

## GIFTS

This weekend, we celebrate the Feast of the Epiphany – the visit made to the Christ-child by the Magi. As we know, the Magi came to Jesus bearing three valuable gifts: gold, frankincense, and myrrh.

When the Magi presented the gold to Jesus, they were recognizing Him as King. Gold is valuable and was often used as tribute for kings. Frankincense is a gum distilled from a tree that is found in Persia, India and Arabia, as well as the East Indies. It is very fragrant when burned. It was used in worship and burned as a pleasant offering to God. When the Magi offered frankincense to Jesus, they were recognizing His divinity. Myrrh is an aromatic gum produced from a thorny tree that grows in Arabia and Ethiopia. If frankincense represents sweetness, then myrrh represents bitterness. It was most often used in embalming. Myrrh, then, was brought as a gift to acknowledge the human suffering that Jesus endured of when He came into our world as well as the death that He would, some day, suffer on the cross.

These were valuable gifts. The Magi offering them to Jesus could also be thought of as symbolic of humanity offering its wealth to its King and Lord.

Like the Magi, Jesus wants each of us to offer our wealth to Him, as well. And, I'm not speaking about our material wealth. What Jesus really wants is our "inner wealth" – our gifts and talents – capabilities that we have which, through us, He can put to use to do good in this world.

We are all different, with our own unique personality and distinct set of abilities. Look at some of the saints and other well-known people throughout Church history. St. Philip Neri was a jovial man who attracted followers to Christ. Saints Jerome, Augustine and Thomas Aquinas were brilliant men, deep thinkers who advanced the Church's understanding of God's revelation. St. Nicholas was known for his generosity to the needy. Margaret of Castello was blind and lame but cared for others with a generosity of spirit. Francis Xavier's passion carried him around the world as a missionary. The cloistered St. Therese's childlike

spirit made it possible for her to understand and communicate the Father's love. Teresa of Avila was intelligent, a reformer, and writer. Padre Pio used his listening and intuitive skills as a gifted confessor. St. Thomas More was an example of courage in the face of persecution. So much diversity in personality and capability. And, yet, each with something to offer.

As it was with them, so it is with us. No one has everything, but each of us has something that we can offer in service to Jesus - something that He can use to build up His kingdom on earth.

It's the beginning of a new year. It's a good time to stop and reflect on the gifts that God has given us; a good time to look within ourselves and ask: "Is there something - some part of who I am - some part of my inner wealth - that I could offer in service to the Christ-child? How can I best serve God and His people? What is He calling me to do?"

God has a plan. From the moment we are conceived in our mother's womb, God knows us and offers us a part in His plan. Resolve to discern what God is calling *you* to do. Our gifts are useless unless they are used in the service of His kingdom. Don't let *yours* go to waste. They are much too valuable.

St. Veronica's annual Holy Hour for Life will take place on Wednesday, January 21<sup>st</sup> at 7:00 pm at St. Malachy's Church. This Holy Hour will be held at parishes throughout the Archdiocese in solidarity with those who travel to Washington DC for the annual March for Life. 

**What to do during Eucharistic Adoration**

The primary purpose of Adoration is right there in the name of the act: to adore the One present to us in the Eucharist. Remember that you don't actually have to *do* anything. The greatest gift God gives us is himself, and Adoration is another way for us to recognize that gift outside of receiving the Eucharist at Mass. So, don't overthink it. Just receive the gift.

Here are a few suggestions:

- Small prayer booklets which can be used to help during your meditation will be available. These may be picked up as you enter the chapel.
- Pray in any way that's meaningful to you.
- Pray the rosary. To contemplate the mysteries of Jesus' life in the rosary is to contemplate the mystery of the Eucharist given to us and the Blessed Sacrament we praise in Adoration. So, pairing these prayers is a great habit to get into.
- Read from Holy Scripture.
- Just sit there - receive the gift of Christ in the Eucharist and be at peace in the presence of Our Lord.

**Guidelines for Adoration**

- Adoration is a time for quiet meditation and prayer. Please remain silent while in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament.
- Genuflect when entering or leaving a pew and if crossing in front of the Blessed Sacrament.

We plan to have Adoration on the second Thursday of every month, although, in some cases, it may be on a different day.

Please join us in this most important devotion to Our Lord. Rest for a while in the presence of Jesus. Let him fill you with his peace, grace, and love.
