Al final del día, cuando comemos y bebemos con Jesús en la mesa del Señor durante el Santo Sacrificio de la Misa, ¿realmente estamos viniendo a la mesa de manera digna? ¿Nuestro orgullo nos impide buscar la reconciliación y pensamos: "Ah, Dios me ama y me perdona", ¿De verdad? ¡ESTÁ COMPLETAMENTE EQUIVOCADO! No, Él no perdona a los que no se han reconciliado ni han buscado el perdón de corazón. Además, los pecados que cargamos con nosotros causan una ruptura y una enfermedad dentro del Cuerpo de Cristo, lo cual nos impide ver nuestro verdadero potencial a través de nuestros sufrimientos en Jesucristo. Jesús nos mostró el camino al cielo, y aunque pueda ser dificil, no es imposible, porque Él lo preparó para nosotros al cargar con Su cruz. Solo a través de la reconciliación, la humildad y el amor entramos verdaderamente en el Reino hoy.

Por último, para asegurarnos de que todas las cosas maravillosas que están ocurriendo en Santa Rita del Desierto, Iglesia Católica Romana, se realicen de la mejor manera, le he provisto a nuestra familia parroquial las nuevas Declaraciones de Misión para nuestro programa de Educación Religiosa y nuestro grupo de Formación Juvenil. Es esencial que, mientras profundizamos en la fe y aprendemos, tengamos algunos principios rectores que nos conduzcan en medio de toda la confusión. Animo especialmente a nuestras familias parroquiales que tienen hijos en la formación en la fe a considerar en oración cómo hacer de la fe, de las Escrituras y de las devociones familiares parte de sus rutinas semanales o diarias. Cuando carecemos de disciplina y constancia, es entonces cuando la pereza se apodera de nosotros, y terminamos perdiendo a nuestros hijos para el mundo.
