The Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed

The souls of the just are in the hand of God, and no torment shall touch them. They are in peace.

Wisdom 3:1.3

Dear Saint Veronica Parishioners,

Today, the Church invites us to pause and remember all the faithful departed — those who have gone before us marked with the sign of faith. It's not a day of fear, but of hope. We remember them with love, we pray for them with trust, and we look forward to the day when we will be reunited with them in God's presence. Our prayers today come from a deep truth of our faith: that love does not end with death. The bonds formed in Christ continue beyond the grave. That's why we pray for the souls in purgatory — not because God's mercy is lacking, but because His love continues to purify and perfect every soul so that they may see Him face to face. Our prayers are an act of love that help them on that journey. When we remember the dead — parents, spouses, friends, children — we do so with both sorrow and hope. Sorrow, because we miss them; hope, because we believe Jesus' promise: "Everyone who sees the Son and believes in him may have eternal life, and I shall raise him on the last day." (John 6:40) So today, as we light candles, visit cemeteries, or whisper names in prayer, we place our trust again in the mercy of God. We ask Him to welcome our loved ones into His light, and we ask for the grace to live each day ready for that same encounter — when faith will give way to sight, and love will be all in all. Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May they rest in peace. Amen.

This Sunday November 2, 2025 from 1:30pm to 2:15pm in the Chapel of Saint Malachy Church, Deacon John Ippolito will give a presentation on the Sacrament of Penance. Many Catholics do not understand the reason for this Sacrament and importance that it has for our eternal life. When you leave this presentation, you will:

- 1. Have a basic/better understanding of this Sacrament.
- 2. Know how all Catholics at the age of reason (7 years old) and older foster healthy devotion to the Sacrament.
- 3. Know how the Sacrament of Penance is an aide to the Spiritual life.
- 4. Know why the Lord desires us to receive the Sacrament of Penance.

Please come with Questions! This will be interactive after about 20 minutes. There are no silly questions! If there is something you were wondering about, but you were too nervous to ask, today is the day that you bring your question to the table! This will be a great learning experience for all. Bring your family; Bring a friend. Deacon John Ippolito hopes to see you all there!

For those who may be unaware November 3 is the feast day for St. Malachy. Saint Malachy (1094 – November 2, 1148) was an Irish saint and Archbishop of Armagh, to whom were attributed several miracles. His name in English is Malachy. (Middle Irish: Máel Máedóc Ua Morgair; Modern Irish: Maolmhaodhóg Ó Morgair; Latin: Malachias). In the book Life of Saint Malachy, his biographer Saint Bernard of Clairvaux says Malachy was distinguished by his meekness, humility, obedience, modesty, and true diligence in his studies.

Saint Charles Borromeo praised St Malachy for attending to the needy, bringing the holy sacraments to all alike and renewing the fervor of the people in receiving them. St Malachy's feast is celebrated on 3 November, so as not to clash with All Souls Day, on November 2. Fun fact: There are only a few St. Malachy Churches in the U.S. – Our own Burlington, MA, Brownsburg, Indiana, Kennedy Township, New York City (The Actors' Chapel); Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, Geneseo, Illinois and Rantoul, Illinois. St. Malachy: Pray for us.

Please keep me in prayer as I have arrived at Guest House this week. The last 4 years with 6 major surgeries and daily PT and spinal stenosis in my neck have been very difficult for me. I have been self-medicating with alcohol to help with the pain. I tried to stop on my own and was not successful. This will be a time of healing for me. The usual treatment program at Guest House is around 90-100 days. I thank you for your prayerful support and ask that you support Fr. Tom Stanton as much as possible.

Effective immediately, Wednesday, Thursday and Saturday morning Masses will be Communion Services run by deacons whenever possible. The Archdiocese strongly advised this schedule. As you know there is a dire shortage of priests, therefore there are no additional clergy available to fill in. Fr. Jiwon is only able to celebrate Mass on Sunday as he is working full time at Lahey Clinic. It is also possible that a weekend Mass may be turned into a Communion Service if a priest is not available or becomes ill. Please know of my prayers for all of you during my leave from St. Veronica.

I know that this parish has been unwavering in its support and understanding these last few years of surgical leaves and medical absences. I humbly ask for your continued care during this next step in healing.




EUCHARISTIC ADORATION NOVEMBER 13
