

"Martha, Martha, you are anxious and worried about many things. There is need of only one thing. Mary has chosen the better part and it will not be taken from her." Luke 10:41-42

The following Mission Statement was created by the Parish Council of St. Veronica Parish.

"As a Roman Catholic faith community, we seek to follow the example of St. Veronica who carried the image of Christ always with her. Through fellowship, service and acts of mercy we walk as disciples in Christ's mission together seeking an ever-deeper relationship with God through prayer, education, sacraments, and the celebration of the Eucharist."

Dear Saint Veronica Parishioners,

The story of Martha and Mary illustrates the importance of hearing the words of the teacher and the concern with women in Luke's Gospel. Mary "sat beside the Lord at his feet." It is remarkable for first-century Palestinian Judaism that a woman would assume the posture of a disciple at the master's feet and it reveals a characteristic attitude of Jesus toward women in this gospel. The story of Jesus in the home of Martha and Mary complements the story of the Good Samaritan that we heard last week in Luke's Gospel. Both stories are unique to Luke. Mary, a woman, is a marginalized person in society, like the Samaritan. Both do what is not expected of them. As a woman, Mary would be expected, like Martha, to prepare hospitality for a guest. Here again Jesus breaks with the social conventions of his time. Just as a Samaritan would not be a model for neighborliness, so a woman would not sit with the men around the feet of a teacher. Both stories show how a disciple is to fulfill the dual command: love of God (Mary) and love of neighbor (the Samaritan). These are the two essentials of life in the kingdom. How do I love God and neighbor in my daily life? It's a good question to ask ourselves. Pray about your answer, and as Jesus says, Go and do likewise.

Once a certain Saint asked God to show her the difference between Heaven and Hell. So God asked an angel to take her first to Hell. There she saw men and women seated around a large table with all kinds of delicious food. But none of them were eating. They were all sad and yawning. The saint asked one of them, "Why are you not eating?" And he showed her his hand. A long fork about 4 feet long was strapped to their hands such that every time they tried to eat they only threw the food on the ground. "What a pity!" said the Saint. Then the angel took her to Heaven. There the saint was surprised to find an almost identical setting as in hell: men and women sitting around a large table with all sorts of delicious food, and with four-foot forks strapped to their arms. But unlike hell the people in heaven were happy and laughing. "What!" said the Saint to one of them, "How come you are happy in this condition?" "You see," said the man in Heaven, "Here we feed one another." Can we say this of our families, our neighborhood, our church, our world?" If we can say that, then we are not far from the Kingdom of Heaven.

The Catholic Appeal is going well here in Burlington. Thank you for your efforts! We still have a way to go, but I am confident we will reach our goals. The funding is essential to the running of the Archdiocese. It also supports us at the local parish level. To date we have raised \$75,400. Our financial goal is \$9,091. Our "Assessment Goal" i.e. the Goal we are required to collect is \$81,216. We need to raise \$6,351 to reach our Assessment. If we do not make our Assessment, the Archdiocese will simply take it out of our savings account. Please be generous. Once we make our Assessment, we will receive a refund. We are very close. Thank you to all who have already given.

Fr. Conroy asked me to say Thank You to all who have sent cards to him at Regina Cleri. He very much appreciates your notes, cards and well-wishes. He is humbled by your generosity in reaching out to him. He is adjusting very well and is developing a new routine that he is becoming more comfortable with each day.

We sincerely thank our parishioners who mail or deliver your weekly envelopes to the Parish Offices while you are out-of-town on vacation. 

SECOND COLLECTION THIS WEEKEND IS FOR TEXAS FLOOD RELIEF

In response to the devastating floods in over twenty counties in Texas where there has been enormous destruction and a great loss of life, Catholic Charities USA is seeking assistance for relief efforts in response The floods have killed 121 people with the expectation that number could increase. This includes the deaths of at least 27 children and camp counselors from Camp Mystic, a girls' summer camp. Currently, people than 160 are still Recognizing the immediate and growing needs, Archbishop Richard G. Henning is asking pastors to voluntarily consider a special collection to support Catholic Charities relief efforts. Parishes may determine other ways to lend support along with prayers and special intentions for overcoming this immense challenge. Pastors are encouraged to hold the collection at their discretion during July and August 2025. Parishioners are asked to address their checks to their local parish, with "Texas Flood Relief" in the memo. The Archdiocese will then send 100% of the donations to Catholic Charities USA. The Archbishop said, "In solidarity with our brothers and sisters suffering from the effects of the Texas flood, we pray for all who have perished and for their grieving loved ones. May the communities and families devastated by the floods find strength and hope in their faith. As we look for ways to assist those who continue to suffer the effects of the disaster, I have encouraged our parishes to consider taking up a collection for the relief work of Catholic Charities USA."

NEW PROCEDURE FOR RECEIVING LOW GLUTEN EUCHARIST

Instead, you are invited to come to the altar during the Lamb of God and are asked to stand on the opposite side of the altar from the Eucharistic Ministers to receive the low gluten eucharist before common distribution begins.




