From my desk-

Haman-Khameni and Persia-Iran, Purim 5784

There is one regional power that has encouraged and financed the terror organization Hamas (and several others like it)- Iran. "Hamas uses the Lebanon-based money exchange company Nabil Chouman & Co (Chouman) to transfer money from Iran to Gaza. For several years, the company has served as a conduit for transferring funds to Hamas, transferring tens of millions of dollars to the terrorist organization."

Iran should be on our minds, especially now, as we celebrate the holiday of Purim. The events surrounding the holiday took place in ancient Iran, known then as Persia. Persia's top royal advisor advised the King that he would be better off without Jews in his kingdom. With the king's blessing, the advisor prepared his venal plan to eliminate every Jew in the empire. Only the intervention of the Queen -herself a quiet Jew - saved the Jewish community, and thereby created the holiday of Purim.

This series of events from 2400 years ago resonates thunderously today. All that we are lacking is a Jewish queen who might bring about the downfall of the current Iranian regime. That is why we - the Jewish people as a whole - must act together to support the one regional power that is facing down Iran. Israel must be at the forefront of our daily thoughts and actions.

I worry that too many American Jews enjoy the comfort and relative safety of American life and tend to forget the threat that Iran poses. We run the risk of relegating Purim to the status of a cute child's holiday, ignoring its political message for adults. If ever there was a time to take Purim seriously, it is this year. Purim is, among other things, a call for a Jewish political rally, identifying a modern terrorist state, whose leaders are obsessed with wiping out Jews- worldwide.

I ask you to do two things. First, please frequent websites like aipac.org, miryaminstitute.org, and memri.org. All of us must be well informed about Iran and its export of terrorism around the globe. No one should be under any illusions that Iran, Hamas, and other terrorist organizations exempt American Jewry from




