SECOND PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH HONORS STOJANKA SIMIC FOR 30 YEARS OF DEDICATED SERVICE!



In the early 1990s, while much of the world was celebrating the fall of the Berlin Wall and the end of the Cold War, another conflict was intensifying just a short distance away. Following the death of Yugoslav leader Josip Broz Tito, tensions among the republics of the former Yugoslavia escalated into violent conflict—ultimately leading to the Bosnian War. This period was marked by countless atrocities, the most infamous being the Srebrenica genocide. The war triggered a massive refugee crisis throughout the 1990s..Among those affected were Stojanka Simic, her husband Vinko, and their children—15-year-old Bojana and 9-year-old Bojan—living in Bosnia and Herzegovina. They had built a good

life, with steady jobs and a loving home. But when the war reached their doorstep, it took everything: their jobs, their house, their safety. They, like many others, were forced to flee.

Yet even in the chaos, **God's provision** was at work. By divine grace, the Simics and members of their extended family found their way to a refugee center in Croatia. With the help of Kentucky Refugee Ministries (KRM), they were among 400 refugees placed on a plane bound for the United States. It was no coincidence—Vinko's brother had already found refuge in Lexington through KRM and was determined to help them escape. Doors opened, one after another.



In Kentucky, **God's hand** continued to guide their steps. Second Presbyterian Church, through its sponsorship with KRM and faithful volunteers, became a vessel of welcome. Carson and Lida Evans provided a downstairs apartment as the family's first home in America. Others from the church helped with immigration paperwork, school enrollment, job searches, English classes, and transportation. There was much to do—but God provided the people and the means. "It was so easy, really," one volunteer said. "It felt like God wanted them here." Within a year, Vinko and Stojanka had settled into their new life. With the help of their young son Bojan—now speaking English—they purchased their first home. God had taken them from fear and loss to safety and stability. And Stojanka, with her deep love for children, was soon busy helping in the nursery at Second. She found full-time employment help children at Bellewood, Buckhorn, MASH, and spending over 14 years at Good Shepherd Day School.

Through it all, she became a quiet but powerful presence in the lives of countless children at Second Presbyterian. Week after week, year after year, **God used her hands and heart** to cradle, comfort, and nurture the youngest among us. Today, we pause to honor her journey—a story not just of survival, but of **God's faithful provision** through war, exile, and restoration.

Thank you, Stojanka, for loving our children as your own—and for showing us how God's love moves through the hands of those who serve. *Personnel will honor Stojanka at the Thanksgiving Dinner on November 19th.*

These schemes begin with a call, text, or visit from someone claiming to represent a local electric provider. The goal is always the same: to pressure you into acting quickly. They may demand immediate payment or threaten to shut off, service offer, too good to be true rebates or free equipment

Do not provide your banking information! Some may manipulate caller ID to make it appear to be a utility provider. If it doesn't feel right, or they won't let you verify the source, hang up or close the message. Call your provider using the number on your monthly bill.
