

Statements required in notice if the proposed tax rate exceeds the no-new-revenue tax rate but does not exceed the voter-approval tax rate, as prescribed by Tax Code §§26.06(b-2).

NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING ON TAX INCREASE

This notice only applies to a taxing unit other than a special taxing unit or municipality with a population of less than 30,000, regardless of whether it is a special taxing unit.

PROPOSED TAX RATE: \$0.399900 per \$100

NO-NEW-REVENUE TAX RATE: \$0.327927 per \$100

VOTER-APPROVAL TAX RATE: \$0.444146 per \$100

The no-new-revenue tax rate is the tax rate for the 2025 tax year that will raise the same amount of property tax revenue for Hays County from the same properties in both the 2024 tax year and the 2025 tax year.

The voter-approval tax rate is the highest tax rate that Hays County may adopt without holding an election to seek voter approval of the rate.

The proposed tax rate is greater than the no-new-revenue tax rate. This means that Hays County is proposing to increase property taxes for the 2025 tax year.

A PUBLIC HEARING ON THE PROPOSED TAX RATE WILL BE HELD ON 09/02/2025 01:00 PM (CT) at HAYS COUNTY HISTORIC COURTHOUSE, 111 E. SAN ANTONIO STREET, SAN MARCOS, TX

The proposed tax rate is not greater than the voter-approval tax rate. As a result, Hays County is not required to hold an election at which voters may accept or reject the proposed tax rate. However, you may express your support for or opposition to the proposed tax rate by contacting the members of the HAYS COUNTY COMMISSIONERS COURT of Hays County at their offices or by attending the public hearing mentioned above.

No-New-Revenue Maintenance and Operations Rate Adjustments

Indigent Health Care Compensation Expenditures (counties)

The Hays County spent \$6,285,400 from July 1 2024 to June 30 2025 on indigent health care compensation procedures at the increased minimum eligibility standards, less the amount of state assistance. For current tax year, the amount of increase above last year's enhanced indigent health care expenditures is \$-81,636. (amount of increase) This increased the no-new-revenue

maintenance and operations rate by 0.000000 /\$100.

Indigent Defense Compensation Expenditures (counties)

The Hays County spent \$4,348,447 from July 1 2024 to June 30 2025 to provide appointed counsel for indigent individuals in criminal or civil proceedings in accordance with the schedule of fees adopted under Article 26.05, Code of Criminal Procedure, less the amount of any state grants received. For current tax year, the amount of increase above last year's enhanced indigent defense compensation expenditures is \$-433,144. This increased the no-new-revenue maintenance and operations rate by 0.000000/\$100.
