



#### **GOSPEL MEDITATION**

22<sup>nd</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time Luke 14:1, 7-14

Once I was invited to a group meeting with Pope Francis. Entering the room, I paused, eyeing the seats next to the Pope's fancy chair. Someone saw my paralysis and invited me to sit in the seat farthest from what I wanted. Hiding my disappointment, I sat. We waited. To our surprise, an aid pointed out that those seats were still empty and invited me and another to have them. We calmly but gleefully strode across the room and sat. Pope Francis entered, and we enjoyed two hours of amazingly uplifting conversation.

Jesus says this week to us: "When you are invited, go and take the lowest place so that when the host comes to you he may say, 'My friend, move up to a higher position.' Then you will enjoy the esteem of your companions at the table" (Luke 14:10). This is not about how to score free seat upgrades. Rather, it is a wise pattern for the whole of life. It is how to live free from the anxiety of constantly grasping for status and recognition.

Jesus perfectly embodies his seattaking advice. He eschews his glorious throne for the lowest: death on a cross, that lonely chair we all deserve. In his resurrection, he calls us up higher to his marvelous banquet seats. This week, perhaps we should look for opportunities to choose the lowest seat. We'll be pleasantly surprised when we do.



"Take my yoke upon you, says the Lord, and learn from me, for I am meek and humble of heart." (Matt 11:29ab)

Dear Parish Family and Friends,

Knowing your own strengths and weaknesses can make you a well-rounded individual. There is wisdom in understanding this dynamic in the context of the Christian life. The scripture readings are all marked by imagery of humility and openness to the lowly of society. The Christian life is not about putting on airs and trying to impress, but it calls us to consider the deeper choices we make when it comes to the poor, weak, and immigrant.

Moreover, if we are honest and aware, we must consider that we ourselves were once poor. We are rich in Christ's willingness to humble Himself to take on our flesh, carry His cross, and die for us! I recommend opening your Bibles and turning to Philippians 2:3-11, where you will find the humility God demonstrated by becoming like us in all things except pride, ego, and selfishness. Much of the human condition is illusion and make-believe nowadays, and it is evident in the weak lives we live because we fail to humble ourselves and work with our imperfections. Our evangelical zeal is more pompous and aligned with worldly and political ideologies that have nothing in common with the Gospel of Jesus Christ. These efforts stem from a sense of pride and power, rather than love, humility, and care for the human person.

Ironically, the lowly, bloodied, crucified Christ, the poorest of the poor, calls all His poor children around the table of reconciliation to share in the Eucharistic banquet so that one day we will be in glory forever. We all come to this feast as beggars, for we merit nothing from God, for all that we have is grace and gift. Do we have the humility of heart to work with our redeemer, or do we believe ourselves to be above all that and look down at our fellow parishioners, co-workers, and the lowly? We have all been called equally to the banquet feast of heaven and earth!

As many of you are aware, we are seeking a replacement for Mr. Ken Fiscella in the position of maintenance supervisor. His dedication to our parish family spans over twenty years, and that earns him the right to retire. If you're interested in helping us in this role, please come and discuss it with me. The position may be the perfect part-time opportunity for you!

Additionally, Ms. Jessica Reynolds' dedication to our music ministry over the past few years has been exceptional. Due to her new position at work, she needs to step down from her current role. While she is stepping down as music director, I hope that she continues to offer her voice in song with our congregation. I am currently reviewing applicants to determine the best candidate for our new choir director position. I will keep you posted.

Lastly, the OCIA process has begun, and I would like to ask our parishioners to join me in praying for a successful start. I am thankful to our OCIA team for their willingness to step up and help those come into the Catholic Church. Additionally, I am grateful to Mr. Anthony Maez for his assistance in taking on this monumental task. He did a fantastic job last year, and this year, he may or may not return due to a new promotion. We pray that the Holy Spirit will guide him in the decision he needs to make for himself, his family, and the OCIA team. Deacon Ron Desmarais has chosen to help the OCIA and share his knowledge and skills with the OCIA team and inquirers. I ask all our fellow parishioners to join me in prayer and support the OCIA team. Consider becoming a sponsor for these inquirers and help them on the journey of faith. You cannot teach faith, but it is caught by those who love the Lord and live their lives as an example of grace, mercy, and love. St. Rita of Cascia, pray for us!

