BAPTISM OF THE LORD

*"This is my beloved Son, with whom I am
well pleased." (Matthew 3:17)*

*"Éste es mi Hijo amado, en quien me
complazco." (Mateo 3:17)*

Reflection:

The Baptism of the Lord marks the beginning of Jesus' public ministry and is a profound moment of divine revelation. As Jesus rises from the waters of the Jordan, the heavens open, and the Spirit descends like a dove, affirming His identity as the beloved Son of the Father. This moment not only reveals the Holy Trinity but also inaugurates the path of our own baptismal calling. Through our baptism, we are invited to share in Christ's mission, to carry His light into the world, and to live as beloved sons and daughters of God. As you reflect on the meaning of your own baptism, consider how you are called to live out this identity daily, sharing God's love and grace with others.

Socratic Question:

How does understanding your identity as a beloved child of God shape the way you interact with others and embrace your mission in the world?

Reflexión:

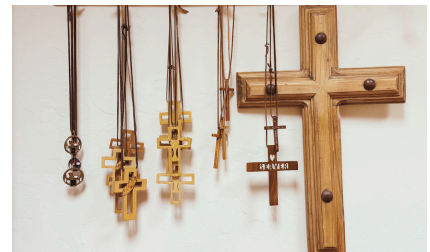

THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD

FROM CHRISTMAS JOY TO DAILY DISCIPLESHIP

Today, the Church celebrates the Baptism of the Lord, a feast that brings the Christmas season to its close and opens the door to a new chapter in the liturgical year. At the Jordan River, Jesus steps into the waters not because He needs repentance, but to sanctify the waters of baptism and to reveal His identity as the beloved Son of the Father.

As Jesus rises from the water, the heavens open. The Holy Spirit descends. The voice of the Father proclaims love, pleasure, and mission. This moment is not only a revelation of who Jesus is — it is also a revelation of who we are called to be.

Through our own baptism, we were claimed by God, washed clean of sin, and welcomed into the life of the Church. The words spoken over Jesus echo over each baptized person: *You are loved. You belong. You are sent.*

WHY THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD MATTERS

This feast reminds us that baptism is not simply a past event or a family celebration captured in photos. It is a **living reality** that shapes our identity every day. In baptism:

- We become children of God
- We are united to Christ's death and resurrection
- We are called to holiness and mission

The Baptism of the Lord marks the moment when Jesus begins His public ministry. Likewise, it reminds us that our baptism calls us to live our faith openly — not only in church, but in our homes, workplaces, and communities.

A TURNING POINT IN THE CHURCH YEAR

With this feast, the Church transitions from the mystery of Christ's birth to the mystery of His mission. Beginning **Monday, January 12, 2026**, we enter **Ordinary Time** — a season that invites us to walk with Christ in the ordinary rhythms of life.

Ordinary Time is not ordinary because it lacks meaning, but because it teaches us how holiness is formed slowly, faithfully, and consistently.

A PRAYER TO CLOSE THE CHRISTMAS SEASON

*Heavenly Father,
You revealed Your Son at the Jordan
and called Him Your beloved.
Help us to remember our own baptism
and to live each day as Your sons and daughters.
As we enter Ordinary Time,
give us the grace to follow Christ
in faithfulness and love.
Amen.*

ENTERING ORDINARY TIME:

WHAT THIS SEASON TEACHES US

What Does “Ordinary” Really Mean?

The word ordinary comes from the Latin *ordinalis*, meaning “ordered” or “numbered.” Ordinary Time is the season in which the Church reflects on the ordered, unfolding life and teachings of Jesus.

Rather than focusing on a single mystery (like Christmas or Easter), Ordinary Time allows us to grow steadily in discipleship, week by week.

Why the Church Uses Green

The liturgical color for Ordinary Time is green, a symbol of:

- Growth
- Hope
- Life
- Steady spiritual renewal

Green reminds us that faith grows quietly and persistently — much like a plant taking root and maturing over time.

