Dear Saint Veronica Parishioners,

In America we have heard about different social/ economic classes: the upper class, the middle class, the working class, and the lower class. There was a similar class structure in the time of Jesus, but it worked differently. You were born into a class and you would do things for people in the class above you to gain their support. They in turn would assist you. The higher class would say to a lower class person, "You scratch my back and I'll scratch yours - if - it benefits me." In the first part of Jesus' parable today, he seems to go along with it. Jesus said to "Go sit in the lowest place" but with your eye on a higher place. Then he throws the whole notion away. Invite those who cannot repay you. Invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, and the blind and you will be blessed. He turns everything upside-down. People are to be valued for who they are, and not for their usefulness to you, or their class, or position in society. If we could boil down the entire teaching of Jesus in one simple phrase, I think it would be: Love one another. When all is said and done at the last judgement, I think we will be judged by the way we treated other people, no matter what class they belong to. We will be judged by Jesus command to love one another.

Please keep Fr. Tom Stanton in your prayers this week and beyond. He is having a Left Total Knee Replacement this Thursday, September 4. The plan is that he will rehab for about a week at Regina Cleri (same residence where Fr. Conroy now lives) and then return to St. Margaret Rectory to fully recover. His surgeon said he will be out of work for about 6 weeks. Please pray that he has no complications from the surgery and please pray for the surgical team who will be doing the replacement.

New Deacon Intern from Pope Saint John XXIII National Seminary arriving next weekend. His name is Deacon John Ippolito from the Archdiocese of New Born and raised in Staten Island, New York, Deacon John worked in the area of rehabilitation before entering PSJS. He worked as both a Rehabilitation Practitioner and a Director of Rehabilitation with experience treating patients who sustained spinal cord injuries and cerebral vascular accidents. This is what he said when entering the Seminary a few years ago. "I have been thinking about the priesthood since I have been in College, 'politely ignoring' the calling throughout the years but the 'gravitational pull' to this vocation has become much stronger. One important reason that God is calling me to PSJS is that the seminarians are older, more mature, and have had a prior career. I spoke with alumni and current seminarians and they assisted me in understanding that interactions here will be professional, intellectual, spiritual, and mature. I truly believe that this seminary will nurture my vocation." Please join me in welcoming Deacon John next weekend. He will come each weekend for the 2025/2026 academic year. It is expected that he will be Ordained as a Priest next May.

You're invited to join in another parish Jubilee Pilgrimage on Wednesday, September 24 to The National Shrine of The Divine Mercy in Stockbridge, Massachusetts



Situated on 375 acres known as Eden Hill, the Shrine is owned and administered by the Marian Fathers of the Immaculate Conception. The artwork and relics throughout the Shrine express two key elements of the identity and mission of the Marians - The Immaculate Conception and Divine Mercy.

At the Shrine, you can walk the grounds, pray the Stations of the Cross, and visit the Lourdes Grotto, the Shrine of the Holy Innocents, and the many other memorials and shrines. You are also encouraged to experience Jesus' mercy in the daily prayer activities: Confession, Mass, Eucharistic Adoration, the Rosary, and the Chaplet of Divine Mercy.

Our bus will be departing St. Malachy parking lot at 8:00am and will arrive at the Shrine at 10:30. We will spend the entire day on site. Parishioners invited to bring along a sack lunch or purchase lunch on site. Participants will be encouraged to come together for Mass at 2:00pm and The Chaplet of the Divine Mercy and Benediction at 3:00. Bus will depart for home around 4:00pm.

Cost for the trip is \$75 per person. Each participant is asked to contribute \$40 towards this fee with the additional cost covered by the parish, however <u>financial</u> assistance is available for anyone upon request. No one will miss this opportunity due to financial burden.

To reserve your spot please call 781-272-3111 for the trip. Seats will be assigned on a first come, first served basis. The deadline for our parish to respond is Monday, September 8. If there are remaining seats available we will extend the invitation to surrounding parishes.

### EUCHARISTIC ADORATION SEPTEMBER 11<sup>th</sup>

Eucharistic Adoration will take place on Thursday, September 11th in the chapel at St. Malachy's Church from 2:00 pm - 8:00 pm. No advance sign up will be necessary; spend as little or as much time as you want. Please park in the back parking lot and access the chapel by the rear door of the church.

Led by Cantor Chuck Carnell, the Chaplet of Divine Mercy will be sung at 3:00 pm.

#### What to do during Eucharistic Adoration

The primary purpose of Adoration is right there in the name of the act: to adore the One present to us in the Eucharist. Remember that you don't actually have to *do* anything. The greatest gift God gives us is himself, and Adoration is another way for us to recognize that gift outside of receiving the Eucharist at Mass. So, don't overthink it. Just receive the gift.