"Tomen mi yugo sobre ustedes, dice el Señor, y aprendan de mí, que soy manso y humilde de corazón." (Mateo 11:29ab)

Estimada familia parroquial:

Conocer nuestras propias fortalezas y debilidades puede hacernos personas íntegras. Hay sabiduría en comprender esta dinámica en el contexto de la vida cristiana. Las lecturas de la Sagrada Escritura están marcadas por imágenes de humildad y apertura hacia los más humildes de la sociedad. La vida cristiana no se trata de aparentar ni de impresionar, sino que nos llama a considerar las decisiones más profundas que tomamos respecto a los pobres, los débiles y los inmigrantes.

Además, siendo honestos y conscientes, debemos reconocer que nosotros mismos alguna vez fuimos pobres. Hoy somos ricos en la disposición de Cristo para humillarse, tomar nuestra carne, cargar con su cruz y morir por nosotros. Les recomiendo abrir sus Biblias y dirigirse a Filipenses 2:3-11, donde encontrarán la humildad de Dios al hacerse semejante a nosotros en todo, excepto en orgullo, egoísmo y vanidad. Gran parte de la condición humana de hoy en día es ilusión y fantasía, y esto se refleja en la debilidad de las vidas que llevamos porque no logramos humillarnos ni trabajar con nuestras imperfecciones. Nuestro celo evangélico muchas veces se vuelve pomposo y se alinea con ideologías mundanas y políticas que no tienen nada que ver con el Evangelio de Jesucristo. Estos esfuerzos surgen del orgullo y del poder, más que del amor, la humildad y la atención a la persona humana.

Paradójicamente, el Cristo humilde, ensangrentado y crucificado, el más pobre entre los pobres, convoca a todos sus hijos necesitados a la mesa de la reconciliación para compartir en el banquete eucarístico, de modo que un día estemos en la gloria para siempre. Todos llegamos a este banquete como mendigos, pues no merecemos nada de Dios, ya que todo lo que tenemos es gracia y don. ¿Tenemos la humildad de corazón para colaborar con nuestro Redentor, o creemos estar por encima de todo y miramos con desprecio a nuestros hermanos de parroquia, compañeros de trabajo y a los más humildes? ¡Todos hemos sido llamados por igual al banquete del cielo y de la tierra!

Como muchos de ustedes saben, estamos en la búsqueda de un reemplazo para el Sr. Ken Fiscella en el puesto de supervisor de mantenimiento. Su dedicación a nuestra familia parroquial por más de veinte años le da el derecho a retirarse. Si alguien está interesado en ayudar en este cargo, los invito a conversar conmigo. ¡Puede que sea la oportunidad de medio tiempo perfecta para usted!

Asimismo, la dedicación de la Srta. Jessica Reynolds a nuestro ministerio de música durante los últimos años ha sido excepcional. Debido a su nuevo puesto de trabajo, debe dejar su actual rol en el ministerio. Aunque se retira como directora de música, espero que siga compartiendo su hermosa voz cantando con nuestra congregación. Actualmente me encuentro evaluando candidatos para elegir a la persona más idónea para el puesto de nuevo director del coro. Los mantendré informados.

Por último, ha comenzado el proceso de OCIA, y me gustaría pedir a nuestros feligreses que se unan a mí en oración por un inicio exitoso. Estoy agradecido con nuestro equipo de OCIA por su disposición a ayudar a quienes desean entrar en la Iglesia Católica. También le agradezco al Sr. Anthony Maez su apoyo al asumir esta gran tarea.
