# **SOLEMNITY OF ALL SOULS**

"And this is the will of the one who sent me, that I should not lose anything of what he gave me, but that I should raise it on the last day."

Reflection: On All Souls Day, we find comfort in Jesus' promise of eternal life. The Gospel reveals God's will — the salvation of all souls. Jesus assures us that He will not lose anyone entrusted to Him, highlighting the profound hope and mercy offered to every believer. In remembering our departed loved ones, we rest in the assurance that Jesus will raise them up on the last day. As we pray for souls, let us renew our faith in Christ, who is the Resurrection and the Life, and live with the hope of one day being reunited in His glory.

Oueridos familiares y amigos de la parroquia,

Dear Parish Family and Friends,

# **SOLEMNITY OF ALL SOULS DAY**

FEAST DAY: NOVEMBER 2

All Souls' Day is a day when Catholics pray for the souls of the dead. It is celebrated on November 2 every year. On this day, we remember those who have died, especially those in Purgatory. We pray that God will help them on their journey to Heaven.

The Catholic Church teaches that Purgatory is a place where souls are purified before entering Heaven. Some souls are not ready to enter Heaven right after death. Our prayers can help them. This is why All Souls' Day is important.

On All Souls' Day, Catholics often go to Mass and pray for the dead. Many visit cemeteries to pray for their loved ones who have died. The Church encourages us to pray for all the souls in Purgatory, not just our own family or friends.

All Souls' Day is different from All Saints' Day, which is the day before. All Saints' Day honors all the saints in Heaven. All Souls' Day focuses on helping those still waiting to enter Heaven. Both days remind us of the hope we have in eternal life

# IN THE GOSPEL PASSAGE...

Jesus articulates a promise and a mission entrusted to Him by the Father: "I should not lose anything of what he gave me, but that I should raise it on the last day." Here, we are invited into the profound mystery of divine love and the assurance of eternal life. This promise is not merely about our physical resurrection; it is an invitation to a relationship with God that transcends death itself.

Picture Jesus speaking these words, filled with compassion and certainty. His mission is not only to redeem but to gather and protect. His love is active and personal, reaching out to each soul to ensure none is lost. In our moments of doubt or sorrow, especially when grieving the loss of loved ones, this promise becomes our anchor: we are known, loved, and destined for eternal union with God.

As you meditate, consider the vastness of God's mercy and the hope offered through Christ's resurrection. Reflect on the reality that our departed loved ones are embraced in this divine promise. We are connected to them through the Communion of Saints, a bond strengthened by our prayers and sacrifices offered for their purification.

In moments of silence, let this truth resonate: we are beneficiaries of a love that conquers death and promises eternal life. Allow this meditation to lead you in prayer, entrusting your own journey and the souls of the departed to the care of our Savior, who never abandons what the Father has given Him.

How can embracing the promise of resurrection transform your approach to life and the way you remember and pray for those who have gone before us?

Reflect on this truth, and remember to keep your loved ones in your prayers, especially on this sacred day.

# **DID YOU KNOW...**

# **ORIGINS**

All Souls Day traces its origins to the early Christian tradition of praying for the deceased. The practice became formally recognized in the Church in the early Middle Ages. The Benedictine monastery of Cluny in France, under the leadership of Saint Odilo. established November 2nd as a day for remembering all the faithful departed in 998 AD.

# **CULTURAL TRADITIONS**

Various cultures have incorporated unique traditions. For instance, in Mexico. Día de los Muertos (Day of the Dead) combines Catholic and indigenous practices to celebrate and remember the deceased with altars, offerings, and vibrant festivities.



# LITURGICAL PRACTICES

Priests are allowed to celebrate three Masses on All Souls Day, a privilege granted to pray efficaciously for the departed. This underscores the day's emphasis on the power of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass in aiding souls.

# **CONNECTIONS**

All Souls Day directly follows All Saints Day, celebrated on November 1st. While All Saints Day honors those who have attained Heaven, All Souls Day is dedicated to praying for souls in Purgatory, helping them on their journey to Heaven.

