DEDICATION OF THE LATERAN BASILICA THE TEMPLE OF GOD CH YOUARE IS HOLY St. Veronica Parish, a publication of St. Malachy & St. Margaret Churches November 9, 2025

"As a Roman Catholic faith community, we seek to follow the example of St. Veronica who carried the image of Christ always with her. Through fellowship, service and acts of mercy we walk as disciples in Christ's mission together seeking an ever-deeper relationship with God through prayer, education, sacraments, and the celebration of the Eucharist."

Dear St. Veronica Parishioners,

Over the next several weeks this column will be shared by myself and the Deacons of the parish. We will take turns sharing reflections on the readings and their invaluable ministry within our Church.

Today is the Feast of the John Lateran Church in Rome. It is a Universal Feast as we are an "Apostolic" Church and the Holy Father is part of the Apostolic Succession. As Bishop of Rome, this is his Cathedral. He will celebrate Mass there today as he does several times throughout the year. Most people think of The Pope as only being tied to Saint Peter's Church. He lives there and several important events take place there with him presiding... but his official cathedral, if you will, is the Lateran Church.

Given by the Laterani Family construction began under Emperor Constantine in 324. The cathedral has had damage and rebuilds over the centuries, but the current building dates back to 17th century. September 14 is The Feast of Boston's Cathedral of The Holy Cross and a special Mass is held there each year, but its only a feast for Boston. Because of The Basilica of John Lateran connection to the Pope who shares the Apostolic Succession this is a Universal Feast. Saint Paul tells us (Brothers and You are God's building). While we give special recognition to these building of the Church, the true Church is her believers. As someone once said you can't have a Church without believers. Saint Paul also said; "Do you not know that you are the temple of God, and that the Spirit of God dwells in you?" This is tied to the Gospel where Jesus talks about the temple; "Destroy this temple and in three days I will raise it up." He talking of the temple of his body. He wants nothing but honor for God in the Temple, and extends that to us. If we are temples then we are to honor God in our life.

I'd like to share some of the changes that are now being followed during Father Mahoney's absence. Most of the parishes in the Archdiocese have only one priest and these practices are already happening in most of those parishes. Three daily Masses have become Communion Services, (Wednesday, Thursday and Saturday). I am hoping the majority of time they will be led by the Deacons. The Archdiocese reminded me that lay persons as well in many parishes can and do lead Communion Services. A few lay people from our parish have already been trained and have led communion services. On Wednesday and Thursday guest priests will be invited to preside over funerals by funeral homes. I will celebrate the funerals on Monday, Tuesday, Friday and Saturday at 10:00. This is consistent with other

parishes with one priest. As administrator here I will always have either the 4:00 or 4:30 and often times a funeral as well most Saturday's. Canon Law states that a priest may celebrate one Mass a day and two on Sundays. We are not the first diocese in our country to go through a shortage and Bishops will allow a priest to celebrate up to three Masses on a Sunday or Holy Day of obligation if absolutely necessary, definitely not on a regular basis.

A word about Communion Services. People do hear the word of God and receive Holy Communion at these Communion Services. When I received a call from the Archdiocese of Boston regarding this time of being here alone they specifically recommended Communion Services, even for Sunday and Holy Day Masses. I know this is no one's ideal, but it is our reality. Thirty four years ago, the day I was ordained, there were 1,400 priests serving in the parishes. My first assignment had 3 priests. The notion of having multiple churches was not even thought of, nor was the idea of closing churches a thought. There are just under I believe 230 active priests right now serving in our parishes. Today, most parishes are made up of multiple churches. Many of those have combined to a new parish like we have Saint Veronica.

So now you know a little bit about what is happening. I believe one of Father Mahoney's recent Pastors notes discussed the fact that the Parish Council had begun looking at the probability of Saint Veronica becoming a one priest parish. We don't know when that will be, but it may look similar to this new schedule. I believe only 57 parishes right now have 2 priests. The recommendations given by the Archdiocese, come from the majority of parishes are what is called "best practices", trying to preserve resources and personnel as best they can. Let us continue to pray for Father Mahoney and his recovery and pray for our Parish of Saint Veronica.


