The Joint PD Fund, The Ins and Outs



Since I have become President of the Association, I have answered various questions about the Joint Professional Development Fund. In this article, I will attempt to answer some of the questions asked.

Why is the Joint PD Fund so important?

The Joint PD Fund is important because it is one way to ensure that a teacher can attend autonomous professional development.

Why is autonomous professional development important?

Autonomous professional development is important because it creates the opportunity for you to take ownership of your own professional development. It empowers you to actively identify your strengths and weaknesses and aspirations and enable you to increase learning experiences tailored to your specific needs. When you make decisions about your own professional development, you create a growth mindset, and foster a culture of continuous improvement and innovation. More importantly, autonomy in PD creates a sense of accountability and self-reliance as you seek out new opportunities to grow.

How can I apply?

Who approves the application?

Joint PD applications are submitted to the BTA office and reviewed by the Joint PD committee. The Committee consists of the BTA President, BTA Professional Development Chairperson(s), a BTA CoSL representative, BSD Superintendent / CEO (or designate) and one BSD Assistant Superintendent.

How much can I apply for?

- Level 1 funding, up to \$1000 can be accessed up to twice each year.
- Level 2 funding, up to \$3000, can be accessed once every three years.
- Level 3 funding, up to \$750, is available for substitute members.

What can I claim as part of my professional development costs?

Successful applicants can be reimbursed for all costs related to their attendance of the professional development opportunity including, hotels, transportation, meals, registration, and substitute costs. Substitute costs are not calculated as part of the application amounts.

When do I get reimbursed?

After attending the PD session, applicants will submit: (within 3 months of the completion of the PD event) their report on the session, completed expense report, receipts for expenses, and credit card statements showing expenses incurred in US funds.

Processing reimbursements may take up to two weeks. Reimbursements will not be processed during summer months.

I heard that there are limited funds left for the 2023-2024 school year. Can I still apply?

Yes, but due to the fact that there are limited funds available, teachers may wish to apply for their PD of choice for next year. Applications for the 2024-2025 school year are being accepted. The fiscal year for the PD fund is July 1, so any applications for the summer months will be considered in the 2024-2025 budgeted year.

Joint PD Fund

Apply today for up to \$3000 to attend the PD of your choice!

Three levels of funding:

Level 1 Funding

Up to \$1,000.00 each year to attend PD events. This is great for local or virtual events.

Level 2 Funding

Up to \$3000.00 once every three years to attend PD. Level 2 will cover PD events which involve extended travel or larger registration costs.

Level 3 Funding

For Substitute Teachers up to \$700.00 once each year to attend PD.

Application Process:

- √ Step 1 Find a PD Event you would like to attend.
- ✓ <u>Step 2</u> Complete the application form including: a cover letter, conference registration form and conference brochure. Forms can be found under "Docs" at:

√ <u>Step 3</u> – Submit your form to <u>office@bta.mbteach.org</u>

There are 6 opportunities throughout the year to <u>submit an application</u> to the fund. The committee will review your application at their next meeting and be in touch.




