Reflection:

As we journey through Advent, John the Baptist's question invites us to reflect on our own expectations of Jesus. Are we open to recognizing Him as the true Messiah, or are we distracted by worldly desires? This Sunday calls us to embrace the joy and hope that come from a deepened relationship with Christ, who is indeed the One who fulfills all our hearts' longings.

Socratic Question:

How are you preparing your heart this Advent to recognize and welcome Jesus as the Messiah in your life?

Reflexión:

Both the prophet Isaiah and John the Baptist, in their own times, faced an uphill battle with the hardness of heart of the people of Israel and never really saw the consolation the Lord promised. Moreover, both prophets were living in a time of corruption, hypocrisy, injustice, and sexual excess that corrupted the Nation of Israel to its core. As a result, they were divided and conquered and lost all hope.



Therefore, let us rejoice and be glad, for this is the day the Lord has made and it is a marvel in our eyes!

As you can see, our parish Shrine and Center look very lovely this time of year, and I would like to acknowledge our parish Altar Society and our parish Knights of Columbus Council. They have been diligent in decorating to prepare us for the Season of Christmas. If you haven't noticed, we put some lights around our Shrine and placed some Christmas lights along the fence. The Shrine looks sharp against the backdrop of the night's darkness. We also want to thank the Reynolds family for putting up our Advent wreath. It is a joy to have so many involved in helping make our parish look festive and bright.

Lastly, I apologize for not getting the required financials to you in November. I admit I thought I had enough time, and bam, I ran out of time. Querida familia y amigos de la parroquia:

Ser profeta en un tiempo como el nuestro, cuando todo a nuestro alrededor parece desmoronarse, no es nada sencillo. Tanto el profeta Isaías como Juan el Bautista tuvieron que enfrentarse, en su momento, a la dureza de corazón del pueblo de Israel, y ninguno de los dos llegó a ver la consolación que Dios había prometido. Además, vivían rodeados de corrupción, hipocresía, injusticias y excesos, fenómenos que habían afectado profundamente a la nación. Por eso terminaron divididos, conquistados y sin esperanza.


Aun así, los profetas nunca dejaron de señalar hacia la esperanza futura. Para creer en esa promesa, ellos necesitaban una relación muy profunda con Dios y, además, dar un verdadero salto de fe, aceptando lo que viniera como resultado de su misión: que fuera bueno, difícil o indiferente. Isaías no llegó a ver el nacimiento del Mesías y Juan el Bautista necesitó la confirmación de que Jesús era, de verdad, el Mesías anunciado por Isaías.

Y aunque hoy vemos guerras, injusticias, maldad y tantas situaciones dolorosas, nosotros sí podemos alegrarnos, porque, aunque no vivimos en tiempos de los profetas, sí vemos los frutos de su fe y de su predicación. En este "Domingo de Gaudete", recordamos que, por más oscuro que se ponga el mundo o el corazón humano, Dios nunca se da por vencido con nosotros. Él siempre nos busca, incluso en los desiertos fríos y difíciles de la vida. Así que alegrémonos y demos gracias, porque este es el día que hizo el Señor y es una maravilla para nosotros.

Como se habrán dado cuenta, nuestro Santuario y Centro parroquial están muy bonitos en esta temporada, y quiero agradecer de corazón a la Sociedad del Altar y a nuestro Consejo de Caballeros de Colón. Ellos se han encargado de decorar y de prepararnos para la Navidad. Si no lo han visto, pusimos luces alrededor del Santuario y en la cerca. De noche se ve precioso. También agradecemos a la familia Reynolds por montar nuestra Corona de Adviento. Es una alegría ver a tantas personas ayudando para que nuestra parroquia se vea festiva y llena de luz.

GOSPEL MEDITATION

IN THE GOSPEL PASSAGE...

In this Gospel passage, John the Baptist sends his disciples to ask Jesus if He is the one they have been waiting for. Despite his imprisonment, John continues his mission, pointing others to Christ. Jesus responds by pointing to His works, which fulfill the prophecies of healing and liberation. As modern-day disciples, we are called to recognize the presence of Jesus in our lives and the world around us. Are we able to see the signs of His love and mercy, or do we let doubt overshadow our faith? This Advent, let us renew our commitment to seeking Christ and trusting in His promise of salvation.

Reflection Question:

In what ways can you become more attuned to recognizing the signs of Jesus' presence in your daily life during this Advent season?

DID YOU KNOW....

DECEMBER 14TH IS...

The Third Sunday of Advent is traditionally known as "Gaudete Sunday." The name "Gaudete" comes from the Latin word for "rejoice," which is the first word of the entrance antiphon for the Mass of this day: "Gaudete in Domino semper" ("Rejoice in the Lord always"). This Sunday marks a shift in the Advent season from a more penitential mood to one of joy and anticipation of the Lord's coming.

A fascinating aspect of Gaudete Sunday is the use of rose-colored vestments, a deviation from the usual violet of Advent. This color symbolizes joy and represents a lightening of the mood, as Christmas draws nearer. It signifies that the time of preparation is more than halfway through and encourages the faithful to rejoice and have hope in the coming of the Lord.

Historically, this day has been associated with a sense of community and festivity within the Church, where the faithful would take a momentary break from penitential practices to celebrate the joy of the coming Savior. It serves as a reminder that, amidst the waiting and preparation, the promise of Christ's light and love is ever-present.

Did you know that Pope Leo I (c. 400–461) is credited with instituting the Advent season with its current form during his papacy? By emphasizing the joyful anticipation of this Sunday, the Church encourages all to focus on the hope and light that Jesus brings into the world.





ST. PHILOGONIUS OF ANTIOCH

Feast Day: December 20th

Who was he?

St. Philogonius was a special friend of Jesus who lived a long time ago, around the year 300. He was a bishop, which is like being a really important teacher in the Church. He helped lead the Church in a town called Antioch, which was big and important back then!

What did he do?

St. Philogonius was known for being very smart and brave. He spent a lot of time teaching people about Jesus and making sure that everyone learned the right things about Him. Some people were confused about who Jesus was, but St. Philogonius helped clear things up, like when you solve a tricky puzzle!

Why is he special?

ST. PHILOGONIUS OF ANTIOCH

Feast Day:

St. Philogonius of Antioch is commemorated on December 20th.

Patronage:

While specific patronage is not commonly attributed to St. Philogonius, he is revered as a model of pastoral care and a defender of orthodox faith.

Impact on the Church:

St. Philogonius was the bishop of Antioch during the early 4th century, a time marked by the Arian controversy. As a staunch defender of the Nicene Creed, he played a key role in upholding the orthodox teachings of the Church against Arianism, which denied the divinity of Christ.
