“Let the peace of Christ control your hearts; Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly.” (Colossians 3:15a,16a)

Dear Parish Family and Friends,

Merry Christmas! While we celebrated Christmas a few short days ago, we are within the Octave of Christmas. Our readings today focus on the domestic church as a matter of great importance. Our texts highlight the importance of family life and the responsibilities of each member. To apply these teachings in our daily lives, I would like to offer some concrete family advice this week. Consider setting aside an evening for a family prayer session where each member expresses gratitude for one another and praises God for their blessings. You might also include writing a family prayer intention journal, where each member can contribute their prayer requests for the week. Another suggestion is to share a passage from the Bible that resonates with your family over dinner and discuss how it relates to your lives. To engage children, you could organize a treasure hunt with clues based on Bible verses that lead to a small family treat. Finally, try dedicating a day to acts of kindness among your family members to strengthen your bond. One act of kindness could include making homemade gifts or cooking a favorite meal together. Our families in the modern era could use some loving advice on what it takes to make a family noble, virtuous, and holy.

For a family to be successful, at least from a biblical, religious, and spiritual perspective, it traditionally includes a father, a mother, and children. However, it's essential to recognise that all families, regardless of their structure, are valuable and can strive for holiness. This inclusivity respects the diverse family forms present in our world today. While many family variants exist, it is essential to acknowledge the plan God had created and desired from the beginning of creation.

Our texts show how fathers are to treat their wives and children with respect and love. The first reading from Sirach explains how fathers are to exercise their priestly and fatherly love toward their family. This collective care and love for children teaching them right from wrong, creates a strong society. Moreover, it shows how wives collaborate with their husbands in creating and raising holy children. While it is a reality that our families suffer significantly due to social media, higher education, government, and the perverse world of pornography, we see hope and the opportunity to turn things around by listening to the sound advice of the scriptural texts in today's Mass readings. St. Joseph, terror of demons, pray for us!

I wish to thank all who made our Christmas celebrations beautiful and prayerful! To all our liturgical ministers, our altar servers, lectors, ushers, sacristans, choir members, and our parish altar society who worked tirelessly to decorate, thank you for all your love and care during the Advent and Christmas Season! May the joy and peace of this season fill your hearts with happiness and hope. Heavenly Father, bless all families with Your love and grace. Guide them in unity and understanding as they journey together in faith. We pray for Your continued guidance and blessings upon our parish community. Amen.

Querida familia parroquial y amigos:

¡Feliz Navidad! Aunque celebramos la Navidad hace apenas unos días, aún nos encontramos en la Octava de Navidad. Las lecturas de hoy ponen especial énfasis en la iglesia doméstica, subrayando la gran importancia de la vida familiar y las responsabilidades de cada uno de sus miembros. Para poner en práctica estas enseñanzas en nuestra vida diaria, quisiera ofrecer esta semana algunos consejos concretos para las familias. Consideren apartar una noche para la oración en familia, en la que cada miembro exprese su gratitud por los demás y alabe a Dios por sus bendiciones. También pueden iniciar un cuaderno de intenciones familiares, en el que cada uno escriba sus peticiones de oración para la semana. Otra idea es compartir durante la cena un pasaje de la Biblia que resuene con su familia y conversar sobre cómo se relaciona con su vida diaria. Para involucrar a los niños, podrían organizar una búsqueda del tesoro con pistas basadas en versículos bíblicos que los lleven a un pequeño premio familiar. Finalmente, intenten dedicar un día a realizar actos de bondad entre los miembros de la familia para fortalecer sus lazos. Un acto de bondad puede ser preparar juntos un platillo favorito o hacer regalos hechos en casa. Las familias de nuestro tiempo necesitan con urgencia consejos llenos de amor sobre cómo llegar a ser familias nobles, virtuosas y santas.

Desde una perspectiva bíblica, religiosa y espiritual, tradicionalmente hablamos de una familia formada por un padre, una madre y los hijos. Sin embargo, es importante reconocer que todas las familias, independientemente de su estructura, tienen valor y pueden aspirar a la santidad. Esta visión inclusiva respeta la diversidad de formas familiares presentes en nuestro mundo actual. Aun así, es esencial reconocer el plan que Dios creó y deseó desde el inicio de la creación.

Nuestros textos nos muestran cómo los padres están llamados a tratar a sus esposas e hijos con respeto y amor. La primera lectura del libro del Eclesiástico explica cómo los padres deben ejercer su amor sacerdotal y paternal en la familia. Este cuidado y amor compartido, al enseñar a los hijos qué es bien y qué es malo, ayuda a construir una sociedad fuerte. Asimismo, se nos muestra cómo las esposas colaboran con sus esposos en la formación y crianza de hijos santos. Aunque es una realidad que muchas familias sufren hoy en día a causa de las redes sociales, la educación superior, el gobierno y el mundo perverso de la pornografía, también vemos esperanza y la oportunidad de cambiar el rumbo al escuchar los sabios consejos de las Escrituras proclamadas en la Misa de hoy. San José, terror de los demonios, ruega por nosotros.