Here are a few suggestions:

- Small prayer booklets which can be used to help during your meditation will be available. These may be picked up as you enter the chapel.
- Pray in any way that's meaningful to you.
- Pray the rosary. To contemplate the mysteries of Jesus' life in the rosary is to contemplate the mystery of the Eucharist given to us and the Blessed Sacrament we praise in Adoration. So, pairing these prayers is a great habit to get into.
- Read from Holy Scripture.
- Just sit there receive the gift of Christ in the Eucharist and be at peace in the presence of Our Lord.

#### **Guidelines for Adoration**

- Adoration is a time for quiet meditation and prayer. Please remain silent while in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament.
- Genuflect when entering or leaving a pew and if crossing in front of the Blessed Sacrament.

We plan to have Adoration on the second Thursday of every month, although, in some cases, it may be on a different day.

Please join us in this most important devotion to Our Lord. Rest for a while in the presence of Jesus. Let him fill you with his peace, grace, and love.

#### Family of Faith: Grades 1, 3-5

Once a month, children in grades 1, 3-5 will gather for a Family of Faith gathering beginning with the 10am Mass, followed by donuts and a teaching. At these sessions, children will gather in age-level groups for a lesson/activity related to the month's topic. Parents should attend Mass with their children, and will have the option to stay and enjoy a cup of coffee with other parents during the teaching.

#### Confirmation

We will be Confirming students in grades 8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> this year. 8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> graders will have the option of attending a Monday night session or a Wednesday afternoon session.

We are always looking for people to volunteer with our programs in various ways. We need help particularly with Wednesday afternoons (2-3:30) and Monday nights (7-8:15). There are a lot of kids in the school building during these times and we need adults present for crowd control, hall monitoring, as well as adults to teach lessons. If this is something you are interested in at all, please prayerfully consider it and let me know.

A meeting for the Ham & Bean Supper will take place on Tuesday, September 2nd at 7:00pm in the St. Malachy conference room. All are welcome



## **Continuing Religious Education for High School Students**

St. Veronica's is unique among most parishes in that it offers continuing religious education through the 12<sup>th</sup> grade. As you may know, the Archdiocese of Boston is in the process of transitioning the Sacrament of Confirmation from the 10<sup>th</sup> grade to the 8<sup>th</sup> grade. So, starting this year, we are revising our continuing education program to encompass all four high school grades. (Note: The 25/26 school year will include only Sophomore through Senior; Freshman will be added in the 26/27 school year). The purpose of our high School program is to cover issues that require a higher level of maturity than can be discussed with younger students. It seeks to tie together some of the concepts learned in earlier grades, focusing on developing a common sense, practical understanding of what our faith teaches and how it should be applied as we live our lives. It looks at the teachings of our faith in light of current cultural norms, comparing and contrasting them in an effort to help the students make better life's choices than they otherwise might have made.

#### We address such issues as:

- Why is organized religion important; does it really make a difference which religion you belong to; why
- Where does Roman Catholicism fit into the panoply of the world's religions? Why is it correct to understand that our Church is the institution founded by God, Himself, for the salvation of the world? What should that mean for your life?
- Why should we understand and believe in the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist?
- What is morality and where does it come from? How do we make good, moral decisions in our life?
- The Church teaches the primacy of a properly formed conscience. But, what does that really mean?
- Why does God allow suffering? Why do bad things happen to good people?
- What is a human being really in the eyes of God? How does God see us? How should we see ourselves?
- How do we gain our salvation? Many people think the answer to that is just be a good person and live a good life. But, at best, that is an incomplete understanding that's not exactly correct. Worse, that understanding can lead a person to make some poor choices in life which could endanger their salvation.

These are just a few of the issues that we cover in the High School program. There are many more. And, of course, those who attend are free to ask any question or discuss any issue of a religious nature that may concern them.

It is an unfortunate truth that most students in our religious education programs see Confirmation as a sort of graduation. But, that's a mistake. A person who leaves religious education after Confirmation is really being short-changed. There is so much more to learn and understand that can be really helpful in life.

If you are a high school student, we encourage you to continue your education by attending our continuing education program. It doesn't involve a lot of time. Classes are only once a month, meeting on a Sunday evening at 5:00 pm and running for about an hour.

If you are a parent or guardian, please encourage your student to attend our program. For a lot of reasons, raising children in our society is more difficult than it ever has been in previous generations. The teachings of our faith will help all of us, especially your children, to make good, moral decisions and choices in life when you're not around to guide them. The reality is that an 8<sup>th</sup> grade religious education, as good as it may be, does not give your children a strong enough religious background to enable them to deal with the uncertainties of life in the 21<sup>st</sup> century. Your student's attendance at our program will benefit them greatly for only a small investment of their time.

Those who regularly attend our classes will be eligible, as graduating Seniors, to apply for a scholarship to assist in their secondary education after they graduate from high school.
