Can you remember spending time with a young child—whether yours or someone else's—and pointing out things they'd never seen before? If so, your heart will probably sing along with a poem by Maggie Smith. In *First Fall*, she writes from the perspective of a parent taking her new child for a walk in the early morning darkness.

I'm your guide here. In the evening-dark morning streets, I point and name. Look, the sycamores, their mottled, paint-by-number bark. Look, the leaves rusting and crisping at the edges. I walk through Schiller Park with you on my chest. Stars smolder well into daylight. Look, the pond, the ducks, the dogs paddling after their prized sticks. Fall is when the only things you know because I've named them begin to end. Soon I'll have another season to offer you: frost soft on the window and a porthole sighed there, ice sleeving the bare gray branches. The first time you see something die, you won't know it might come back. I'm desperate for you to love the world because I brought you here.

I can't fully explain it, but that poem makes me think of you. If I had to guess, I'd say it has to do with that last line. "I'm desperate for you to love the world...."

Not because I brought you here, of course. I'm desperate for you to love the church—by which I mean your faith, your discipleship, the others in the congregation—because it's here that we learn the truest thing about ourselves—that we belong, body and soul, in life and in death, not to ourselves, but to our faithful Savior Jesus Christ.

October holds abundant opportunities for that truth sink deep into our hearts. From World Communion Sunday, when we recognize the fullness, the wideness, of God's welcome. To the Crop Walk by which we join our steps to so many others around the world. To worship and music that stir our souls. From the laughter of Trunk or Treat to the fellowship of the youth chili cookoff. All of it giving us the chance to deepen our love for God and one another.

We'll also begin our focus on generosity in the coming weeks. You will have the chance to consider how the ministry of our congregation makes a difference in the world—and in your life. To discover once more how God's goodness fills the world.

As always, our generosity will begin in the generosity of God. And if we pay attention in these wonderful October days to the gifts God gives through the regular ministry of our life together, our hearts will overflow with gratitude. May it be so for us.







FOR THE HEALTH OF IT

Teach us to number our days that we may gain a heart of wisdom Psalm 90:12



Last week Dementia Friendly Lexington celebrated 5 years in our city. We are a place where people with dementia and their carers are empowered, supported, and included. As a designated site at our church we want to model those qualities too. One of the resources they provide is a

caregiver guide to a successful doctor's visit. Here are some highlights:

- ⇒ If you are going to have to drop your loved one off before parking, or if your loved one wanders, call the office ahead of the visit to let the front desk know and ask for help.
- ⇒ Write a letter with current issues or observations and give it to the person checking you in so the doctor can read it before the visit starts. If you want a private conversation, include that request in the letter.
- ⇒ Doctor's appointments can be lengthy. Pack an emergency bag with supplies if your loved one is incontinent. Bring activities to do while waiting in the waiting room and exam room. Magazines, books with photos, puzzle books may help to keep the person occupied.
- ⇒ Ask for an annual review of all medications.
- ⇒ Be an advocate for your loved one by speaking up for their needs at the doctor's office.

There are many more resources so if you would find it useful, just ask!
