From My Desk-

On the importance of minyanim

At the most recent Rabbis Roundtable with my colleague Rabbi Courtney Berman, and Federation representatives Bonnie Burdman, Melissa Bateman and Nicholas Bush, the subject of minyanim came up. In fact, a similar subject had come up a week earlier at our most recent TEE Board meeting.

The heart of the issue is that when a community member needs a minyan, such as during shiva week, it hasn't been easy to arrange a minyan for mourners both morning and evening at their homes. In fairness, most mourners, especially in recent years, don't feel the need to have a minyan at their homes both morning and night, and, sometimes, don't feel the need for a minyan even beyond the first three days of shiva. I do not say this to insult anyone. Rather, my colleagues and I have noted that most congregants prefer to have a minyan either for 5 or 6 weekday evenings (services are not conducted in shiva homes on Friday eve), or fewer, if they are not observing the full shiva. But, there are a few, who, should the need arise, would want to hold services at home twice a day, for the full week of shiva.

A related matter came up at our TEE Board meeting. Perhaps, it was suggested, we could hold a once-a-week daily minyan in our chapel in addition to our zoom minyanim on Monday and Thursday evenings.

A few thoughts about both matters. First, providing a minyan for mourners is an important and positive mitzvah. While I know of no fool-proof way of guaranteeing a minyan every time we wish for one, I certainly support the idea that our congregation pitch in to help mourners as much as we can. That is why I write this particular article. It is important to remember the vital role we all play in remaining a caring community. One of the most important ways we can do so is by making the effort to be present at a minyan during shiva. To the credit of our community, many of you already attend shiva minyanim. Thank you for your caring and compassion. I

encourage all of our members to "just show up" at the time called for minyan in a mourner's home. You don't have to know the mourner well. You don't have to make "small talk" (more on proper behavior in a shiva home in a future article, please *G*-d.) Your presence is essential, however. And mourners deeply appreciate it.

Regarding the possibility of reviving an in-house weeknight minyan: I like the idea. Over the next few weeks, I will consult with those who have already voiced support for it. Perhaps, together, we can add one more evening to our existing community prayer schedule. It would be a significant accomplishment.
