Thank you to all the people who have sent cards to me. 60+ cards have already arrived. Your support has given me so much encouragement and I am so grateful to you, more than you will ever know. Please know of my continued prayers and gratitude for you all. Canon Law (church law) states that a Pastor offer a Mass each week for his parish and parishioners. I have always done that in the past. Please know that I am offering multiple Masses each week for all of you while I am here.

I am also humbled to learn from some of your letters how alcohol has been a part of so many of your families' and friends' lives, so I appreciate your honesty, love, concern, and best wishes and prayers. They are an inspiration to me.

God bless and thank you again. Let us pray for each other.

Happy New Year! May God bless St. Veronica's parishioners in the coming year. May it be our best year yet.

Here it comes. The buildup to Christmas. Maybe it's already started for some of us. It seems to start earlier and earlier every year. But first, there is the craziness that mirrors Mary's 70-mile trip south from Nazareth to Bethlehem to meet all of Joseph's extended family. While pregnant. She had the planning, packing, gathering of food for the trip; and camping equipment, since the travel time for a very pregnant woman and her husband would have been anywhere from four to seven days. After a trip that could have rivaled the mayhem of Logan Airport on the day before Thanksgiving, there was the arrival; greeting family and friends.

Then the further stress of discovering that things have gone awry: "What do you mean you don't have a bed for us?!? Can't you see I'm pregnant here?? Followed by the disappointment of being sent outside with the excuse that she should have "privacy" while giving birth. Historians are divided over whether it was a courtyard, a barn, or a cave; one thing it certainly wasn't, was luxurious.

And don't we have the same stress as we prepare to host for Christmas or to visit others? Planning, cooking, decorating (arguing over whether white lights or colored lights this year; do we spend \$200 or \$300 on inflatable yard decorations), struggling to meet our self-imposed timetables. Disappointment that the stores are out of the gift we want to get for our favorite aunt; or, Amazon and Etsy can't get it to us before New Year's Day?

But things will fall into place, or we'll adjust to circumstances. We will calm down. Sometimes not until the day after Christmas, but we'll calm down.

Running parallel to all that activity is the preparation for Christ. The reason for the season (sorry for the cliche). It's also a time to welcome Christ into our hearts. The Church offers us a tool to fight the secularism of the world. It offers us a timeout to reorient ourselves.

Advent. A time to think about Christ's incarnation. That wild, crazy idea that God would become a human. The realization that Jesus isn't a remote being in outer space but a guy like us. It's a time to remember that God offers us hope, peace, joy, and eternal salvation; bliss for eternity.

Each week of Advent has a theme, as it were. Hope, peace, joy, and love. The advent wreath has a corresponding number of four candles to mark each week. Today is focused on the hope that Christ brings.

If hope is the trust in God that reaches into the future, then we can all feel good about the Church's future. I'm helping out as a teacher for the confirmation program led by Camille Mainardi here at St. Veronica for the second year. It's been heartwarming to see how engaged the eighth- and ninth-grade students are as they prepare for the sacrament of confirmation. Sometimes teenagers get a rap for being too cool for things like religion, but our students are fantastic. They are younger confirmation candidates than the Church has seen in many years but they are up to the challenge.

Classes regularly feature videos for the students to watch before they answer a couple of review questions. I'm happy to report that they routinely score 100 on the little quizzes.

They are building their faith, learning why they can trust their faith to lead them toward God.

It's sort of like building an Advent wreath.

First, build a solid base for the wreath, then add foliage from spruce, fir or pine trees. Next, add four candleholders and candles, including a pink candle for Gaudette Sunday. Finally, add decorations such as pinecones, berries, ribbons, or whatever you like.

One candle is lit every Sunday during Advent, representing hope, peace, joy and love. As Advent goes along, the wreath burns brighter and brighter as each candle is lit, just as the faith of our youth burns brighter as they learn more and draw closer to God.

I'm humbled and honored to be a part of the program. Our Church will be in good hands going forward.

May God bless our students' journeys as they build on their faith and walk the path in the Light of Christ. That's fine; it's even good. The world needs the hope and joy that comes with Christmas; with the birth of our Savior.


