



Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary





GOSPEL MEDITATION

23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time Luke 14:25-33

One hot Arizona summer afternoon my car ran out of gas. I phoned the parish office and begged for help. My secretary came and helped me fill the gas tank. She chided me, "If you can't manage getting your car from A to B, how can we expect you to guide the parish where it needs to go?" Point taken, Julie. I vowed to always make sure I have plenty of gas in my car.

The Lord Jesus chides us in this week's Gospel, too. He uses the two images of a man building a tower and a king marching soldiers into war to make this single point: acquire what is needed to follow him or look ridiculous. We rightly mock the builder who lacks money for his tower and the king with a short-handed army. But our mocking boomerangs back on us. How do we expect to follow Jesus to the end with insufficient detachment from our possessions and divided hearts?

The good news is, there is still time. Jesus is building a great tower to heaven—his own body. So we renounce all and give ourselves to him as his precious stones. Jesus is waging a battle against our enemy. So we forsake all and swear allegiance and march under his banner. In this way, we will finish what has begun in our discipleship. Or better put, our Lord will have the stones and soldiers required to see his great work through.

"Let your face shine upon your servant; and teach me your laws." (Psalm 119:135)

Dear Parish Family and Friends,

When we consider being a Christian or a disciple of Jesus Christ, much is expected of us in terms of how we serve the Lord. Of course, many want to serve the Lord just as long as it doesn't cost too much of our time and interfere with our creature comforts. Jesus is quite clear about our comforts and makes us uncomfortable in many ways.

There is much wisdom to be found in what Jesus speaks about in our Gospel, as it harkens back to our first reading from the Book of Wisdom. Who can honestly know God or offer Him any counsel? God is high above us, and understanding this can help us better comprehend our journey in Christ. As disciples of the Lord, we sometimes hinder God's call, His love, and His plan of salvation due to our narrow-mindedness and utter stubbornness. It is our failure to let go that becomes our own undoing. In the grand scheme of things, who do we think we are? Without God, we are nothing!

The readings for this weekend challenge us and re-focus on the path of authentic and intentional discipleship. Indeed, we will have burdens, crosses, and many sacrifices that we would rather not have to endure, but in the end, they are for our benefit! It is precisely through our crosses, sufferings, and disappointments of life that we encounter a Savior who gently and lovingly walks with us to carry these challenges because He chose to do the same on His way to Calvary for us! The question is, will we let go and let God, or will we stubbornly fight Him to the end of our days?

Thank everyone who spoke with me last Sunday regarding volunteer hours in our parish office. As you are aware, we have a limited budget for staff, and therefore, we are unable to meet all the needs of our parish families. That is why I asked some parishioners to volunteer for a few hours during the week, from 5:00 pm to 7:00 pm, to help with messages, collecting for Mass intentions, or to drop off paperwork for various sacraments. Additionally, some asked about offering their skills to help with our parish website and assisting with our parish bulletin. I am grateful for your help. Please call the parish office so we can meet and discuss the details of when and where to begin. Once we have a plan of action in place, we can train you on using the phones, messages, and maintaining the receipt book. Thank you, and God bless!

As our parish looks to the future, our Parish Building Committee has been diligently working on many fronts. One of which is to put together a plan of action to help us move towards our dream. Next week, our Parish Building Committee will present the next phase for our consideration. We hope to present our current findings and demonstrate to the Diocese of Tucson that the family of St. Rita in the Desert is committed to moving forward and can, in fact, come together to raise capital—more details to come.

Lastly, as our OCIA journey begins, I ask that we, as a parish family, pray for those coming to know Jesus Christ. I also ask that we consider becoming spiritual sponsors to those who embark on the new journey of faith in OCIA. During September, the team and inquirers will meet on Wednesday evening in the Verhegen Building. During October, they will transition to Sunday mornings at 11:00 am. If you have a free moment, stop by the Verhagen building and say hello! Pray that our OCIA team and inquirers receive abundant blessings and graces from the Lord now and always!
