TOY SAFETY TIPS Toys and games are such fun and a great way for families to enjoy time together. Christmas always sends our thinking toward gifts of toys for children.

Safe Kids Fayette County has recommendations to ensure good purchases. In 2021 nearly 122,000 children under the age of 15 were seen in ERs for toy-related injuries, with 60% of that children under 5! Below are a few things to think about:

- Read the instructions and warning labels to be sure it is right for the child's age and development level.
- Don't forget a helmet for all riding toys. Keep them safe while they are having fun.
- Check to be sure there are no small parts or potential choking hazards.
- Store toys away in containers with no holes or hinges that could catch little fingers.

JUSTICE MINISTRY NEWS

Learn to do good; seek justice, rescue the oppressed; defend the orphan, plead for the widow. Isaiah 1:17

267 justice seekers (22 from Second) attended the **Community Problems Assembly (CPA)**, November 13th at Consolidated Baptist. Rev. Gaines' challenging Reflection and Vision Statement reminded us how God responded to the cry of the people in Exodus: 2:23; "the people of Israel groaned because of their slavery and cried out for help." Nehemiah 5:1; "Now there arose a great outcry of the people." God answered the cries by sending Moses to confront Pharaoh. He called Nehemiah to go back to Jerusalem and organize that 'Great Assembly.' God empowered them to transform the world around them. "Let us not forget the scriptural tradition we are re-performing by crying out to God, being empowered by God and acting on God's call to do justice.

We heard poignant stories that illustrated the concerns and struggles of the 3 'new' community problems up for 'The Vote'. With the majority votes cast for **Eldercare**, our sacred work finding solutions begins **Monday**, **December 11**th, **6:30 p.m.**, **at Second Presbyterian**.

Each Justice Ministry Network Member interested in participating in **BUILD's Research to Action Kickoff** is strongly encouraged to attend, notably if you missed the CPA. Many of you shared personal stories/concerns at our House Meetings related to **Eldercare**. *Your voice, your concern, and your input* are crucial initiating the first steps in the research process. Your presence **December 11**th does NOT obligate you to join the Eldercare research team-nor the ongoing MicroTransit and Affordable Housing Teams. <u>2nd Church family and visitors are</u> welcome to join us.
