3RD SUNDAY OF EASTER

"Were not our hearts burning within us while he talked with us on the road?" (Luke 24:32)

"¿No ardía nuestro corazón mientras nos hablaba en el camino?" (Lucas 24:32)

Reflection:

In the story of the Road to Emmaus, two disciples journey in sadness, unable to recognize the risen Jesus walking with them. As He explains the Scriptures and breaks bread with them, their eyes are opened to His presence. This passage invites us to reflect on how Jesus walks with us in our daily lives, often unrecognized. Like the disciples, our hearts can burn with His truth when we open ourselves to His Word and presence in the sacraments. How often do we fail to recognize Jesus in our midst? Let us ask for the grace to see Him in our encounters and let our hearts be set aflame with His love.

Socratic Question:

How can you become more aware of Jesus' presence in your everyday life, letting His love guide your actions and decisions?

Reflexión:

En la historia del camino a Emaús, dos discípulos caminan tristes, sin reconocer al Jesús resucitado que va con ellos. Al explicarles las Escrituras y compartir el pan, sus ojos se abren a Su presencia. Este pasaje nos invita a reflexionar sobre cómo Jesús camina con nosotros en nuestra vida diaria, a menudo sin ser reconocido. Al igual que los discípulos, nuestros corazones pueden arder con Su verdad cuando nos abrimos a Su Palabra y presencia en los sacramentos. ¿Cuántas veces fallamos en reconocer a Jesús entre nosotros? Pidamos la gracia de verlo en nuestros encuentros y dejar que nuestros corazones se enciendan con Su amor.

Pregunta socrática:

¿Cómo puedes estar más consciente de la presencia de Jesús en tu vida diaria, dejando que Su amor guíe tus acciones y decisiones?

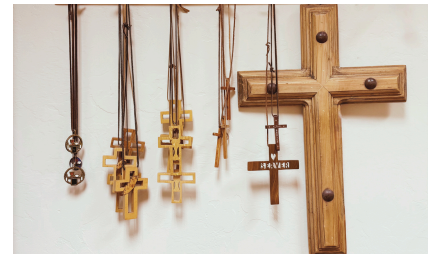

SEEING WITH NEW EYES: LIVING THE EMMAUS STORY TODAY

The story of the Road to Emmaus is not just about two disciples long ago.

It is about us.

Each of us is on a journey—
and Christ is walking with us.

✠ WHY DIDN'T THEY RECOGNIZE HIM?

The Gospel tells us:

“Their eyes were prevented from recognizing him.”

This raises an important question:

Why?

Because they were:

- Focused on disappointment
- Locked into their own expectations
- Unable to see beyond their grief



The same can happen to us.

We miss Christ's presence because:

- We are distracted
- We are discouraged
- We are focused on what we expected God to do

✠ CHRIST IS ALREADY THERE

The Emmaus story teaches us something essential:

Christ is already present—before we recognize Him.

- In our struggles
- In our conversations
- In our daily routines

We do not bring Christ into our lives—
we learn to notice Him already there.

✠ THE INVITATION: “STAY WITH US”

As evening approaches, the disciples say: *“Stay with us.”*

This simple invitation changes everything.

Faith grows when we invite Christ in:

- Into our homes
- Into our routines
- Into our struggles



A simple prayer — *“Lord, stay with me”* — can transform an ordinary day.

THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER

SEEING WITH NEW EYES: LIVING THE EMMAUS STORY TODAY CONT.

✠ THE EUCHARIST: WHERE WE SEE CLEARLY

It is in the breaking of the bread that their eyes are opened.

This is why the Eucharist is central to our faith.

In every Mass:

- Christ is truly present
- Christ is offered to us
- Christ is received by us



The same Jesus on the road to Emmaus is present on the altar.

✠ RETURNING WITH JOY

After recognizing Jesus, the disciples immediately return to Jerusalem.

Even though it is night.
Even though the journey is long.

Encounter leads to urgency.

When we truly encounter Christ:

- We want to share Him
- We want to return to community
- We want to witness to others



✠ A SIMPLE EMMAUS CHALLENGE

Live this Gospel this week:

Walk with Awareness
Pause and notice where God is present in your day

Listen to His Word
Read the daily Gospel and reflect for 5 minutes

Invite Him In
Pray: "Lord, stay with me"

Go and Share
Encourage someone in their faith



✠ CLOSING PRAYER

Lord Jesus, You walk beside me even when I do not see You. Open my eyes to recognize
Your presence in Scripture, in the Eucharist, and in my daily life.
Stay with me, Lord, and set my heart on fire with Your love.

GOSPEL MEDITATION

IN THE LUKE 24:13-35,

In the Gospel story of the Road to Emmaus, we find two disciples walking away from Jerusalem in the aftermath of Jesus' crucifixion. They are consumed by confusion and sorrow, unable to see that the risen Jesus is accompanying them. As He walks with them, Jesus explains the Scriptures, revealing how all the events point to Him. It is only when He breaks bread with them that their eyes are opened, and they recognize Him. This encounter encourages us to reflect on the ways Jesus is present in our lives, especially in moments of doubt and despair. Through the Word and the Eucharist, Jesus kindles a fire within our hearts, awakening us to His abiding presence and love.