Quiero agradecer de corazón a todos los que hicieron que nuestras celebraciones navideñas fueran tan hermosas y llenas de oración. A todos nuestros ministros litúrgicos: monaguillos, lectores, ujieres, sacristanes, miembros del coro y a nuestra sociedad del altar parroquial, que trabajaron incansablemente para decorar, gracias por todo su amor y dedicación durante el tiempo de Adviento y Navidad! Que la alegría y la paz de esta temporada llenen sus corazones de esperanza y felicidad. Padre Celestial, bendice a todas las familias con tu amor y tu gracia. Guíalas en la unidad y en el entendimiento mientras caminan juntas en la fe. Te pedimos tu continua guía y bendiciones para nuestra comunidad parroquial. Amén.

IN THE GOSPEL PASSAGE...

The Gospel of Matthew recounts Herod's brutal attempt to eliminate the newborn King by ordering the massacre of innocent children. This harrowing event draws us to contemplate the fragility of life and the immense suffering caused by human sinfulness. Yet, within this darkness shines the abiding presence of God, who safeguards His divine plan through the Holy Family's flight to Egypt. This narrative calls us to be vigilant protectors of the vulnerable, echoing God's love and compassion in our world today.

Reflection Question:

How can we, in our lives today, actively protect and defend the dignity of those who are most vulnerable?

DID YOU KNOW....

DECEMBER 28TH IS...

Notable for being the Feast of the Holy Innocents, also known as Childermas. This day commemorates the tragic massacre of young male children in Bethlehem, ordered by King Herod in his attempt to kill the newborn Jesus, whom he saw as a threat to his throne. This event is recorded in the Gospel of Matthew and reflects the ancient fulfillment of prophecy as these innocent children are seen as the first martyrs for Christ.

In medieval England, the Feast of the Holy Innocents was considered a day of mourning and misfortune. It was even said to be a day when no new undertakings should begin, as it carried a sense of bad luck. Historically, the Feast of the Holy Innocents served as a sobering reminder of the darkness that can engulf humanity, but it also highlighted the light of Christ that conquers all forms of evil. In many cultures, this day has inspired acts of charity, reflection on the sanctity of human life, and increased commitments to protecting those who are vulnerable.

How does reflecting on historical events like the massacre of the Holy Innocents inspire you to act with greater empathy and justice in today's world?

SAINT BASIL THE GREAT

Feast Day:
January 2nd

Who Was He?

Saint Basil the Great is known for helping people who work in hospitals and for anyone who does kind deeds for others. He loved helping the poor and sick very much!

What Did He Do?

Saint Basil was born a long time ago, around the year 330, in a place called Cappadocia, which is now in Turkey. He came from a big family that loved Jesus. Basil studied very hard in school and even traveled to learn more. He made a great friend named Gregory who also loved God. Basil decided he didn't just want to learn things; he wanted to live like Jesus, helping others. He started a community where people worked together, prayed, and helped the needy. As a leader in the church, he often spoke about how important it is to believe that Jesus is truly God. He also built hospitals and places to care for people who were sick or poor.

Why Is He Special?

Saint Basil didn't just talk about being good — he showed it by his actions! He wrote many books that help people understand God better, and he started things like hospitals to help those in need. Because of him, many people learned how to live together, pray, and share everything with each other.

Question to Ponder:

How can you show kindness to someone in need today, just like Saint Basil did?

Patronage:

Saint Basil the Great is the patron saint of hospital administrators and those who provide charitable works. His dedication to serving the poor and establishing institutions of care exemplifies his commitment to social justice and compassion.

Story:

Born around 330 AD in Caesarea, Cappadocia, St. Basil grew up in a family renowned for their Christian faith. He pursued an extensive education in Constantinople and Athens, where he formed a lifelong friendship with St. Gregory of Nazianzus. Basil initially practiced law and rhetoric but was profoundly affected by the monastic tradition he encountered. Inspired, he established a monastic community focused on communal living, prayer, and manual labor. As Bishop of Caesarea, Basil fervently defended the Nicene Creed against Arianism and was a prolific writer who helped shape Christian theology. His tireless efforts to organize charitable institutions, including hospitals and hospices, reflect his deep compassion and commitment to the marginalized.

Legacy:

St. Basil's influence extends far beyond his lifetime through his foundational contributions to monasticism and theology. His writings, particularly on the Holy Spirit and monastic discipline, remain significant in both Eastern and Western Christian traditions. His establishment of charitable works laid the groundwork for future Christian social services, showcasing his vision of faith in action.
