Dear Parish Family and Friends,

As we enter the Season of Advent, we enter a time of expectation and hope. While Advent is a penitential season, we reflect on the second coming of Jesus Christ in the here and now.



VOLUNTEER OF THE WEEK

MEET CAROL McCARTNEY

When one of our readers sent me a note saying:

"I would like to nominate Carol McCartney for volunteer of the week. She is a wonderful catechist preparing our little ones for their 1st Holy Communion and reconciliation. She works so hard and puts her whole heart into faithfully forming our parish kids." ~ anonymous

I instantly knew I needed to interview her. Please enjoy. ~ *Kathy Lockard, St. Rita Bulletin Editor*

Which ministry do you serve? I am a Catechist for the 2nd-grade Sacraments Class. I am also an Usher and a Eucharistic minister

How long have you been serving at our parish? I have been serving at St Rita's Parish since 2014. I first volunteered with St Vincent De Paul. I began as a Catechist assistant in 2019. This is my third year as a Catechist, teaching the class myself.

What first inspired you to volunteer? The reasons I volunteer: because I believe God wants our hearts, souls, and hands. It is important to make Parish life an integral part of everyday life. It is a great way to meet other parishioners, to have an investment in the Church, and to serve God. The Church becomes a real family when you are involved in Church life.

What does volunteering mean to you personally? Volunteering in the Church helps to nourish my soul and brings me closer to God. It lights up my life, and helps me have a better perspective of what is important. My husband is disabled and has many health issues. It is so easy to feel weighed down by challenges. Volunteering helps me be a loving caregiver for my husband. Also, I find it very fulfilling to help children learn about God and prepare for their First Confession and First Holy Communion.

How has serving impacted your faith or spiritual life? I have learned so much about my faith while teaching the Children. Although teaching children was not something I ever thought I would or could do, the Holy Spirit had a plan. Mary Ann Cleveland brought me into her classroom as her assistant in 2019. When she moved in 2023, I took over her class. This is the strongest calling I have ever felt, and the work of the Holy Spirit, as I teach, has been very evident to me. I could not teach on my own. I pray before each class that the Holy Spirit will put the right words in my mouth. It's hard to express how much I love teaching the children about God and His loving plan for us all. I feel closer to my faith and God since becoming a Catechist.

What is your favorite part of serving in this ministry? My favorite thing is seeing the Children make their First Holy Communion. To see them receive Jesus, Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity.

How has this ministry blessed you or your family? Being a Catechist has made me want to be as good a Catholic as I teach the kids to be. Since I started teaching, I pray more and am always conscious of the fact that all I do is an example for my students.

What skills or gifts do you feel God has called you to use here? I love finding creative ways to help the Children learn and remember God's plan of salvation for us all. For instance, I went to the Holy Land in 2020. During class I show the children pictures that I took at the places we are learning about in class. They are amazed when they see that there are physical places where the stories of the Life of Jesus can be seen and visited now. It makes it more real to them.

Can you share a meaningful or memorable moment from your service? A memorable moment for me was when I got a student in my class who had an older brother I had taught the year before. I asked the older brother, "What did you tell your little brother about my class?" He answered, "I told him, 'You are going to learn a LOT!' That filled my heart with joy.

What has been the biggest challenge, and how has God helped you through it? The biggest challenge is balancing the time I spend as a Catechist versus the time needed to care for my husband and our household. I always pray to God for guidance, and things always seem to work out.

What would you say to someone thinking about volunteering? If you are thinking of volunteering, pray to the Holy Spirit. Someone once said, "Volunteering shouldn't be hard. Once you find what God wants you to do, it will be easy, something you love." I have found that to be true. You may have to try several things to figure out what that calling is, but it is worth it. You will have more friends, and your problems will seem farther away. You will feel closer to God. It is very fulfilling. You will benefit in ways you can't imagine. Of course, it benefits the Church as well. Just do it!

How do you see God working through the ministry you're part of? God blessed us with a priest who wants to give our children the best Catholic education possible as a parish. The Curriculum we use is the Word of Life by the Augustin Institute. I believe God had his hand in the development of this program. It is amazing, and I think the students learn the Catholic Faith in a way that will "stick". Father Alonzo also provides "Formed" to all parishioners. There are so many ways to learn about the Catholic Faith these days. I see it as the Holy Spirit hard at work, not just in Religious education, but in the whole world. Through social media, the world can truly know God.

What hopes do you have for the ministry's future? Wonderfully, our Church is growing with many new families and new Catholics. The census is expected to increase a lot in the next few years. We are at capacity for our classrooms. We will be needing more space, and more importantly, volunteers who feel a calling to help our children learn the true, authentic Catholic faith. I pray we have all we need to keep up with our expanding Church.

Is there a particular prayer intention you would like to share? My personal prayer intention is that my husband's pain and health issues will resolve and that I can continue teaching for many more years.



Feast Day: December 3

Who Was St. Francis Xavier?

St. Francis Xavier was one of Jesus' special helpers known as a missionary. He traveled to faraway places to tell people about God's love and Jesus' life. Born in Spain in 1506, Francis was a friend of St. Ignatius of Loyola and helped start a special group called the Jesuits. This group loves sharing stories about Jesus and helping others.

SAINT FRANCIS XAVIER

Feast Day: December 3

Patronage: Missionaries, Mission Territories, The Apostleship of Prayer, & Navarre, Spain

St. Francis Xavier, one of the most renowned missionaries in the history of the Church, played a pivotal role in the spread of Christianity across Asia during the 16th century. Born in 1506 in the Kingdom of Navarre (now part of Spain), Francis Xavier was initially a promising young scholar and athlete at the University of Paris. There, he met St. Ignatius of Loyola, a friendship that would profoundly change his life and lead to the founding of the Society of Jesus, commonly known as the Jesuits.

Missionary Journeys and Impact:

Driven by an unwavering zeal to bring the message of Christ to non-Christian lands, Francis Xavier embarked on extensive missionary journeys. He first traveled to India in 1541, where he worked tirelessly to minister to the Portuguese settlers and local populations.