Socratic Question:

In what ways can you invite Jesus to walk with you on your journey, allowing His Word and presence to transform your perspective and bring clarity to your life?

EN LUCAS 24:13-35,

A través de la Palabra y la Eucaristía, Jesús enciende un fuego en nuestros corazones, despertándonos a su presencia y amor constantes.

Pregunta Socrática en Español:

¿De qué maneras puedes invitar a Jesús a caminar contigo en tu jornada, permitiendo que Su Palabra y presencia transformen tu perspectiva y traigan claridad a tu vida?

DID YOU KNOW...

3RD SUNDAY OF EASTER

The Third Sunday of Easter, when we reflect on the Gospel story of the Road to Emmaus, traditionally emphasizes the importance of recognizing Jesus' presence in the breaking of the bread. This narrative from Luke 24:13-35 highlights the significance of the Eucharist as central to Christian worship and faith from the earliest days of the Church. This encounter with the risen Christ in the breaking of the bread prefigures the celebration of the Mass, where Catholics believe Jesus is truly present in the Eucharist.

Historical Significance:

Throughout history, this Gospel story has been reflected in Christian art, depicting the profound moment when the disciples' eyes are opened. The story has resonated deeply with the faithful as a call to awareness and recognition of Christ's presence in our midst, reinforcing the centrality of the Eucharist in our faith journey.

Reflection Question:

How does the Eucharist serve as a source of strength and clarity for you in recognizing Jesus' presence in your life?

This day serves to remind us of the transformative power of meeting Christ in the Eucharist, inviting Christians to be attentive to His presence and action in our lives and communities.

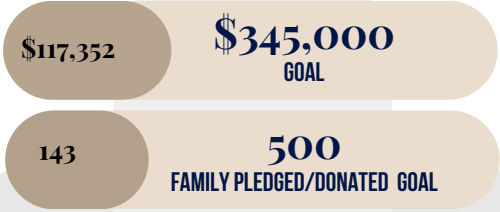

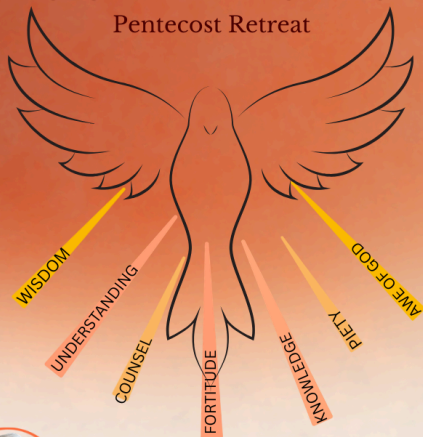

SAINT MARK, THE EVANGELIST

Feast Day: April 25th

Patronage:

Saint Mark is the patron saint of notaries, lawyers, Venice, and those seeking protection from storms.

Story: Saint Mark, also known as John Mark, was one of the four evangelists who authored the Gospel according to Mark. He was a companion of both Saint Peter and Saint Paul, working closely with these Apostles in the propagation of the early Church. Mark's Gospel is thought to be the first of the four Gospels written and is characterized by its straightforward and vivid narrative. Tradition holds that he founded the Church of Alexandria, one of the most significant early Christian communities.

According to tradition, Saint Mark was martyred in Alexandria, Egypt, where he had preached the Gospel. His symbol is the lion, representing the royal dignity of Christ as depicted in his Gospel.

Legacy: Saint Mark's Gospel offers a dynamic and immediate portrayal of Jesus' ministry and serves as a foundation for the other synoptic Gospels (Matthew and Luke). His witness to the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus has been instrumental in shaping Christian faith and teaching. The city of Venice holds a special devotion to Saint Mark, home to the Basilica di San Marco, where his relics are enshrined. His legacy is a testament to the power of evangelization and the written word in spreading the message of Christ.

Reflection Question: How does the example and Gospel of Saint Mark inspire you to share the story of Jesus with others in your own life?

Feast Day: April 25th

Who He Helps:

Saint Mark is the special friend of people who work in writing and law, like notaries and lawyers, and he also looks out for the city of Venice and is prayed to for protection from storms.

Story:

Saint Mark was one of the first people to write down the story of Jesus' life, death, and resurrection, which we know as the Gospel according to Mark. He was friends with some of Jesus' closest followers, like Peter and Paul, and helped them spread the Good News about Jesus. Mark's story of Jesus is full of action and shows how wonderful Jesus is. People believe he started one of the first big Christian communities in a place called Alexandria, in Egypt.

Saint Mark is remembered as being very brave because he kept sharing Jesus' story even when it was hard, and that's why he's called an evangelist. He worked to tell everyone about Jesus in exciting and powerful ways.

Why He's Important:

Saint Mark's Gospel gives us one of the very first looks at who Jesus was and what He did. His story helps us learn about Jesus' love and miracles. Many people look up to Saint Mark because he helped make sure that the story of Jesus was written down for everyone to read, even today.

How can you be like Saint Mark and share the story of Jesus with your friends and family?
