



t. Patrick Catholic Church is proud to be the oldest parish in Black Hawk County. The parish was organized in 1854, and the first Mass was celebrated in the Mullarky home in January 1855 upon the visit of Rev. Patrick McGinnis.

The following year saw the construction of the first church building on the site of our present worship space. A larger church was built in 1876 and destroyed by fire in 1913.

Today we celebrate the 100th anniversary of our current church building which was erected in 1915 and dedicated in 1916. Many updates have been made to the building over time as well as upgrades to the surrounding parish campus. Grace House Rectory was built in 1980 and the Parish Center, Commons and Dutcher Gym were completed in 2000. The ongoing "Campaign for Growth" has provided the most recent renovations inside the church, completed in the summer of 2012, and the addition of the Narthex which we bless today.

St. Patrick Catholic School dates back to an original building completed in 1891. The current building has areas constructed in 1950, 1953 and 1988, with many upgrades and an office addition completed as part of the "Campaign for Growth" in 2014-2015. This Education Center serves the needs of kindergarten through grade 8 students as well as the Religious Education Program. Preschool students enjoy Clover Patch Preschool, renovated extensively in 2013.

Thanks to the leadership of numerous pastors and the support of our parishioners, the faith family of St. Patrick Church enjoys a rich tradition of worship in the heart of Cedar Falls.
