Guardian Angels Senior Services has been awarded a three-year, \$600,000 Connected Communities grant from the LeadingAge Minnesota Foundation. This exciting opportunity to play a pivotal role in a pilot program designed to create a collaborative, cross-sector system of care that meets the physical, emotional, and social needs of seniors in Sherburne and Wright Counties.

As a leader in senior care, Guardian Angels recognizes the growing challenges older adults face. Social isolation, fragmented care, and the difficulty for many seniors to

remain at home highlight the need for a more cohesive, communityfocused approach to care. The Connected Communities initiative addresses these issues head-on by promoting partnerships across sectors, including healthcare, housing, transportation, and social services. This grant will enable Guardian Angels to collaborate with community partners to ensure that seniors have access to the resources they need to age well, whether in their homes or community settings.

"Our involvement in this grant reflects our commitment to fostering a community where aging adults are

seen, heard, and cared for in every aspect of their lives," shared Pat Hackman, Director of Fund Development. "We are proud to be part of this transformative initiative and look forward to collaborating with our partners to build a healthier, more connected community for seniors in Sherburne and Wright Counties." Harvesting Technology for Residents

Gaming consoles are no longer just for the young. At Guardian Angel By The Lake in Elk River, a new electronic system brings smiles, laughter, and even a bit of friendly competition to the Memory Care Unit. The Lucynt Interactive System is bringing gaming to the senior scene thanks to generous donations from Guardian Angels supporters.

The system includes a ceiling-mounted machine projected onto a table, enabling residents to engage in interactive games and activities. Lucynt describes it as "innovative care that brings fun, physical activity, and mental stimulation to those with cognitive challenges." While it's undoubtedly enjoyable for residents, the system offers more than just entertainment; it's backed by research and proven beneficial for individuals with different stages of memory loss.

Lucynt's technology tracks body movements and gestures, creating "a world of play that's both therapeutic and fun." The system's games are divided into playlists tailored to different stages of dementia. Early-stage games stimulate thought, reasoning, and social interaction, while middle-stage games focus on cognitive play, physical activity, and connection. The games are designed to be soothing and engaging for later stages, offering a multisensory experience. Across all stages, the games use "exergaming", combining exercise and gaming. Lucynt states that this immersive virtual environment



enhances overall well-being, allowing seniors to fully experience the joy and wonder of life.

"We want to boost social engagement and creative expression among our residents," said Lori Herrbolt, Life Enrichment Coordinator. "The system's interactive nature naturally draws the attention of residents, family members, and staff. Everyone seems to enjoy the movement and colors of the games, pictures, and puzzles."

By embracing this technology, we're enhancing the quality of life for our residents and fostering moments of joy, creativity, and connection. With tools like the Lucynt table, we continue to push the boundaries of senior care, ensuring that every resident can experience the comfort, engagement, and happiness they deserve.

New Outdoor Space Brings Everyone Together

Residents of Pine Cone Manor and Pine Tree Manor in Zimmerman are enjoying a beautiful new outdoor gathering space made possible by generous donors and volunteers. A 12x12 gazebo now stands as the centerpiece of this serene area, providing a peaceful spot for relaxation and community interaction.




In collaboration with several local organizations, the Triniti team contributes goodwill when and where we can.
