## What the school is known for

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Ruthin School is one of the oldest schools in the UK, founded in 1284. Today, it is known for academic ambition, excellent university outcomes and a warm, inclusive boarding environment.

Set in the Vale of Clwyd – recently named one of The Times' Best Places to Live in 2025 – our school enjoys a peaceful, semi-rural setting with easy access to Chester, Liverpool and Manchester. The school sits within an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty, offering a safe and inspiring environment in which young people can thrive.

We are ranked in the 2025 Sunday Times Parent Power guide among the UK's top independent schools, with students progressing each year to leading universities including Oxford, Cambridge, Imperial, UCL and other Russell Group destinations. Applications to Medicine, Veterinary Science and Dentistry are actively supported by a team of specialist staff.

Our Sixth Formers typically take four A Levels in small class sizes of 10–16 students. The curriculum is academically rigorous yet personalised, with dedicated UCAS support for early entry subjects and interview

preparation. In the lower years, the curriculum is broad and balanced, designed to build strong foundations in both core subjects and wider disciplines.

Ruthin is proud to be an international community, welcoming students from over 20 countries to live and learn together. We offer full-time pastoral care, including an on-site school nurse, weekly GP clinic and independent counsellor. All students know who to speak to if they need support – whether in the classroom, in boarding, or during co-curricular activities.

Weekly trips, cultural events and outdoor adventures allow students to enjoy the best of North Wales and North West England, and our enrichment programme encourages wider exploration beyond the academic curriculum.