Living Ordinary Time in Extraordinary Ways

At Home

- Revisit your baptism date and give thanks for that day
- Pray with the Sunday Gospel during the week
- Display a candle or holy water as a reminder of baptism

In Prayer

- Begin each day with a simple offering:
- “Lord, help me live my baptism today.”
- Practice brief moments of silence to listen for God’s voice
- Stay faithful to small, consistent prayer habits

In Daily Life

- Choose one concrete act of charity each week
- Practice patience, forgiveness, and kindness
- Remember that holiness is formed in ordinary moments

Ordinary Time Is Where Saints Are Made

Most of Jesus’ life unfolded quietly — in daily work, prayer, and relationships. Ordinary Time invites us to follow Him there.

As we move forward in the Church year, may we remember that God is pleased not only by grand gestures, but by faithful hearts living out their baptism one day at a time.



GOSPEL MEDITATION

IN THE GOSPEL PASSAGE...

the Baptism of the Lord is a watershed moment, marking the beginning of Jesus' public ministry. As Jesus is baptized by John in the Jordan, the heavens open, the Spirit descends like a dove, and the Father's voice declares Jesus as His beloved Son. This powerful event reveals the profound unity of the Holy Trinity and sets the tone for Jesus' mission on Earth. Our own baptism is a participation in this mystery, signifying our entrance into the family of God, washed clean and reborn in the Spirit. It's a call to live out our identity as children of God, to act justly, love tenderly, and walk humbly with God. Let us reflect on how our baptism empowers us to emulate Christ's example of love and service in our community.

Reflection Question:

In what ways can you more fully embrace and live out your baptismal calling in your daily life, reflecting the love and mission of Christ to those around you?

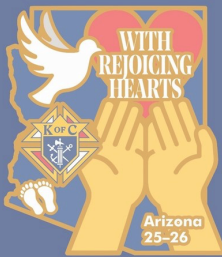

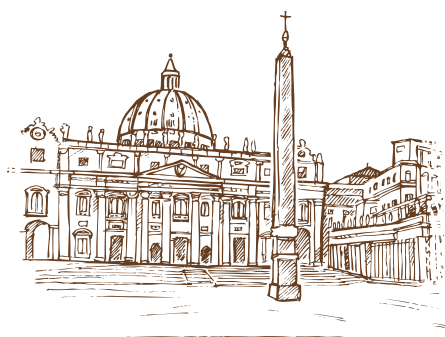

Feast Day: January 14

Patron Saint of: Spiders, and for protection against bad things

Story: A long time ago, in a place called Nola in Italy, there was a kind and gentle priest named Felix. He loved helping people, especially those who were poor or in need. When Felix's father passed away, he gave away his share of the family money to those who didn't have enough to eat or a place to stay.

But during a time when Christians were being treated badly, Felix was caught because of his love for Jesus. He managed to escape, and when he hid in a cave, something amazing happened! A spider quickly made a web over the entrance. When the people looking for Felix saw the spider's web, they thought nobody could be inside because the web was undisturbed. This clever spider helped keep Felix safe!

After the danger was over, Felix went back to helping people in Nola and continued to be a caring and loving priest until he went to heaven.

Why Is He Special? St. Felix teaches us about being kind and generous. He reminds us that God is always watching over us, sometimes in surprising ways!

Question to Ponder: Can you think of ways you can be kind and share what you have with others, just like St. Felix?

SAINT FELIX OF NOLA

Feast Day: January 14

Patronage: Spiders, against eye disease, and sometimes invoked for protection against thieves

Story: St. Felix of Nola was a priest in the 3rd century in the town of Nola, Italy. He was known for his humility and dedication to helping those in need. Felix chose to give up his share of the family inheritance to distribute to the poor after his father passed away. During periods of persecution against Christians, Felix was captured and tortured for his faith, but he managed to escape.

Legend has it that during one attempt to capture him, Felix hid in a cave, and God sent a spider to weave a web across the entrance, making it look like the cave hadn't been disturbed. This miraculous event saved his life. After the persecutions ended, Felix returned to Nola and continued his ministry, beloved for his kindness and unwavering faith.

Legacy: St. Felix's life is a testament to humble service and trust in God's providence. He is remembered for his deep commitment to the Church and for his gentle, caring nature toward those in need.

Reflection Question: How can St. Felix's dedication to serving others inspire you to share what you have with those in need, trusting in God's protection and care?

By reflecting on the life of St. Felix, we are reminded of the importance of humility and trust in God. Ask yourself: What can you do to reach out to those in need, imitating the kindness and compassion of St. Felix?