# THEOLOGICAL FOUNDATION

The day rests upon the Church's belief in the Communion of Saints, which encompasses the Church Militant (those on Earth), the Church Suffering (souls in Purgatory), and the Church Triumphant (saints in Heaven). Our prayers aid these souls, reflecting the solidarity and love we share as members of the Mystical Body of Christ.

Understanding these elements enhances our appreciation of All Souls Day as a profound expression of love and hope, uniting us with our deceased brothers and sisters through prayer.



Saint Martin de Porres is remembered for his kindness, his care for the poor, and his deep love for God. He was born in Lima, Peru, and lived there his whole life. He is known for his healing gifts and for helping people who were often left out. He is sometimes called "Martin of Charity."

Martin was a lay brother in the Dominican Order. He was not a priest, but he gave his life to prayer and service. He worked in the kitchen, the laundry, and the infirmary. He also cared for the sick outside the monastery. He gave food and medicine to anyone in need.

Many people came to him for help. He helped people of all races and backgrounds. He also cared for animals and treated them kindly. He lived a very simple life and gave away what little he had.

Today, people remember Martin de Porres as a saint who showed love through action. He is an example of how to serve others with humility. He reminds us that anyone can be holy, no matter where they come from or what job they have.

# A Boy with a simple beginning

Martin was born in Lima, Peru, in 1579. His mother was a Black woman from Panama. His father was a Spanish man. His parents were not married, and his father left when Martin was very young. He grew up in poverty with his mother and younger sister.

Because he was of mixed race, many people looked down on him. At that time, people of African or Indigenous background were often treated unfairly. Martin had to deal with this from a young age. But he did not grow bitter. He stayed kind and patient.

Martin learned skills from a young age. He became a barber and learned how to cut hair and care for the sick. He picked up basic medicine and often helped people who could not afford a doctor. Even as a boy, he gave food and care to the poor.

He prayed often and trusted God. Even when others treated him badly, he stayed faithful. He did not fight back. Instead, he served others with quiet love. His faith was strong even in hard times.

#### A humble brother who served all

Martin wanted to join the Dominicans, but because of his race, he could not become a full member at first. So he joined as a servant and worked in the monastery doing simple tasks. Later, he was allowed to become a lay brother. He never asked for honor or power. He only wanted to serve.

In the monastery, he worked in the infirmary. He cared for the sick and the dying. He cleaned wounds, made herbal medicine, and comforted people in pain. He treated everyone the same, rich or poor, Black or white.

He also worked in the kitchen and cleaned the floors. He did these jobs with joy. He did not complain. He believed all work could be done for God. He saw Jesus in every person he helped.

People in Lima started hearing about him. They came to the monastery to ask for his help. Some wanted medicine. Others just wanted someone to listen to them. Martin welcomed them all. He gave what he had, even if it was very little.

#### Miracles and Mercy in Everyday Life

Martin was known for many miracles. People said he could heal sicknesses with a simple touch or prayer. Some said he could be in two places at once. Others said he fed many people with just a small amount of food.

He also loved animals. There are stories about him caring for stray dogs, cats, and even mice. He fed them and made sure they were not hurt. He saw all creatures as part of God's creation.

He fasted often and lived very simply. He gave away most of what he had. He spent long hours in prayer, sometimes all night. He did not seek praise. He only wanted to love God and serve others. His example touched many people. Other monks respected him, even those who once looked down on him. People in the city came to see him as a holy man. He showed that faith is lived out through service, prayer, and love.

#### From Servant to Saint

Martin de Porres died in 1639. Many people came to honor him at his death. They shared stories of his kindness and healing. They believed he was close to God.

The Church began the process for sainthood many years later. He was beatified by Pope Gregory XVI in 1837. He was canonized as a saint by Pope John XXIII in 1962. He was the first Black saint from the Americas.

His feast day is November 3. He is the patron saint of mixed-race people, barbers, healthcare workers, and those who seek racial harmony. Many schools, hospitals, and churches are named after him.




