#### FROM MY DESK ....

### What a Man thinks about on his birthday

The eminent mid-20th century rabbi, Abba Hillel Silver, delivered a sermon titled, What a Man Thinks About on His Birthday. I read it many years ago, so I do not remember the specifics of his sermon. But I have never forgotten the title, and it seems appropriate, as I face a "milestone" birthday, to borrow it. For the majority of humanity, three emotions characterize everyone's life- regrets, satisfactions, and hopes. The poet Robert Frost, in "The Road Not taken" speaks of his regrets. "Two roads diverged in a yellow wood, And sorry I could not travel both.....

Life is filled with choices, and we must decide which we will take, and which must be left for a later time. We choose a particular path, for we believe it has "the better claim...". Yet, after we have walked down that path, we often find that, "for the passing, Had worn them really about the same"....

Frost has taken a look at his life, and apparently concluded that, even had he chosen the other path, his life would not have been that much different. So, there's no need for regret, he seems to suggest. Yet, he isn't absolutely certain. He keeps the first path (apparently the one he did not take) in mind:

"Oh, I kept the first for another day!

Yet knowing how way leads on to way,

I doubted if I should ever come back."

Frost admits his sadness that he may never have the chance to return to that first path. Perhaps he has some regrets, after all.

Over the years, I have met a number of people who acknowledged that they harbor regrets. Some said they were pressured into taking a certain path because their parents expected it of them, or, they weren't sure that their own career plans would be successful, so they squelched their dreams for a path with "better claims". I can sympathize with them. I began my post-college journey engaged in work that others claimed would yield great success. I eventually realized such work would not bring me satisfaction. I was most fortunate to leave that path, and return to that "first for another day". That change allowed me to pursue two of my dreams: To become a rabbi, and to sing professionally.

I managed to do both, and credit my dear wife, Marsha, with her frequent and enthusiastic encouragement. Because of her optimism and enthusiastic support, I took that other path, and reduced rocky obstacles that surely would have become treacherous mountains, had I walked yet another mile down the wrong path. Another great American poet, Henry David Thoreau, put it well. "The mass of men lead lives of quiet desperation. What is called resignation is confirmed desperation...."

I, too, faced desperation in my youth. Remaining on the "approved path" caused me great anxiety. I knew that, sooner, rather than later, I would have to make a change. Because of my encounter with desperation, I have tried to become more sympathetic to those who experience this serious life crisis.

And, my happiness grows as I watch them develop greater and stronger bonds with the Jewish people. Marsha and I have devoted our lives to Jewish values, and together, we raised boys who highly value their own connection to those values, and, their own contributions to the Jewish people. In this regard, my satisfactions are, thankfully, great. And, I think of the advice of our sages of blessed memory, who highly elevated the position of teacher. "Raise up many disciples'. I certainly have had the pleasure of teaching many hundreds of teenagers and adults during my life (another personal benefit of my switching careers). When I see those people who have strengthened their ties with Judaism and the Jewish people, I realize how satisfying a life as a teacher has been for me. One more reason to face my upcoming birthday with satisfaction.

Finally, hope. Hope is an indispensable ingredient to living a meaningful life. Like every other man, I hope that G-d will grant me and my loved ones many more years of health so that we can enjoy each other's company. I also look forward to more productive years (G-d willing); to continue joining in, and contributing to the building up of my Jewish community, for many years to come. My hope and prayer is that on this birthday, I recognize all the important work that is yet to be done on behalf of my people, and that G-d will grant me the health and strength equal to the task.

I wish all of my friends many more birthday celebrations filled with few regrets, many satisfactions, and bright hopes to fuel a productive future.


